

SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

Chapter 1 **PROCEDURE FOR EXECUTIVE CLEMENCY**

Restricts the authority of the Governor to grant executive clemency unless the Governor has first provided notice of consideration of executive clemency to the Board of Parole and at least 120 days have elapsed since the Board of Parole has provided notice to the crime victim, the Department of Law, and the Office of Victims' Rights that clemency is being considered. Requires the Board of Parole to investigate and report to the Governor within 120 days. Requires the Board of Parole to provide notice of any action taken by the Governor. Requires the Board of Parole to undertake reasonable efforts to locate the crime victim to provide the required notice and further requires the Board to keep the victim's address confidential. (SCS CSHB 69(JUD))

Effective Date: May 21, 2007

Chapter 2 **ALASKA COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM**

Extends by six months, to September 1, 2007, the period during which a district coastal management program will remain in effect. Extends by six months the deadline for the Department of Natural Resources to complete a review and update of categorically and generally consistent determinations. Extends by six months the annulment date for regulations relating to standards of the Alaska coastal management program and guidelines for district coastal management programs. (CSSB 46(RES))

Effective Date: February 21, 2007

Chapter 3 **PROPER RETIREMENT OF AN OFFICIAL STATE FLAG**

Provides that an official flag of the state that is no longer fit for display because it is damaged may be respectfully burned. (CSHB 21(STA))

Effective Date: June 13, 2007

Chapter 4 **COUNCIL ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT**

Extends the termination date of the Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault to June 30, 2011. (SCS CSHB 120(FIN))

Effective Date: March 16, 2007

Chapter 5 **POSTSECONDARY MEDICAL EDUCATION LOANS**
Requires postsecondary officials to enter into interstate agreements to support at least 20 new medical education program participants each year and amends loan repayment provisions for medical education loan recipients including loan forgiveness for employment in rural and non-rural areas of the state.
(SCS CSHB 18(FIN))

Effective Date: June 26, 2007

Chapter 6 **SUPPLEMENTAL AND OTHER APPROPRIATIONS AND LAPSE DATE AMENDMENTS**
Makes supplemental appropriations and other appropriations and amends the lapse date of certain appropriations. (CSSB 82(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 2(a) is conditional; section 5 takes effect March 16, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect April 3, 2007; section 1 is retroactive to October 1, 2006; section 2 is retroactive to February 1, 2007

Chapter 7 **MOVE OVER LAW**
Requires motor vehicle operators in certain circumstances to vacate the lane closest to a stationary emergency vehicle, fire vehicle, law enforcement vehicle, tow truck, or animal control vehicle stopped along the side of the road or to slow down if the lane cannot be vacated. (HB 102)

Effective Date: July 5, 2007

Chapter 8 **MANDATORY 99-YEAR TERM OF IMPRISONMENT FOR MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE BY A PEACE OFFICER WHO USED THE OFFICER'S AUTHORITY TO FACILITATE THE MURDER**
Requires the imposition of a mandatory 99-year term of imprisonment for a peace officer who is convicted of murder in the first degree when the peace officer used the officer's authority as a peace officer to facilitate the murder. (HCS CSSB 45(JUD))

Effective Date: July 26, 2007

Chapter 9 **BOARD OF MARINE PILOTS**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Marine Pilots to June 30, 2013.
(CSHB 108(L&C))

Effective Date: May 2, 2007

Chapter 10 **FUND TRANSFER TO PUBLIC EDUCATION FUND AND OTHER APPROPRIATIONS**

Transfers funds to the public education fund, makes supplemental and other appropriations, and amends appropriations. (CSSB 61(FIN) am)

Effective Date: May 12, 2007; section 2 is retroactive to July 1, 2006; section 6 is retroactive to October 1, 2006; section 8 is retroactive to December 1, 2006

Chapter 11 **ALASKA RAILROAD: AUTHORIZATION OF LAND EXCHANGES**

Authorizes two land exchanges between the Alaska Railroad Corporation and the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. (HB 168)

Effective Date: May 12, 2007

Chapter 12 **BOARD OF CERTIFIED DIRECT-ENTRY MIDWIVES**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives to June 30, 2015. (HB 35)

Effective Date: May 12, 2007

Chapter 13 **REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN VEHICLES OWNED BY RANCHERS, FARMERS, OR DAIRY WORKERS**

Changes a criterion for the special registration of vehicles owned by ranchers, farmers, and dairy workers by increasing the maximum allowed gross weight of the vehicles to 20,000 pounds. (SB 130)

