SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER





terms. Adds statements of legislative intent for the Act relating to the use of project labor agreements and to the reopening of contracts entered into under the Act. (CSHB 16(FIN) am)

Effective Date: April 8, 2003

**Chapter 5** **NAMING THE WILLIAM RANSOM WOOD CENTENNIAL BRIDGE**  
Bridge number 1995 over the Chena River in Fairbanks is named the William Ransom Wood Centennial Bridge. (SB 77)

Effective Date: July 7, 2003

**Chapter 6** **JURISDICTION OF OFFICE OF VICTIMS' RIGHTS**  
Expands the definition of "justice agency" to include municipal justice agencies, thereby expanding the jurisdiction of the Office of Victims' Rights. (CSHB 68(JUD))

Effective Date: July 10, 2003

**Chapter 7** **REINSTATEMENT OF NATIVE CORPORATIONS**  
Extends to December 31, 2003, the deadline for the reinstatement of Native village corporations that were involuntarily dissolved under the state's corporation laws and failed to apply for reinstatement during the time allowed. (HB 58)

Effective Date: April 12, 2003

**Chapter 8** **LAND CLASSIFICATION AFFECTING GLACIER CREEK AND WINNER CREEK DRAINAGES**  
Closes certain land totaling approximately 5,740 acres in the Glacier Creek and Winner Creek drainages to new mineral entry until April 2, 2012, unless development of a resort has begun by that time, in which case the area will remain closed to mineral entry. (CSHB 139(RES))

Effective Date: Section 3 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect  
April 17, 2003

**Chapter 9** **MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER PATIENTS**  
Continues in existence the coverage under the state's Medicaid program of persons who have been diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer and are eligible for Medicaid coverage under federal law. Adds provisions that could require these persons to share in the costs of their medical care under the Medicaid program if federal law

allows for cost-sharing measures to be imposed by the state. (SB 78 am H)

Effective Date: April 17, 2003

**Chapter 10 BOARD OF MARINE PILOTS AND MARINE PILOTAGE**

Authorizes the Board of Marine Pilots to establish mandatory drug and alcohol testing for marine pilot trainees and apprentices. Amends the pilotage requirements for certain Canadian vessels in Southeastern Alaska. Extends the termination date of the Board of Marine Pilots until June 30, 2007. (CSSB 20(FIN))

Effective Date: April 18, 2003

**Chapter 11 EXEMPTING FLIGHT CREW MEMBERS OF CERTAIN AIR CARRIERS FROM OVERTIME PAY REQUIREMENTS**

Exempts interstate air carrier pilots, co-pilots, flight engineers, and flight attendants from the overtime requirements of the Alaska Wage and Hour Act. (SB 54)

Effective Date: July 16, 2003

**Chapter 12 OIL DISCHARGE PREVENTION AND CONTINGENCY PLANS**

Changes, from three years to five years, the interval for how often a pipeline, tank vessel, oil barge, or other type of facility must seek re-approval of its oil discharge prevention and contingency plan. Extends the expiration date of most current plans for two years. (CSSB 74(RES) am)

Effective Date: April 30, 2003

**Chapter 13 CRIME OF HARASSMENT**

Expands the crime of harassment to apply to conduct committed by electronic communications in addition to telephone calls. (CSHB 12(JUD) am)

Effective Date: July 30, 2003

**Chapter 14 SEXUALLY EXPLICIT COMMERCIAL ELECTRONIC MAIL**

Prohibits a person from sending certain sexually explicit unsolicited commercial electronic mail from a computer in this state or to an electronic mail address known to be held by a state resident unless the first eight characters of the subject line read "ADV:ADLT." Makes a violation of this prohibition an unlawful act under the state's statutes relating to unfair trade practices. (CSHB 82(L&C))

Effective Date: July 30, 2003

**Chapter 15**    **REHIRED COMMISSIONERS WHO PARTICIPATED IN RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAMS**

Exempts from payment of reemployment indebtedness and the loss of the applicable incentive credit a person who is rehired as a commissioner after participating in a Retirement Incentive Program, and allows that person to elect to continue to receive retirement payments while rehired. (SCS HB 140(STA) am S(efd fld S))

Effective Date:        July 31, 2003; retroactive to May 1, 2003

**Chapter 16**    **CERTIFIED DIRECT-ENTRY MIDWIVES**

Continues the existence of the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives until June 30, 2007. Allows the board to require that an applicant for certification as a direct-entry midwife pass an examination about Alaska laws applicable to the profession. (SCS HB 71(FIN))

Effective Date:        August 3, 2003

**Chapter 17**    **ALASKA MINERALS COMMISSION**

Extends the termination date of the Alaska Minerals Commission to February 1, 2014. (SB 79)

Effective Date:        August 3, 2003

**Chapter 18**    **NAMING THE SVEN HAAKANSON, SR. AIRPORT**

Names the state airport at Old Harbor, the Sven Haakanson, Sr., Airport. (SB 83)

Effective Date:        August 7, 2003

**Chapter 19**    **COSTS AND ATTORNEY FEES IN CIVIL ACTIONS UNDER MONOPOLY AND RESTRAINT OF TRADE STATUTES**

Specifies when defendants may be awarded costs and attorney fees in monopoly and restraint of trade cases. Provides legislative intent. (CSHB 249(JUD) am)

Effective Date:        May 15, 2003

**Chapter 20**    **STATE MEDICAL BOARD**

Continues the existence of the State Medical Board until June 30, 2007. (CSSB 43(FIN))

Effective Date:        August 12, 2003

**Chapter 21**    **TRANSFERS OF STRUCTURED SETTLEMENTS**

Provides that transfers of structured settlements are not effective unless court approval is first obtained and certain conditions are met. (CSHB 64(JUD))

Effective Date:            August 12, 2003

**Chapter 22**    **DEPOSITS TO THE PERMANENT FUND**

Eliminates the provision that 50 percent of the revenue received by the state from certain sources is deposited into the permanent fund, so that only 25 percent of that revenue will be deposited into the fund. Applies to the following sources: bonuses from mineral leases issued after February 15, 1980, and various other payments from mineral leases issued after December 1, 1979. Repeals the change in treatment of deposits if the amount of the permanent fund dividend for a year is reduced by \$20 compared to what the amount would have been if the change in treatment of deposits had not taken effect. (HB 11 am S(efd fld S))

Effective Date:            August 15, 2003; sections 2 and 4 are conditional

**Chapter 23**    **RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS**

Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to lead and coordinate all matters relating to the state's review and authorization of resource development projects. Relocates sections that provide that adjudicatory hearings to review permit decisions under chapters addressing environmental conservation generally and oil and hazardous substance pollution control need not conform to the Administrative Procedure Act. Repeals the statute permitting operators on forest land to apply for permits required from other state agencies to apply to the commissioner of environmental conservation. Repeals sections of AS 46 relating to environmental procedures permit coordination and extension. (SB 142)

Effective Date:            May 22, 2003

**Chapter 24**    **COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM**

Eliminates the Alaska Coastal Policy Council. Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to adopt regulations to implement a new chapter added to administer the coastal management program by Executive Order No. 106 and this measure, and to take actions relating to the coastal management program. Changes responsibility and authority of coastal resource districts from adopting district coastal management programs to adopting district coastal management plans, and requires that those plans meet certain standards and criteria adopted under the existing coastal management program chapter and that they be approved by the Department of Natural Resources. Eliminates district coastal management enforceable policies. Changes coastal management program statutes relating to consistency reviews and determinations, and relating to compliance and enforcement. Changes statutes relating to the coastal

management program in the unorganized borough. Adds a section relating to statutory construction of the existing coastal management program chapter in relation to other state laws and municipal planning and zoning authority. Amends definitions, repeals certain statutes, and annuls certain regulations relating to the coastal management program, and provides transitional directives. **(CSHB 191(FIN) am)**

Effective Date: Section 45 takes effect July 1, 2005; remainder of Act takes effect May 22, 2003

**Chapter 25 SEVERE ACUTE RESPIRATORY SYNDROME (SARS) CONTROL PROGRAM; SPECIAL MEDICAL PAROLE FOR PRISONERS**

Establishes a severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) control program in the Department of Health and Social Services. Changes the requirements for the granting of special medical parole to prisoners who are severely medically or cognitively disabled. **(SCS CSHB 229(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 1 and 2 take effect May 28, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect August 25, 2003

**Chapter 26 RESTITUTION AND COMPENSATION TO A CRIME VICTIM THAT IS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION**

Allows a court to order a person convicted of an offense to make restitution by compensating a victim that is a nonprofit organization for the value of labor or goods provided by volunteers if the labor or goods were necessary to alleviate or mitigate the effects of the person's crime. Allows a court to make an order of restitution part of the person's conditions of probation. **(CSHB 23(JUD))**

Effective Date: August 26, 2003

**Chapter 27 EXAMINATIONS OF FINANCIAL BUSINESSES**

Extends to every 18 months the frequency for the Department of Community and Economic Development to examine certain businesses that make small loans. Repeals the requirement that the department examine and evaluate the Alaska Commercial Fishing and Agriculture Bank each year. **(HB 159)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 28 MEDICAID REQUIREMENTS FOR HEALTH CARE FACILITIES**

