The Department is proposing changes to regulations in 12 AAC 12 that will allow for other similar services to be provided under one license. Proposals will make changes to the application process and to reissuing licenses in case of errors and provide new definitions regarding the proposed changes.

Board of Veterinary Examiners

The State Board of Veterinary Examiners are proposed to change regulations in 12 AAC 68 to modify licensing by examination requirements, temporary licensing, technical licensing requirements and the application process for veterinary technician licensing.