Effective Date: August 15, 2007

Chapter 14 **MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE PLATES**

Authorizes the issuance of special 50th Anniversary Alaska Statehood commemorative license plates. Authorizes the issuance of special license plates, free of charge, for Medal of Honor recipients and relatives of members of the United States Armed Forces killed in the line of duty. (HCS CSSB 49(TRA) am H)

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect January 1, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect May 29, 2007

Chapter 15 **APPOINTMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS OF THE ADJUTANT GENERAL**
Authorizes the Governor to give preference to a person who has served in the Alaska Army National Guard or the Alaska Air National Guard when appointing the adjutant general. Adds additional eligibility requirements for a person to be appointed as adjutant general. Requires the Governor to prescribe the grade of the adjutant general, which may not exceed that of lieutenant general. (HB 210)

Effective Date: August 26, 2007

Chapter 16 **NOTICE OF SPECIAL SESSIONS**
Requires the Governor to issue a proclamation for a special session at least 30 days before the convening date. Provides exceptions for special sessions called to address situations involving disasters and for special sessions called by proclamations issued while both houses are in session or within one hour after the second house has adjourned. (CSHB 117(JUD))

Effective Date: August 26, 2007

Chapter 17 **PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS**
Prohibits the unlicensed use of the title "professional counselor." Adds professional counselors to the list of health service providers who may not be discriminated against in providing services covered under a group health insurance policy that extends coverage on an expense incurred basis, or under a group service or indemnity type contract issued by a health maintenance organization or a nonprofit corporation. (SB 93)

Effective Date: August 29, 2007

Chapter 18 **SALES OF WINE BY WINERIES**
Permits wineries to sell up to five gallons of wine by shipping the wine to the purchaser. (HB 34)

Effective Date: August 29, 2007

Chapter 19 **CRUISE SHIP DISCLOSURES**
Changes the consumer disclosure requirements for certain promotions and sales that occur on board cruise ships for ports of call in the state. Removes a penalty for violating the disclosure requirements. (CSHB 217(JUD))

Effective Date: June 5, 2007

Chapter 20 **RETIREMENT AND BENEFITS OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES, TEACHERS, AND JUDGES**

Changes eligibility for, and calculation and payment of, insurance and supplemental employee benefits available to persons employed by or retired from the state and its participating political subdivisions. Imposes a 12-month limit on the time within which an employee participating in a defined benefit retirement plan administered by the state may switch to participation in a defined contribution plan. Adds to the state's options for collecting payment of employer contributions to the Teachers' Retirement System, the Public Employees' Retirement System, and the Alaska Retiree Health Care Trust, and changes how those contributions, and related employee contributions, are calculated, paid, and allocated. Limits who may be designated an eligible employee under the Public Employees' Retirement System, and prescribes how an employer may elect or terminate its own participation in that system and what the consequences of the termination may be. Changes the Judicial Retirement System's limitations related to rollovers of certain types of individual retirement accounts and annuities. Adds to the powers of the commissioner of administration and the Alaska Retirement Management Board, particularly in connection with the Alaska Retiree Health Care Trust. Enhances the retirement benefits of participating employees who are also military veterans, and enhances the retirement benefits and supplemental employee benefits of disabled firefighter and peace officer members. Provides that certain appeals related to retirement and benefits are subject to the Administrative Procedure Act. (HCS CSSB 123(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 5, 6, 17, 60, 68, 69, 81, and 116(b) take effect July 1, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 7, 2007

Chapter 21 **MUNICIPAL ROAD SERVICE AREAS**

Provides two exemptions from voter approval requirements for changes to municipal road service areas. Specifies that approval by the voters residing in certain subdivisions or parcels proposed to be added to a road service area and that approval of a boundary change to exclude certain subdivisions or parcels are not required. (CSHB 185(CRA))

Effective Date: September 4, 2007

Chapter 22 **ALASKA GASLINE INDUCEMENT ACT**

Authorizes the commissioner of revenue and the commissioner of natural resources to solicit applications for and award a license for a natural gas pipeline project to transport gas from the North Slope to market. Provides for state reimbursement of up to \$500,000,000 of the licensee's qualified expenditures before the licensee obtains a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the project. Establishes a fund from which reimbursements may be made for the licensee's qualified expenditures. Establishes the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act coordinator in the Office of the

Governor to help expedite the review and action by state agencies on issues relating to the development of the gasline project. Requires an applicant for the license to satisfy 20 requirements before the application for a license may be considered, and establishes criteria for awarding the license based on the net present value to the state of the project and the project's likelihood of success. Offers inducements in the form of tax and royalty provisions to persons that acquire firm transportation capacity during the first binding open season for the project. Provides remedies for disputes between the state and the licensee regarding the viability of the project and the terms of the license. Requires the commissioner of labor and workforce development to develop a job training program to train Alaskans for work on the gas pipeline project. (SCS CSHB 177(FIN))