Eliminates the Medicaid Rate Advisory Commission and places the responsibility for calculating and setting Medicaid payment rates for health care facilities under the general authority of the Department of Health and Social Services. Explicitly requires that the rates be set so that payments will not exceed the appropriations made by the legislature for the Medicaid program and, within that limit, requires that

the rates be based on reasonable costs related to patient care and the results of audits and inspections. Makes miscellaneous changes in the accounting, budgeting, and reporting requirements for the health care facilities that are part of the Medicaid program. (HCS SB 108(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 29 CORRECTIONAL INDUSTRIES PROGRAM AMENDMENTS**

Provides legislative intent regarding expansion of the correctional industries program. Makes various amendments to the correctional industries program and the correctional industries fund. (HCS SB 115(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 30 STATE SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY FOR CLAIMS FROM STATE EMPLOYEES WHO ARE SEAMEN**

Establishes immunity for the State of Alaska against a civil action resulting from injury, illness, or death of a seaman employed by the state. Provides that the exclusive remedy for an injury or death suffered by a state employee who is a seaman is the payment of benefits available under workers' compensation. (SB 120)

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 31 SUBSIDIES FOR THE CARE OF HARD-TO-PLACE CHILDREN**

Repeals a requirement that the Department of Health and Social Services must annually review the amount of subsidy paid by the state for the care of a hard-to-place child who was in the custody of the department and is either adopted or has become the ward of a court-appointed legal guardian. Allows the person caring for the child to request a review of the subsidy amount. (SB 123 am)

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 32 ALASKA SALMON PRICE REPORT PROGRAM**

Repeals the termination date of the Alaska salmon price report program. (SB 139)

Effective Date: May 29, 2003

**Chapter 33 BOARD OF STORAGE TANK ASSISTANCE**

Continues the existence of the Board of Storage Tank Assistance until June 30, 2007. (HB 187)

Effective Date: May 30, 2003

**Chapter 34**    **DENALI KIDCARE AND OTHER MEDICAID RECIPIENTS**

Reduces the income eligibility limit for the Denali KidCare program and for Medicaid for pregnant women from 200 percent of the federal poverty line to 175 percent of the federal poverty line. Converts the percentage into a specific dollar amount of monthly income, thereby freezing the income limit at a percentage of the 2003 poverty line so that it will not automatically change in future years just because the federal poverty line changes. The applicable income limits for these two groups is frozen at \$2,208 per month for a household of two persons, rising to \$5,647 per month for a household of eight persons. Also freezes the income eligibility limit at a specific dollar amount for people who are in a medical or intermediate care facility who would not be eligible for an optional state supplementary payment if they left the facility. The applicable income limit for this group is frozen at \$1,656 per month. (CSSB 105(HES) am(efd fld))

Effective Date:            August 31, 2003

**Chapter 35**    **CORRECTIVE AMENDMENTS**

Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the Revisor of Statutes. (CSSB 49(STA))

Effective Date:            Sections 13, 24, and 53 are conditional; section 63 takes effect January 1, 2004; remainder of Act takes effect June 3, 2003

**Chapter 36**    **RAILROAD-HIGHWAY GRADE CROSSINGS**

Prohibits employers of commercial motor vehicle drivers from knowingly allowing or requiring the driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle in violation of a federal, state, or local law relating to railroad-highway grade crossings. Provides that operating a commercial motor vehicle in violation of a federal, state, or local law relating to railroad-highway grade crossings is grounds for disqualification from driving a commercial vehicle. Sets periods of disqualification based on whether a driver has been previously convicted of violating a federal, state, or local law relating to railroad-highway grade crossings. (HB 124)

Effective Date:            June 3, 2003

**Chapter 37**    **CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT**

Keeps the state in compliance with federal laws relating to child support enforcement by repealing the delayed sunset date that applied to certain provisions relating to automated data matching with financial institutions and to requirements that social security numbers be included on the applications for occupational and recreational licenses and on certain court documents. Also clarifies that applications for all commercial fishing licenses, including applications made to the Alaska Commercial

Fisheries Entry Commission, must include the applicant's social security number, not just applications for resident commercial fishing licenses. (CSHB 146(HES))

Effective Date: June 3, 2003

**Chapter 38 INCREASING CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION FEES**

Increases certain motor vehicle registration fees for commercial and noncommercial vehicles, including biennial fees, annual fees, and fees relating to titles and lien filings. (HB 170(efd fld S))

Effective Date: August 31, 2003

**Chapter 39 MARINE PILOTS FOR CERTAIN FOREIGN PLEASURE CRAFT; CIVIL FINES**

Authorizes the Board of Marine Pilots to grant exemptions from the mandatory pilotage requirements to pleasure craft of foreign registry of less than 175 feet overall length. Authorizes that board to impose a civil fine on the operator of a foreign pleasure craft for violation of pilotage requirements. (SCS CSHB 251(FIN))

Effective Date: June 6, 2003

**Chapter 40 CIVIL STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR SEX OFFENSES**

Adds unlawful exploitation of a minor to those sex offenses for which there is no civil statute of limitations. Sets a three year statute of limitations for civil actions based on misdemeanor sexual abuse of a minor, misdemeanor sexual assault, incest, or felony indecent exposure. Makes a conforming amendment. Makes the amendments retroactive to October 1, 2001, which was the effective date of a prior amendment to the civil statute of limitations for sex offenses. (CSHB 2(JUD)(title am))

Effective Date: June 6, 2003; retroactive to October 1, 2001

**Chapter 41 CRIME OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY AND FORFEITURES OF PROPERTY USED IN CHILD PORNOGRAPHY, INDECENT VIEWING, AND SEX OFFENSES**

Specifically allows courts to order the forfeiture of property used to aid in the commission of a sex offense, indecent viewing or photography, or child pornography. Amends the definition of "distribution" for purposes of the distribution of child pornography statute. (SCS CSHB 52(STA))

Effective Date: September 3, 2003

**Chapter 42**    **ISSUANCE OF SEARCH WARRANTS**

Makes changes to the requirements for issuance of a search warrant based upon the sworn testimony or affidavit of a person communicated by telephone or facsimile machine. (CSHB 114(JUD)(title am))

Effective Date:            September 3, 2003

**Chapter 43**    **CIVIL LIABILITY RELATING TO ACTS BY MEMBERS OF THE MILITARY, MILITIA, CIVIL DEFENSE, FIRE FIGHTER, OR RESCUE PERSONNEL**

Provides that the state is immune against civil liability for death, personal injury, or property damage caused during a search and rescue activity resulting from the acts or omissions of a person acting as a member of the state militia, for injuries suffered by a member of the state militia, for damages sustained by a civilian defense worker, or for damages resulting from fire suppression activities. Limits the award of certain death benefits and workers' compensation benefits for militia members. Establishes an exception to the immunity for a civil action for damages as a result of certain intentional misconduct. (CSHB 245(JUD) am S)

Effective Date:            September 4, 2003

**Chapter 44**    **NEGOTIATED REGULATION MAKING**

Cancels the scheduled July 1, 2003, repeal of the statutory authority for negotiated regulation making. (HB 34)

Effective Date:            June 7, 2003

**Chapter 45**    **REGULATION OF SHALLOW NATURAL GAS WELLS**

Revises state laws affecting the regulation of shallow natural gas (coal bed methane) wells by the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission. Authorizes waiver by the commissioner of natural resources of local planning authority approval and requirements related to compliance with local ordinances and regulations if an overriding state interest can be demonstrated. Makes the determination that projects for the exploration and development of shallow natural gas are consistent with coastal management program standards under the Alaska Coastal Management Program when conducted under oversight and regulation of the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission and the state's resource agencies. (SCS HB 69(RES))

Effective Date:            June 7, 2003

**Chapter 46**    **AIR QUALITY PERMIT PROGRAM**

Makes many changes in the chapter of the Alaska Statutes that governs the air quality permit program of the Department of Environmental Conservation. Replaces state terms with terms from federal air quality laws and regulations and gives the terms the definitions found in the federal laws and regulations. Removes some types of projects from the category of "major sources" and puts them in a category that may get standardized permits called "minor permits" that may not require a public comment period. Adds exemptions that are allowed by federal law for operating permits. Authorizes the department to charge flat fees for permits instead of hourly fees, effective January 1, 2005. (CSHB 160(FIN))

Effective Date:            Sections 2, 28, 30, 32, and 60(b) take effect January 1, 2005; sections 1 and 34 take effect July 1, 2005; remainder of Act takes effect June 7, 2003

**Chapter 47**    **BUSINESS LICENSE FEES; FEES OF STATE AGENCIES**

Increases the fee for a business license to \$100, but sets the fee at \$50 for a sole proprietorship if the sole proprietor is 65 years of age or older. Removes each of the following from the general requirement that state agency fees may not exceed the estimated actual costs to the state agency of administering the activity or providing the service: fees for the recording of documents under AS 40.17, the recording and filing of documents for safekeeping, and the filing of documents relating to secured transactions under the Uniform Commercial Code.

(CSHB 162(RLS) am(efd fld S))

Effective Date:            September 4, 2003

**Chapter 48**    **GRANTS FOR ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE PROGRAMS**

Increases the required local match for state alcoholism and drug abuse grants from 10 percent to 25 percent. (HCS SB 124(FIN)(efd fld))

Effective Date:            September 4, 2003

**Chapter 49**    **TEACHERS AND TRAINING PROGRAMS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT**

Adds teachers working at the Department of Labor and Workforce Development into the Teacher's Retirement System (TRS) and the exempt service of state employees. Relocates the Kotzebue Technical Center and Alaska Vocational Technical Center to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development. Eliminates the business incentive training program and makes conforming amendments. (CSSB 192(L&C))

Effective Date:            July 1, 2003

**Chapter 50**    **REQUIRED ADVANCEMENT OF CERTAIN PUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN**  
Directs that a school district's education program must require that under school-age students advance through the curriculum or grade level by the next school year.  
(CSHB 154(FIN)(efd fld S))

Effective Date:            September 4, 2003

**Chapter 51**    **PILOT PROGRAM FOR STATE PROCUREMENT AND ELECTRONIC COMMERCE TOOLS**

Authorizes the Department of Administration to enter into a pilot program under which the department contracts with a person from the private sector to provide for the delivery of procurement services and electronic commerce tools. Limits the program to three years and to not more than two state departments and two other instrumentalities of the state. (HB 313 am S)

Effective Date:            July 1, 2003

**Chapter 52**    **REVIEW AND MANAGEMENT OF STATE AGENCY PERFORMANCE**

Authorizes the Office of the Governor to establish and administer a state agency program performance management system that includes the authority to audit the agencies in order to determine the effectiveness of their programs and the efficiency with which the agencies operate. Anticipates that final audit reports may be released by the governor to the public, but provides for confidentiality of the background material on which the audit reports are based, except that the background material remains available to the extent required by laws applicable to the agency from which the background material was obtained. (CSHB 243(STA)(efd fld S))

Effective Date:            September 4, 2003

**Chapter 53**    **SALARY OF THE CHIEF PROCUREMENT OFFICER**

Sets the annual salary of the state's chief procurement officer at range 24. (HB 248)

Effective Date:            June 7, 2003

**Chapter 54**    **STATE FUNDING FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION AND STUDENT TRANSPORTATION**

Increases the base student allocation in the formula for funding public education. Establishes a formula for funding school district student transportation systems. Adds a two-year transition provision for school district student transportation funding. (CSSB 202(FIN))

Effective Date:            July 1, 2003

**Chapter 55**    **PAYMENT OF THE FISHERIES BUSINESS TAX**  
Amends the requirements in regard to the timing of and security for payment of the fisheries business tax. (CSHB 104(FSH))

Effective Date:            September 8, 2003

**Chapter 56**    **FEDERAL TAX OBLIGATION LOAN PROGRAM FOR FISHERMEN AND OTHER COMMERCIAL FISHING LOAN PROGRAM AMENDMENTS**  
Establishes the federal tax obligation loan program under the commercial fishing loan program. Places a limit on the amount of outstanding loans that a commercial fisherman may have from the commercial fishing loan program. Amends other provisions of the commercial fishing loan program. (CSHB 105(FIN))

Effective Date:            September 8, 2003

**Chapter 57**    **ESTABLISHING TAX CREDITS FOR SALMON PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT AND SALMON UTILIZATION**  
Provides temporary tax credits against the fisheries business tax to fish processors to encourage the development of salmon products and the utilization of salmon waste. (SCS CSHB 90(FIN))

Effective Date:            Sections 1, 2, and 4 take effect June 11, 2003; sections 1 and 2 are retroactive to January 1, 2003; sections 3 and 5 are conditional

**Chapter 58**    **STATE ROYALTY NATURAL GAS VALUATION FOR GAS USED TO MANUFACTURE CERTAIN VALUE-ADDED PRODUCTS**  
Rather than requiring payment of a royalty based on valuation tied to the prevailing market price of natural gas, subject to certain conditions, allows the commissioner of natural resources to value the state's royalty share of production under a gas lease at the contract price that the lessee sells the gas to a manufacturer of agricultural chemicals. (SCS CSHB 57(FIN))

Effective Date:            September 9, 2003

**Chapter 59**    **AUTHORIZING OIL ROYALTY RATE REDUCTIONS FOR COOK INLET SUBMERGED LAND PRODUCTION AND ESTABLISHING A CREDIT AGAINST THE OIL AND GAS PROPERTY PRODUCTION (SEVERANCE) TAX FOR CERTAIN EXPLORATION EXPENSES**

Authorizes the reduction of royalty rates due the state on production from certain Cook Inlet submerged land platforms and fields in which production has dropped or does drop. Adds as a new duty of the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission

the obligation to certify the volumes of oil production from these platforms and fields, and prescribes the factors that may and may not apply in calculating the reductions. Establishes a new credit against the properties production (severance) tax applicable to new exploration wells begun on or after July 1, 2004, for work performed on or after July 1, 2003, and before July 1, 2007. Sets the credit at 20 percent of allowable exploration expenses for wells drilled more than three miles away from a preexisting well, and at 40 percent for wells drilled more than 25 miles outside the outer boundary of a unit under a plan of development. Allows sales and transfers of credits and sets the parameters under which the credits may be claimed and applied. (HCS CSSB 185(O&G) am H)

Effective Date: September 9, 2003

**Chapter 60** **REGULATION OF NATURAL GAS PIPELINES UNDER THE PIPELINE ACT**

Allows the Regulatory Commission of Alaska to regulate all gas pipelines in the state as contract carriers by setting standards for firm and interruptible transportation services. (CSSB 151(L&C))

Effective Date: June 12, 2003

**Chapter 61** **STATE INCOME TAX CREDIT FOR GAS EXPLORATION**

Allows a credit against the Alaska Net Income Tax for 10 percent of approved expenses incurred in exploration and development of certain natural gas reserves in a reservoir other than in fields located on the North Slope. Authorizes claim of the credit for expenses incurred until December 31, 2012, and allows carry-forward of the application of unused credit claims for five years or until December 31, 2017. Directs the Department of Revenue to prepare a report during 2008 concerning the effect of the credit. (SCS CSHB 61(RES))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect January 1, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect June 12, 2003

**Chapter 62** **CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPONS**

Provides that persons 21 years of age or older may carry concealed deadly weapons. Requires persons carrying concealed deadly weapons when contacted by a peace officer to notify the peace officer they are carrying the deadly weapon and allow the officer to secure the weapon during the contact. Requires persons carrying concealed deadly weapons to obtain the permission of an adult resident before bringing a concealed deadly weapon into a residence. Makes amendments to the concealed handgun permit system. (CSHB 102(STA))

Effective Date: September 9, 2003

**Chapter 63**    **CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMIT HOLDERS FROM OTHER STATES**  
For persons holding concealed handgun permits from other states in order to carry a concealed handgun in Alaska, removes requirements that the person may not have been found unqualified for an Alaska permit or had an Alaska permit revoked or suspended. Requires the Department of Public Safety to enter into reciprocity agreements with other states so Alaska concealed handgun permittees may carry concealed handguns in other states. (CSSSHB 177(STA))

Effective Date:            September 9, 2003

**Chapter 64**    **ORGANIC AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS**  
Prohibits a person from selling or labeling an agricultural product as "organic" unless it has been certified under federal or state law. Permits the Department of Natural Resources to establish a state organic certification program, to apply for accreditation as a certifying agent under federal law, and to adopt regulations to carry out the chapter governing organic food and agricultural products, including regulations establishing a civil fine. (HB 226)

Effective Date:            Section 8 takes effect June 12, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect September 9, 2003

**Chapter 65**    **CONTINUATION OF PAY AND BENEFITS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES CALLED TO ACTIVE DUTY**  
Authorizes the Governor to provide, by administrative order, for continuation of pay and benefits for state employees called to active duty as members of the auxiliary or reserve component of the armed forces. Sets an applicability condition. Makes the Act retroactive to September 11, 2001. (CSSB 26(STA))

Effective Date:            June 12, 2003; retroactive to September 11, 2001

**Chapter 66**    **STATE MEDICAL CARE PROGRAMS; FRAUD CONTROL**  
Requires the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) to contract annually for independent audits of a sample of health care providers who participate in the Medicaid program, the program for catastrophic illness assistance, and the medical assistance program for chronic and acute medical conditions in order to identify overpayments and violations of criminal statutes. Establishes new crimes relating to medical assistance fraud, related to these three programs, and allows DHSS to exclude a person or a health care provider from participation in the three programs for up to 10 years upon conviction for medical assistance fraud or for misconduct involving a controlled substance. Requires the attorney general to notify DHSS when a complaint or indictment charging a medical assistance provider with misconduct

involving a controlled substance has been filed, and requires DHSS, upon receiving that notice, to review all pending claims or requests for reimbursements for that provider. (CSSSSB 41(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: September 9, 2003

**Chapter 67** **LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND AUDIT COMMITTEE**

Creates the offense of hindering the legislative budget and audit committee, and provides that persons convicted of this offense may not be appointed to state service without the grant of a waiver by the commissioner of administration. Authorizes the committee to delegate its authority to receive and compel the production of information to the legislative fiscal analyst and the legislative auditor. Provides that state employees may not fail to give, or direct others not to give, full cooperation to the committee. Provides that disclosures of interference or failure to cooperate with the committee are protected whistleblower activities. Removes requirements that the committee hold hearings concerning the confirmation of members of the board of trustees of the Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation. (HCS CSSB 45(FIN))

Effective Date: September 9, 2003

**Chapter 68** **COMMEMORATIVE VETERANS' LICENSE PLATE**

Establishes the commemorative Alaska veterans' license plate and fees for issuance of the plate. Requires the commissioner of the Department of Administration to determine the design and color of the plate. (SB 146)

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 69** **ABSENCES BY ARMED FORCES MEMBERS AND PFD ELIGIBILITY**

Permits an individual who is absent from the state while serving on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, and spouses, minor dependents, and disabled dependents of that individual, to also be absent for other reasons for up to 180 days in the qualifying year and retain eligibility for a permanent fund dividend. Makes this change in eligibility requirements retroactive to January 1, 2002 and permits applications for the 2003 dividend to be filed by September 15, 2003, by individuals who qualify for that dividend because of this change in eligibility requirements. (SB 148)

Effective Date: June 12, 2003; section 1 is retroactive to January 1, 2002

**Chapter 70** **COST OF LIVING BENEFITS FOR RETIRED STATE EMPLOYEES**

Provides that retired state employees in PERS and TRS may continue to receive cost

of living benefits for various periods, including receipt of the payment without limitation of duration if the retiree is absent from the state for active military duty. (SB 177)

Effective Date: June 12, 2003; sections 1 and 2 are retroactive to January 1, 2003

**Chapter 71 ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION FINANCING FOR GAS PIPELINE**

Authorizes the Alaska Railroad Corporation to provide financing for the acquisition, construction, improvement, maintenance, equipping, and operation of a natural gas pipeline and related facilities for the transportation of natural gas from the North Slope. Requires the corporation to enter into an agreement that will provide consideration to pay the principal of and interest on bonds, maintain reserves for bond payments, and pay costs to service and secure bonds before issuing bonds to finance pipeline facilities to be owned by an entity other than the corporation. Grants legislative approval for the corporation to issue bonds to finance the construction of a natural gas pipeline and related facilities in the maximum principal amount of \$17,000,000,000. (CSHB 267(FIN))

Effective Date: June 12, 2003

**Chapter 72 ROYALTY ADJUSTMENTS TO ENCOURAGE OTHERWISE UNECONOMIC PRODUCTION OF OIL AND GAS**

Revises the statute that authorizes the commissioner of natural resources to modify the royalty due the state from oil and gas production. Among other amendments, extends royalty modification to encourage production from a field or pool that would not otherwise be economically feasible, simplifies provisions applicable to use of sliding scale royalty share rates, revises provisions applicable to use of contractors to evaluate relevant data, and changes the manner of the handling of information and data with the legislative branch. Makes a series of conforming amendments. (CSSHB 28(FIN))

Effective Date: June 12, 2003

**Chapter 73 LOAN PARTICIPATION PROGRAM OF ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY**

Doubles the maximum loan participation purchased by the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority to \$20,000,000. Permits that amount to be exceeded with legislative approval for a loan participation for a power transmission intertie. Requires the interest rate on certain loan participations purchased by the authority to be determined under regulations adopted by the authority, and to be not less than the cost of funds to the authority. Establishes a minimum interest rate on a loan participation purchased from assets of the authority. Permits the authority to

disregard minimum interest rates for a loan participation purchased to resolve lending limits or reserve restrictions imposed on the financial institution and, instead, retain the rate existing when the authority purchases a portion of the loan. (CSSB 73(FIN))

Effective Date: June 13, 2003

**Chapter 74 ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY PROJECTS**

Permits the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority to issue bonds in an amount greater than \$10,000,000 before July 1, 2007, for a development project only with legislative approval. Except refunding and conduit revenue bonds, permits the authority to issue bonds beginning July 1, 2007, only with prior legislative approval. Extends by three years the termination date of an exemption from municipal property taxes for certain interests created by a nonexclusive use agreement between the authority and a user of an integrated transportation and port facility. (SCS CSHB 112(FIN))

Effective Date: June 13, 2003

**Chapter 75 CALCULATION OF DIVIDENDS PAID TO THE STATE BY THE ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY**

Amends the definitions of "net income" and "unrestricted net income" for purposes of calculating the dividends paid to the state by the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority. Applies the new definitions to calculations for state fiscal year 2004 and thereafter. (HB 203)

Effective Date: June 13, 2003

**Chapter 76 ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION PAYMENTS TO THE STATE**

Requires the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to make a dividend payment to the state before the end of each fiscal year. Establishes a formula for calculating the amount of a dividend. Establishes phased-in dividend amounts for fiscal years 2004 - 2008. (SCS HB 256(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 77 KNIK ARM BRIDGE AND TOLL AUTHORITY**

Provides for the establishment and operation of the Knik Arm Bridge and Toll Authority. (CSSB 213 (FIN)(efd fld))

Effective Date: September 10, 2003

**Chapter 78** **INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS REVENUE BONDS**

Increases to \$524,500,000 the total principal sum of state revenue bonds that may be issued to acquire, equip, construct, and install additions and improvements to international airports. (SB 216)

Effective Date: June 13, 2003

**Chapter 79** **SEAFOOD AND FOOD SAFETY LABORATORY FACILITY**

Authorizes the Department of Administration to enter into a lease-purchase agreement for a seafood and food safety laboratory facility to be constructed under the lease-purchase agreement and to be operated by the Department of Environmental Conservation. Authorizes the state bond committee to provide for the issuance of certificates of participation in the amount of \$14,145,000 for financing the construction. Directs that the investment income earned on the proceeds of the sale of the certificates is to be used to pay the remaining balance of the construction and equipping costs of the facility. (CSSB 215(STA))

Effective Date: June 13, 2003

**Chapter 80** **REGULATION OF COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES**

Requires the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to adopt regulations necessary under federal law to implement requirements relating to commercial motor vehicles or necessary to avoid the loss or withholding of federal highway money, except for regulations relating to commercial motor vehicle driver's licensing. (CSHB 280(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 7(a) takes effect June 13, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 81** **COOK INLET BASIN OIL AND GAS PROJECT APPROVAL; CIVIL LIABILITY FOR MALICIOUS CLAIMS BROUGHT AGAINST STATE PERMITTED PROJECTS**

Imposes civil liability against a person who initiates or maintains a malicious claim for injunctive relief against a state permitted project. Limits judicial review of coastal zone consistency determinations. Grants approval to any oil and gas project located in Cook Inlet Basin that is subject to an authorization or permit process involving the Department of Environmental Conservation, Department of Fish and Game, Department of Natural Resources, or the division of governmental coordination. Limits judicial review for certain Cook Inlet Basin oil and gas projects. (SCS CSSSHB 86(JUD)(efd fld S))

Effective Date: September 10, 2003

**Chapter 82**    **APPROP: CAPITAL, SUPPLEMENTAL, REAPPROPRIATION, AND OTHER APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations and reappropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and an appropriation under art. IX, sec. 17(b), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund. By item veto, the Governor struck several appropriation items and reduced other appropriation items. (HCS CSSB 100(FIN) am H(brf sup maj fld H))

Effective Date:            Sections 4, 5, 37, 39-49, 51(b), 54, 58, 61, and 62 take effect June 13, 2003; sections 10, 14, 15, 18, 19, 21, 22, 24(a), 24(b), 25-30, 31(a), 31(b), 31(d), 32(a), 32(b), 32(d), 32(e), 32(f), 33, 34(b), 34(d), 36, 38, 50, 51(a), 52, 53, 55, 56, 65, and 67 take effect June 30, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 83**    **APPROP: FISCAL YEAR 2004 OPERATING BUDGET**

Appropriates money for the operating, loan program, and other expenses of state government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. After exercise of the item veto by the Governor, appropriates \$5,912,235,660 from the general fund and other funds in addition to unspecified amounts from program receipts, federal receipts, insurance claims settlements, and other sources. (CCS SSHB 75)

Effective Date:            Sections 15(a)(1), 15(c), and 36 take effect June 30, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 84**    **APPROP: INTEGRATED COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM**

After exercise of the item reduction power by the Governor, appropriates \$133,999,500 for operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program. Of the amount appropriated, \$113,272,300 is appropriated from general fund/mental health receipts, Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts, and Mental Health Trust administration receipts. The remaining \$20,727,200 is appropriated from Alaska Housing Finance Corporation dividends and the alcohol and other drug abuse treatment and prevention fund. (CCS SSHB 76)

Effective Date:            July 1, 2003

**Chapter 85**    **LIMITATION ON PUNITIVE DAMAGES FOR VICARIOUS LIABILITY OF AN EMPLOYER**

Imposes limitations on the award of punitive damages in a civil action against an employer based on vicarious liability for the act or omission of an employee. (SCS CSHB 214(JUD))(efd fld S))

Effective Date:            September 11, 2003

**Chapter 86**    **ATTORNEY FEES, COSTS, AND BONDS IN LITIGATION**

Provides that courts may not discriminate in the award of attorney fees and costs for or against a party on the basis of certain identified factors. Provides that courts shall award certain attorney fees and costs to certain claimants who prevail on certain claims or issues related to the establishment, protection, or enforcement of a right under the United States or Alaska Constitutions. Provides a method for a court to abate an award of attorney fees and costs if the awarding of the fees and costs would work a substantial and undue hardship. Provides that a court may not excuse a litigant from posting a bond based upon certain public interest litigant factors. (CSHB 145(FIN))(efd fld S))

Effective Date:            September 11, 2003

**Chapter 87**    **STALKING AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROTECTIVE ORDERS**

Amends the crimes of violating a protective order. Expands the central registry of protective orders to include stalking protective orders. Provides for the issuance of stalking protective orders when the stalking is not a crime involving domestic violence. Amends various rules of court to correspond with the provisions of the Act. (CSHB 1(JUD))

Effective Date:            September 11, 2003

**Chapter 88**    **DNA IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM AND TESTING**

Expands the DNA identification registration system in the Department of Public Safety and the uses of the system. Amends the crime of violating an order to submit to DNA testing. Creates the crime of unlawful use of DNA samples, which makes it illegal for a person to misuse DNA samples collected for inclusion in the system or the data derived from those samples. (SCS CSHB 49(JUD))

Effective Date:            Sections 10 and 13 take effect June 14, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 89**    **REVOCATION OF DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR ACCIDENT CAUSING DEATH**

Provides authority for a court to revoke a person's driver's license if the court finds the person caused an accident while driving and the accident caused the death of another person. Allows the court to grant limited license privileges in certain cases. Prohibits disposition of a traffic offense without a court appearance if the offense involved an accident that resulted in the death of a person. (SB 53)

Effective Date:            September 1, 2003

**Chapter 90**    **CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION AND REPEAT SEXUAL OFFENDERS**

Makes changes to the factors and circumstances that can be considered by the Violent Crimes Compensation Board when considering a compensation award. Increases the presumptive terms of imprisonment for felony sexual offenses when the offender has a prior sexual felony conviction. Provides that prisoners serving sentences for a sexual felony who have at least one prior sexual felony conviction are ineligible for good time deductions. (HCS CSSB 85(JUD))

Effective Date:            September 11, 2003

**Chapter 91**    **COAL LEASES**

Doubles the acreage in coal leases or permits a person may hold, increasing the total permissible acreage to 92,160 acres. (HB 283)

Effective Date:            September 11, 2003

**Chapter 92**    **AUDITS OF OIL AND GAS ROYALTIES, NET PROFITS, AND EXPLORATION INCENTIVE CREDIT COSTS; INCREASING THE UPLAND ACREAGE LIMITATION FOR OIL AND GAS LEASES**

Transfers from the Department of Revenue to the Department of Natural Resources responsibility for conducting audits of royalty and net profits under oil and gas contracts, agreements, or leases and of costs associated with oil and gas exploration licenses and exploration incentive credits. Makes related changes in the audit statutes of the Department of Revenue. Sets out provisions relating to exchanges of information between the two departments, to maintaining the confidentiality of information obtained or exchanged, and transitional provisions. Prescribes penalties for violation of confidentiality conditions. Increases the upland acreage limit for oil and gas leases from 500,000 acres to 750,000 acres, of which no more than 500,000 acres may be located north of the Umiat baseline (North Slope and Beaufort Sea interests). (SCS CSHB 246(RES) am S)

Effective Date:            Section 5 takes effect June 14, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 93**    **REGULATORY COMMISSION OF ALASKA AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS POLICY**

Extends the termination date of the Regulatory Commission of Alaska from 2003 to 2007 and directs the commission to review rules and regulations and hold public hearings concerning telecommunications practices and policies. Provides policies to guide the review by the commission and policies to be implemented into regulation. (CSHB 111(JUD) am)

Effective Date:        June 14, 2003

**Chapter 94**    **LIABILITY OF PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS FOR DAMAGES CAUSED BY A MINOR**

Increases the cap on liability imposed on parents for damages caused by an unemancipated minor. Repeals provisions imposing liability on a legal guardian for damages caused by an unemancipated minor. Adds provisions allowing recovery of civil damages that exceed the cap imposed by law if the parent has applicable insurance coverage. Requires that, if damages are recovered, the unemancipated minor has to provide a written report to the court. (CCS HB 18)

Effective Date:        July 1, 2003

**Chapter 95**    **AGREEMENTS WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT REGARDING MANAGEMENT OF FISH AND GAME**

Prohibits the Department of Fish and Game, Board of Fisheries, or Board of Game from entering into agreements with the federal government regarding management of fish and game and provides for the termination on July 1, 2004, of any existing agreement regarding management of fish and game that cedes any state authority for that management to the federal government. (CSHB 24(JUD))

Effective Date:        September 14, 2003

**Chapter 96**    **PRIMARY ELECTION BALLOTS**

For a primary election, requires the division of elections to print ballot titles and propositions on each political party ballot and a separate ballot containing only the ballot titles and propositions. (CSHB 46(STA))

Effective Date:        September 14, 2003

**Chapter 97** **MOTOR VEHICLE EMISSIONS, INSPECTION DECALS, AND RELATED FINES**

Amends various provisions relating to motor vehicle emissions programs, including registration, emissions certificates, inspection decals, and fines. (CSHB 81(STA))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 98** **PAYMENT OF STATE TREASURY WARRANTS AND CLAIMS**

Changes the deadline for presenting state treasury warrants for payment to six months after their issuance. Requires that money held for an abandoned warrant be delivered to the Department of Revenue as unclaimed property. Directs that a valid approved claim against the state for which the appropriation has lapsed is to be paid from the current year's appropriations if the claim does not exceed the lapsed balance. (CSHB 109(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 99** **REPEALING PROVISIONS RELATING TO COMMUNITY SCHOOLS**

Repeals provisions of law that establish the community schools grant program. (CSHB 165(HES)(efd fld))

Effective Date: September 14, 2003

**Chapter 100** **CHARTER SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAM**

Contingently repeals the charter school grant program under which charter schools were eligible for a one-time grant of \$500 per pupil. (HB 171 am)

Effective Date: Conditional

**Chapter 101** **INDIVIDUAL DEFERRED ANNUITIES**

Establishes minimum nonforfeiture values for individual deferred annuities that are paid-up, have cash surrender amounts, or death benefits. Provides a two-year transition period to allow insurers to comply with the minimum values applicable to individual deferred annuities. (SCS CSSHB 184(L&C) am S)

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 102** **STATE HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN**

Amends provisions relating to the state health insurance plan, including those relating to allowable preexisting condition exclusions, premium rates, eligibility for enrollment, and required notice following application for coverage, and including

provisions specifically applicable to qualified TAA (Trade Adjustment Assistance Reform Act) individuals and family members. (SCS CSHB 195(L&C))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 103 STATUTORY PROVISIONS REGARDING CIGARETTE SALES APPLICABLE TO TOBACCO PRODUCT MANUFACTURERS**

Adds requirements applicable to cigarette manufacturers regarding compliance with the Master Settlement Agreement under AS 45.53. Requires cigarette manufacturers to certify a list of brand families and other information relating to cigarette sales. Requires the commissioner of revenue to create and make available a directory of cigarettes approved for sale and importation. Prohibits sale, possession, and importation of cigarettes not listed in the department's directory. Requires certain cigarette manufacturers to appoint an agent for service of process. Requires all licensed cigarette manufacturers to report certain import and sales information. Adds provisions regarding penalties and administrative review of determinations by the commissioner of revenue. (HB 224)

Effective Date: June 17, 2003

**Chapter 104 ACTIONS BROUGHT UNDER MONOPOLY AND RESTRAINT OF TRADE STATUTES**

In a civil action brought under the state's monopoly and restraint of trade statutes, removes the requirement that the defendant's conduct be wilful in order for a person, including a governmental entity, to receive treble damages. Enacts a new section authorizing the attorney general to bring a civil action on behalf of the state, state agencies, other governmental agencies, and other persons arising out of a violation of the state's monopoly and restraint of trade statutes. Limits an action for indirect injury to actions by the attorney general under the new section. In an action under the new section, requires the court to award treble damages, reasonable attorney fees, and costs. Provides for notice of an action under the new section to be given by publication and allows governmental entities and other persons to elect to exclude their claims from the action. Requires court approval before an action under the new section may be dismissed or compromised. Establishes how the monetary relief in an action under the new section is to be distributed. Allows the attorney general to use statistical sampling or reasonable systems of estimating aggregate damages in an action brought under the new section. (HB 225)

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 105 EXCISE TAX ON VEHICLE RENTALS**

Imposes a 10 percent tax on passenger vehicle rentals of 90 days or less, and a three percent tax on rentals of recreational vehicles for 90 days or less. Requires the

person providing the vehicle to collect the tax and remit to the Department of Revenue. Exempts rentals for official use to government agencies or employees. (CSHB 271(FIN)(efd am))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect June 17, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2004

**Chapter 106 COST CONTAINMENT MEASURES FOR THE MEDICAID PROGRAM**

Authorizes the Department of Health and Social Services to make cost containment decisions related to the Medicaid program during any fiscal year when the department finds that the cost of Medicaid for all persons eligible under the program will exceed the amount allocated in the state budget for the program for that fiscal year. Repeals the priority list in current law that formerly determined the order in which services or persons would be eliminated from the program under budget shortfall conditions. Allows the department to deny program eligibility or the coverage of services authorized by law under the Medicaid program if other cost containment measures are not enough to keep the program within budgetary limits.

(HCS SB 109(RLS)(efd fld))

Effective Date: September 14, 2003

**Chapter 107 TAX REFUNDS FOR GOVERNMENT AGENCY PURCHASES OF FUEL**

Permits a credit card issuer to apply for a refund of any motor fuel tax assessed on a purchase of motor fuel by a government agency if the credit card issuer does not bill the government agency for the tax. (CSSB 112(FIN))

Effective Date: June 17, 2003

**Chapter 108 ALASKA PUBLIC OFFICES COMMISSION**

Authorizes the Alaska Public Offices Commission to issue advisory opinions. Amends campaign financial disclosure and reporting requirements, campaign contribution limits, provisions related to contributions after elections, and provisions related to unused campaign contributions. Provides for expedited consideration of violations of state election campaign laws and modified procedures for determining them. Amends the time period within which to file an administrative complaint of a violation of state election campaign laws. Amends the definitions of "express communication" and "political party" for state election campaigns. Amends the registration fee for lobbyists. Provides for increased use of electronic filing for reports to the commission. Adds a definition of "commission" in the regulation of lobbying laws. Amends the requirements for the reporting of financial interests by

public officials. Adds a definition of "domestic partner" in the legislative ethics code and in the public official financial disclosure requirements. Makes conforming amendments. (HCS CSSB 119(FIN) am H(efd fld))

Effective Date: September 14, 2003

**Chapter 109 IMPORTATION, SALE, DISTRIBUTION, OR MANUFACTURE OF CIGARETTES**

Amends provisions of law relating to importation, sale, distribution, or manufacture of cigarettes. Adds restrictions and penalties for shipping or transporting cigarettes. Amends laws relating to cigarette sales records, cigarette taxes, tobacco product pricing, and the use of cigarette tax stamps. (CSSB 168(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Section 21 takes effect June 17, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2004

**Chapter 110 ALASKA REGIONAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

Continues the existence of the Alaska regional economic assistance program until July 1, 2005. (SCS HB 79(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: June 17, 2003

**Chapter 111 PAYMENT OF PREVAILING WAGES AND REPORTING ON PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS**

Changes the filing schedule of certified payroll by contractors on public construction projects to every two weeks and directs the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to provide for online payroll reporting by July 1, 2004. Requires designation on certain public construction contracts of a primary contractor who must file a notice of work and pay filing fees based on the value of work performed to the department. Directs that final payment on public construction contracts cannot be released until the contracting agency is notified of compliance with AS 36.05 by the department. (CSHB 155(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 4 and 6 take effect June 17, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 112 TRANSPORT AND SALE OF FISH BY AGENT OF COMMERCIAL FISHERMAN**

Authorizes a person who obtains a permit from the commissioner of fish and game to transport and sell commercially taken fish as the agent of the commercial fisherman who caught the fish. Provides that the commissioner may withhold issuance of a fish

transporter permit to an applicant who is delinquent in regard to child support obligations. (SCS CSHB 118(L&C))

Effective Date: June 17, 2003

**Chapter 113 ELECTIONS**

Amends statutes relating to voter identification and identification of individuals registering to vote, specifying new requirements for proof of identity and verification of identity. Changes the schedule for reporting of election official training plans by the director, and requires the director to provide certain additional materials and instructions for each polling place. Requires creation of an access system for a voter voting an absentee or questioned ballot to check whether the ballot was counted and, if the ballot was not, provide an explanation of why it was not counted. Makes applications for absentee ballots submitted by certain uniformed voters and overseas voters valid for the next two regularly scheduled general elections for federal office after the application is submitted. Permits voters in the state who cannot attain reasonable access to a polling place due to distance, terrain, or other natural conditions to vote a special absentee ballot. (CSHB 266(FIN))

Effective Date: June 17, 2003

**Chapter 114 CORRESPONDENCE STUDY PROGRAMS**

Amends the state centralized correspondence study program. Provides authority for school districts to offer correspondence study programs to all students enrolled in the district. Requires the Department of Education and Early Development to supervise correspondence study programs offered by school districts. (CSHB 174(FIN) am)

Effective Date: Section 6 takes effect July 1, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2004

**Chapter 115 REGULATION OF LOBBYING**

Adds and amends definitions in the Regulation of Lobbying Act. Allows a person to be paid for lobbying up to 40 hours in a 30-day period without being required to register as a lobbyist. Allows lobbyists to give, and persons covered by the legislative ethics code to accept, tickets to certain charity events. (HCS CSSB 89(RLS) am H)

Effective Date: September 15, 2003

**Chapter 116 ABSENCES FROM THE STATE AND PERMANENT FUND DIVIDEND ELIGIBILITY**

For purposes of determining eligibility for permanent fund dividends, expands the

categories of terminally ill family members to whom an individual may provide care and, in doing so, may be absent from the state. In addition to a parent, spouse, sibling, child, and stepchild, the measure adds: grandparents, grandchildren, uncles, aunts, nieces, nephews, first cousins, and family members legally related to the individual through marriage or guardianship. (SCS HB 14(STA))

Effective Date: January 1, 2004

**Chapter 117 MUNICIPAL TAXATION OF FUEL AND THE BULK FUEL REVOLVING LOAN FUND**

Prohibits a municipality from levying a property tax on refined fuel unless it has been loaded, unloaded, or stored in the municipality. Prohibits, with certain exceptions, a municipality from levying a sales or use tax on (1) the transfer of refined fuel, unless the transfer is made in connection with a sale or use in the municipality; or (2) wholesale sales or transfers of fuel refined in the municipality. Increases the maximum amount of loans made from the bulk fuel revolving loan fund to one borrower in a fiscal year from \$200,000 to \$300,000. (CSHB 216(FIN))

Effective Date: September 16, 2003

**Chapter 118 CHITINA DIP NET FISHERY**

Eliminates the fee for the Chitina dip net fishing permit. Provides that the Department of Fish and Game shall, in cooperation with other state agencies, prepare a publication showing public access routes to fishing sites on public land for the Chitina dip net fishery. (CSHB 210(RES)(efd fld S))

Effective Date: September 16, 2003

**Chapter 119 CIVIL LIABILITY FOR GUEST PASSENGERS ON PLANES OR BOATS**

Provides that an aircraft or watercraft owner or operator is not liable for civil damages incurred by a nonpaying passenger. Excludes civil actions resulting from gross negligence or reckless or intentional misconduct and civil actions resulting from operating as a common carrier or while demonstrating an aircraft or watercraft to a prospective buyer. Also contains a provision excluding immunity if insurance is applicable or if the owner or operator fails to provide notice when the aircraft or watercraft is uninsured. (CSSB 98(TRA))

Effective Date: Section 3 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2003

**Chapter 120 CIVIL LIABILITY FOR USE OF AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR**

Provides that a person who uses or attempts to use an automated external defibrillator during a medical emergency is not liable for resulting civil damages, and that a person who acquires or provides an automated external defibrillator is not liable for resulting civil damages, with certain exceptions. Provides that immunity does not apply to a manufacturer of an automated external defibrillator. (CSSB 160(HES))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 121 CIVIL LIABILITY FOR INHERENT RISKS IN SPORTS OR RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES**

Provides immunity against civil liability for injuries resulting from an inherent risk of a sports or recreational activity. Provides that immunity does not apply to a civil action based on the negligence of a sports or recreational activity provider or based on a design or manufacturing defect involving sports or recreational equipment or products. (HCS CSSB 175(JUD))

Effective Date: September 16, 2003

**Chapter 122 CIVIL LIABILITY FOR LIVESTOCK ACTIVITIES**

Provides that certain persons involved in livestock activities are not civilly liable for injury or death resulting from a livestock activity. Adds various exceptions to immunity including acts that constitute aggravated negligence, that involve use of faulty or defective equipment, or that fail to make a reasonable and prudent effort to determine a participant's ability to safely participate. (CSSB 176(JUD))

Effective Date: September 16, 2003

**Chapter 123 FOREST RESOURCES AND PRACTICES RIPARIAN STANDARDS**

Establishes riparian standards for forest resources and practices on land within the state. (HCS SB 88(RES))

Effective Date: Section 11(b) takes effect June 19, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect September 1, 2003

**Chapter 124 PREDATOR CONTROL PROGRAMS**

Amends laws regarding hunting of predators on the same day airborne and predator control programs. (HCS CSSB 155(RLS))

Effective Date: June 19, 2003

**Chapter 125 ROADSIDE MEMORIALS**

Authorizes the placement of temporary roadside memorials in the right-of-way of a state highway. Provides for the relocation or removal of a memorial by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. (SCS CSHB 127(STA) am S)

Effective Date: September 16, 2003

**Chapter 126 TEACHERS' AND NURSES' HOUSING**

Permits regional educational attendance areas to construct or otherwise acquire housing for rental to teachers. Establishes in the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation a teachers' and nurses' housing loan program, and repeals the program on July 1, 2008. Permits the corporation to use money in the housing assistance loan fund to make loans to regional educational attendance areas or other borrowers for teacher housing in small communities. (HCS CSSB 25(RLS))

Effective Date: Sections 1-3 take effect June 19, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect September 16, 2003

**Chapter 127 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD; BREWPUBS**

Extends the termination date for the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to June 30, 2007. Transfers the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board from the Department of Revenue to the Department of Public Safety. Allows sale of beer manufactured at a brewpub at certain licensed premises. (SCS CSHB 234(L&C))

Effective Date: July 1, 2003

**Chapter 128 REAL ESTATE LICENSEES**

Allows the Real Estate Commission to take disciplinary action against a real estate licensee who violates the statutory section on licensee relationships, disclosures, and certain other activity. Makes various changes to that section, including adding leases to its coverage. Provides that certain revised relationship disclosures are not required if the licensee obtains a written preauthorized consent to changes in the relationship. Limits a plaintiff's remedy to the recovery of actual damages in a civil action for the failure of a licensee to comply with the provisions of the section. Applies the provisions of this Act retroactively and to actions pending in court where a final judgment has not been rendered before the effective date of the Act. (SCS CSHB 257(L&C))

Effective Date: June 29, 2003

**Chapter 129 SAFETY CODE TASK FORCE**

Establishes a nine-member Safety Code Task Force in the legislative branch to recommend a consistent set of safety codes to be adopted for the state. Also directs the task force to make recommendations on having one state agency responsible for the adoption and administration of all safety codes, and to make recommendations on the methods and authority for local governments to amend and administer safety codes. Requires the task force to submit a written report to the legislature. (CSHB 269(FIN))

Effective Date: June 29, 2003

**Chapter 130 TEACHER STRIKES**

Requires employees of specified types of schools to submit to advisory arbitration before voting to engage in a strike and to provide a minimum of 72 hours notice to management before beginning a strike. (SB 95)

Effective Date: September 26, 2003

**Chapter 131 TIRE FEES**

Levies a fee of \$2.50 on the retail sale of motor vehicle tires designed for use on a highway and a \$5.00 fee on the retail sale of studded tires designed for use on a highway. Requires the seller to collect the fees and remit the fees to the Department of Revenue. Permits the seller to retain five percent of the amount collected, not to exceed \$900 a calendar quarter, to cover expenses associated with collecting and remitting the fees. Exempts tires sold to government agencies for official use and tires sold for resale, provided the purchaser provides the seller with a certificate of use. (HCS CSSB 106(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: September 26, 2003

**Chapter 132 CONTROL OF NUISANCE WILD ANIMALS**

Authorizes the Board of Game to adopt regulations regarding persons licensed to control nuisance wild birds and nuisance wild small mammals for compensation. Provides for the issuance of licenses and permits for commercial and noncommercial control of nuisance wild birds and nuisance wild small mammals. (SB 147)

Effective Date: Sections 2, 3, and 5 take effect July 1, 2004; remainder of Act takes effect June 29, 2003

**Chapter 133 COMPUTATION OF OVERTIME COMPENSATION**

For overtime compensation claims based on employment before June 2, 1999, makes an existing provision of law preventing "pyramiding" of overtime hours applicable

retroactively to July 1, 1990, for all pending actions based on the calculation of overtime. (SB 210)

Effective Date: July 3, 2003

**Chapter 134 REGULATION OF HOME INSPECTORS AND CONTRACTORS**

Modifies an exemption from the contractor registration requirement for work done that costs less than \$10,000. Prohibits a person, with some exceptions, from performing home inspections without a certificate of registration issued by the Department of Community and Economic Development. Places certain duties on, and prohibits certain actions by, licensed home inspectors with respect to, among other things, the content of home inspection contracts and reports and with respect to potential conflicts of interest regarding the property inspected. Restricts legal actions against home inspectors to a one-year period after the home inspection report and disallows contractual provisions that attempt to limit the inspector's liability to the cost of the home inspection report. Authorizes registered home inspectors to perform the home inspections that are required for approval of loans from the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC). Repeals a law that currently does not allow a person to sue for damages caused by negligent inspection of a residential unit under the AHFC program, effective July 1, 2005. Repeals a provision of law that currently allows an AHFC inspection to be performed by a person certified by the International Code Council or the International Association of Electrical Inspectors, effective January 1, 2006. (SCS CSHB 9(FIN))

Effective Date: AS 08.18.011(c) - (f), added by sec. 5; AS 08.18.023, added by sec. 7; AS 08.18.085, added by sec. 17; AS 08.18.151; and the amendment of AS 18.56.300(b), made by sec. 34, take effect July 1, 2004; section 35 takes effect January 1, 2006; sections 41 and 42 take effect July 1, 2005; remainder of Act takes effect July 10, 2003

**Chapter 135 FUNDING FOR TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS**

Provides for the allocation of nonrestricted federal-aid highway apportionments among the trails and recreational access for Alaska program, community transportation program, and other highway programs by the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. Limits municipalities to spending a maximum of 10 percent of federal-aid highway funds for transportation enhancements. (HCS CSSB 71(FIN))

Effective Date: October 1, 2004

**Chapter 136 DEFECTS IN THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, AND REMODELING OF DWELLINGS**

Places limits on when a person may bring a court action for certain design, construction, and remodeling defects. Establishes a procedure, including notice and an opportunity to investigate and repair, for claimants and construction professionals to follow before filing a court action when a claimant alleges a defect in the design, construction, or remodeling by a construction professional. In order to take advantage of a construction professional's new rights under the provisions, requires the construction professional, when entering into a contract for design, construction, or remodeling services, to give the other party a notice that the other party must satisfy certain requirements before being allowed to file a court action for a defect against the construction professional. Exempts personal injury claims from the coverage of the new provisions. (SCS CSHB 151(L&C))

Effective Date: October 8, 2003

**Chapter 137 INPATIENT PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG ADULTS**

Prohibits the Department of Health and Social Services from paying for out-of-state inpatient psychiatric services for persons under the age of 21 who are in the custody of the state or who are receiving benefits under the Medicaid program if appropriate in-state services are available. Requires the department to do a monthly evaluation of the availability of in-state inpatient psychiatric services for this age group and to discontinue payments for out-of-state treatment for particular people of this age if services appropriate to their needs become available in this state. (CSSB 157(HES) am H)

Effective Date: October 8, 2003

**Chapter 138 TRUSTS AND POWERS OF APPOINTMENT**

Allows a trust instrument to provide for the appointment of a trust protector and for the appointment of an advisor to the trustee. States that a trust beneficiary who is a settlor of the trust may be a beneficiary whose interest in the trust may be protected from transfer before payment or delivery of the interest to the beneficiary. Makes changes to the provision that applies the preceding transfer restriction against the claims of creditors, including changes relating to the deadlines for bringing actions for fraudulent transfers. Requires a settlor of a trust that names the settlor as a beneficiary and whose interest is subject to a transfer restriction to sign a sworn affidavit containing certain information about the settlor's authority, intent, and financial situation. Provides that the property that a donee of a power of appointment is authorized to appoint is not subject to claims of the donee's creditors unless certain conditions are met. (CSHB 212(JUD))

Effective Date: October 8, 2003

**Chapter 139 CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS**

Specifies that the examination that must be passed in order to become licensed as a certified public accountant is the Uniform Certified Public Accountant Examination of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Repeals several provisions relating to the frequency of the exam and re-examination options. Has special transitional provisions applicable to people who took the CPA exam after May 1, 1999, and before January 1, 2004. (CSHB 242(L&C))

Effective Date: January 1, 2004

**Chapter 140 LICENSING OF PHARMACISTS**

Provides that the same reasons for which the Board of Pharmacy may discipline a licensee may be used as reasons by the board to deny the application of a person to become licensed. (HB 270)

Effective Date: July 11, 2003

**Chapter 141 TAMPERING WITH PUBLIC RECORDS**

Expands the crime of tampering with public records in the first degree to include violations of the second degree offense when committed with the intent to conceal facts material to an investigation or the provision of services to children or vulnerable adults. (CSSB 8(JUD))

Effective Date: October 8, 2003

**Chapter 142 CLEANUP OF ILLEGAL DRUG SITES, SUCH AS "METH LABS"**

Places restrictions on the use and transferability of property determined by law enforcement officers to be an illegal drug manufacturing site, such as a "meth lab," until the site is shown to be fit for use according to standards and decontamination guidelines issued by the Department of Environmental Conservation. (SCS CSHB 59(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1 and 2 are conditional; sections 3 and 4 take effect July 17, 2003

**Chapter 143 EXCLUDING SERVICE CONTRACTS AS A FORM OF INSURANCE; INSURANCE LICENSING FOR CERTAIN SERVICE CONTRACTS AND WARRANTIES**

Provides that service contracts are not considered insurance for purposes of AS 21 and adds a definition of "service contract." Excludes a person who sells a service

contract for a motor vehicle or a home warranty from being required to obtain a license to sell insurance. (CSHB 120(RLS) am)

Effective Date: July 17, 2003

**Chapter 144 STATE AGENCY CONTRACTS**

Makes changes to the State Procurement Code (AS 36.30). Requires a procurement officer to proceed with a decision if a contractor fails to furnish necessary information requested by the procurement officer. Allows a procurement officer to deny part or all of a claim because necessary information was not furnished. Prohibits a contractor from using information in an appeal that the contractor did not furnish to the procurement officer. Places specific limits on the extensions that a procurement officer may be given to issue a decision on a claim over \$50,000. Requires that the procurement officer's decision include findings of fact and a determination of any amount payable. Provides for arbitration of construction contract claims under certain conditions. Directs arbitrators and hearing officers of construction contract claim appeals to award attorney fees and costs to the prevailing party. Establishes certain procedural requirements for the arbitration or hearing of contract claim appeals, including deadlines for decisions, extensions of the deadlines, one-year disqualifications of arbitrators and hearing officers who fail to meet the decision deadlines, and deadlines for the payment of awards. (CSHB 250(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 17 takes effect July 17, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect October 14, 2003

**Chapter 145 ALASKA UNIFORM PRINCIPAL AND INCOME ACT**

Adopts a modified version of the Uniform Principal and Income Act. Establishes rules for allocating assets, disbursements, and receipts to trusts and estates, between principal and income, and among beneficiaries when administering trusts and decedents' estates. Allows a trustee to make adjustments between principal and income under certain conditions. Allows a trustee to convert a trust into a unitrust under certain conditions. Provides for a trustee to make an election that a trust held exclusively for charitable purposes be covered by certain charitable trust provisions. Provides that the new principal and income chapter does not apply to the trust established under the Alaska Mental Health Enabling Act of 1956. Directs the Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority to adopt regulations to determine the amounts attributable to the principal of the trust, and establishes new criteria for allocation between principal and income of money received from the management of mental health trust land. (HCS SB 87(JUD))

Effective Date: September 1, 2003

**Chapter 146 PROHIBITING RECOVERY OF CIVIL DAMAGES BY A PEACE OFFICER OR FIRE FIGHTER**

Provides that a peace officer or fire fighter injured or killed while in the line of duty cannot recover civil damages for a negligent act or omission if the negligent act or omission created the need for the activity being performed. (CSSB 198(STA))

Effective Date: July 17, 2003

**Chapter 147 ADVERSE POSSESSION AND OTHER ACTIONS AFFECTING REAL PROPERTY TITLE AND POSSESSION**

For real property the ownership of which has been recorded under AS 40.17, eliminates the generally applicable 10-year time limitation and allows an action to be brought at any time to quiet title to, or to eject a person from, that real property. Expands the statutory period concerning conclusive presumption of title to add, in addition to the existing minimum seven-year period for property when claim of possession is based on color of title, a 10-year minimum period when claim of possession is based on a good faith but mistaken belief and the claim involves the property of adjacent real property owners. Adds a 10-year prescription period to vest in public utilities easements for utility purposes. Codifies an express 10-year prescription period to vest in the state and its political subdivisions an appropriate interest in land for transportation or public access purposes, and declares that the provision does not limit or expand the rights in the property that existed immediately before its enactment. Includes an applicability provision. (CSSB 93 (JUD) am H)

Effective Date: July 18, 2003

**Chapter 148 MINIMUM WAGE**

Eliminates the annual inflation adjustment to the minimum wage. (HB 199)

Effective Date: September 30, 2003

**Chapter 149 CHARITABLE GAMING**

Allows municipalities or qualified organizations with charitable gaming permits for contests of skill to exclude \$500,000 in prizes awarded to the contestants from the annual maximum prize limitation. Authorizes the Homer mercury classic as an authorized form of charitable gaming. (SCS HB 232(FIN))

Effective Date: January 1, 2004

**Chapter 150 USE OF CREDIT SCORING FOR INSURANCE PURPOSES**

Regulates the use of credit information in relation to personal insurance. Establishes permissible uses and restrictions on the use of credit history or insurance scoring. Prohibits the use of credit history in determining personal insurance rates unless insurance scoring models are filed with the director of the division of insurance. (HCS CSSB 13(L&C))

Effective Date: AS 21.36.460(g), added by sec. 2, and AS 21.39.035(b), added by sec. 3, take effect August 7, 2003; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2004

**Chapter 151 LICENSING COMMON CARRIERS TO DISPENSE ALCOHOL**

Provides that common carriers may be licensed to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on a vehicle, boat, train, or aircraft. Except for an airline, requires common carriers to obtain a license for each vehicle, boat, or train in which alcoholic beverages are served. Sets different requirements for licenses issued to airlines. Establishes fees for a common carrier dispensary license and allows certain licensees to select a license period. (CSSB 128(FIN) am(efd fld H))

Effective Date: November 4, 2003

**Chapter 152 MARITAL AND FAMILY THERAPISTS**

Adds the Board of Marital and Family Therapy to the list of boards that can request the Department of Community and Economic Development to contract with public agencies or private professional organizations to provide assistance and treatment to persons licensed by the board who have substance abuse problems. Deletes the current requirement that the 1500 hours of clinical experience required to get a license to practice marital and family therapy must have occurred during the three years before the person's license application, and adds clinical experience with individuals to the type of experience that will count toward meeting the 1500-hour requirement. Makes exceptions to the confidentiality protection normally given to communications with a marital and family therapist so that the therapist is allowed to report about a client's threat of serious physical harm to an identified victim and about a client's communications that reveal an act that the therapist has reasonable cause to suspect constitutes unlawful or unethical conduct by another person licensed to provide health services or mental health services. Adds sexual misconduct with a client during or within two years of the client relationship, regardless of the client's consent, to the list of grounds for which the Board of Marital and Family Therapy may impose disciplinary sanctions against a licensee. Allows the board to summarily suspend a license if the licensee refuses to submit to a physical or mental examination when the board has credible evidence sufficient to conclude that the licensee's physical or mental capacity to practice safely is at issue. After exercise of the item veto by the Governor, appropriates \$5,912,235,660 from the general fund and other funds in addition to unspecified amounts from program receipts, federal receipts, insurance claims settlements, and other sources. (CCS SSHB 75)

**Chapter 84**    **APPROP: INTEGRATED COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM**

After exercise of the item reduction power by the Governor, appropriates \$133,999,500 for operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program. Of the amount appropriated, \$113,272,300 is appropriated from general fund/mental health receipts, Mental Health Trust Authority authorized receipts, and Mental Health Trust administration receipts. The remaining \$20,727,200 is appropriated from Alaska Housing Finance Corporation dividends and the alcohol and other drug abuse treatment and prevention fund. (CCS SSHB 76)

**ALASKA SEISMIC HAZARDS SAFETY COMMISSION**

Transfers the Alaska Seismic Hazards Safety Commission from the Office of the Governor to the Department of Natural Resources. (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 105)

**ALASKA COASTAL POLICY COUNCIL**

Transfers the Alaska Coastal Policy Council from the Office of the Governor to the Department of Natural Resources. Transfers the functions of the office of coastal management within the office of management and budget to the Department of Natural Resources. (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 106)

**TRANSFER OF CERTAIN PERMIT FUNCTIONS TO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES**

Transfers certain permit functions of the Department of Fish and Game in regard to anadromous fish streams and fishways to the Department of Natural Resources. Transfers functions relating to forestry and forest practices among officers of the Department of Natural Resources. (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 107)

**REORGANIZATION OF DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES**

Reorganizes the functions of the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) and transfers to DHSS some functions previously performed by other departments. Eliminates the statutorily-created division of alcoholism and drug abuse in DHSS, but leaves the division's duties with DHSS. Transfers to DHSS from the Department of Education and Early Development the duty to license child care facilities and to administer the day care assistance and child care grant programs. Transfers to DHSS from the Department of Administration the following duties: to apply for federal assistance to establish and operate state veterans' home facilities, to operate the Alaska Pioneers' Home system, to license all assisted living facilities, to administer the longevity bonus program, to investigate abuse of vulnerable adults, and to administer grants for adult day care programs and family respite care services for frail older persons and other similarly disabled adults. Also transfers to DHSS the Alaska Commission on Aging, the Pioneers' Homes Advisory Board, and various other functions relating to programs for the elderly. (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 108)

**VIOLENT CRIMES COMPENSATION BOARD**

Transfers the Violent Crimes Compensation Board from the Department of Public Safety to the Department of Administration. (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 109)

**TRANSFER OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD**

Amends provisions of law necessary to transfer the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board from the Department of Revenue to the Department of Public Safety. Requires the Department of Public Safety to provide clerical and administrative services to the board.

(EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 110)

**TRANSFER OF PUBLIC ADVOCACY DUTIES RELATED TO UTILITIES**

Eliminates the public advocacy section of the Regulatory Commission of Alaska and transfers to the Department of Law the duty to represent the public interest, when warranted, in public utility regulation matters. (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 111)