Effective Date: June 8, 2007

Chapter 23 MOTOR VEHICLE AND LICENSING AMENDMENTS

Provides access to criminal justice records for certain employees of the Department of Administration. Makes changes to various provisions relating to drivers' licenses and other matters relating to driving and motor vehicles. Amends provisions dealing with commercial motor vehicles and commercial motor vehicle drivers' licenses and licensing. (CSHB 126(JUD)(title am))

Effective Date: Section 32 takes effect June 23, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2007

Chapter 24 CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE LEGISLATION

Provides that persons who are restricted from consuming alcohol as a condition of probation, parole, or sentence for certain crimes are restricted from purchasing alcohol and entering certain premises licensed to sell alcohol and requires the cancellation of driver's licenses and identification cards issued to those persons and issuance of a restricted driver's license or identification card. Creates a new crime of violation by sex offender of probation or parole condition. Creates a new crime of failure to report a violent crime committed against an adult. Makes changes to statutes authorizing forfeiture of property used to commit or realized from certain crimes. Makes changes to prostitution laws and sentences and creates a new crime of promoting prostitution in the fourth degree. Removes the statute of limitations for kidnapping and inchoate forms of murder; places restrictions on subsequent bail review hearings. Clarifies the availability of credit for time served in certain circumstances. Expands the maximum period of probation for felony sex offenses. Makes changes to post-conviction relief procedures; restricts the availability of good time in certain situations. Requires the taking of DNA samples from persons arrested for felony and misdemeanor crimes against persons and felonies under the criminal

code and drunk driving laws. Requires the Department of Public Safety to process DNA samples within 90 days of receipt. (SCS CSHB 90(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: Sections 1 - 3 and 26 - 30 take effect January 1, 2008; section 35 takes effect July 1, 2009; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2007

Chapter 25 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Establishes a statewide database of the monthly purchases of alcohol by, and shipments to, persons residing in areas that restrict the sale of alcoholic beverages. Requires a package store licensee, agent, or employee to consult the database before shipping alcohol to persons in those areas. Makes the failure to enter the date and amount of alcoholic beverages shipped to persons in those areas a class B misdemeanor. Prohibits the shipment of alcohol to a purchaser at an address other than the address where the purchaser resides, if the purchaser resides in an area where the sale of alcohol is restricted. Changes the strict prohibition against unlicensed manufacture, sale, possession for sale, barter, or traffic in alcoholic beverages to an offense that requires intent. Creates a new "destination resort" license for the sale of alcoholic beverages. Allows the relocation of certain existing beverage dispensary licenses. Prohibits the purchase of alcohol by a person who lives in an area that has restricted the sale of alcohol from another person who has sent, transported, or brought alcohol into that area, and makes the purchase a class A misdemeanor. Makes aircraft, vehicles, and watercraft used to bring alcohol into areas where the sale of alcohol is restricted subject to forfeiture. After the adoption of a local option ordinance to prohibit or regulate sale of alcohol, extends to 36 months the time period that prohibits an election to remove or make less restrictive that local option. Prohibits the possession of ingredients intended for the manufacture of homebrew in certain areas. Authorizes until 2011 alcoholic beverage delivery site pilot projects in Bethel and Kotzebue, if the local governing bodies of Bethel and Kotzebue request establishment of pilot projects at those sites. (HCS CSSB 128(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 1, 2008; section 21 takes effect June 30, 2011; remainder of Act takes effect June 26, 2007

Chapter 26 POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL BY AN UNDERAGE PERSON IN DWELLING

Makes it illegal for a person who is in possession and control of a dwelling to allow an underage person to possess an alcoholic beverage in the dwelling. (SCS CSHB 118(JUD))

Effective Date: September 23, 2007

Chapter 27 **ELECTRONIC MONITORING OF CRIMINAL STREET GANG OFFENDERS ON PROBATION OR PAROLE**

Requires electronic monitoring of an offender's location and movements while an offender is on probation or parole from a crime when the defendant committed the crime for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in association with a criminal street gang. Repeals these requirements effective December 31, 2012. (CSHB 133(FIN))

Effective Date: September 23, 2007

Chapter 28 **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, capitalizes funds, and makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska. (CCS HB 95(Corrected))

Effective Date: Sections 23 and 33 take effect June 30, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2007; under section 33, certain portions of section 1 are retroactive to June 30, 2007, for certain purposes

Chapter 29 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program. (CCS HB 96)

Effective Date: July 1, 2007

Chapter 30 **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and appropriations to capitalize fund. Ratifies certain expenditures. (HCS CSSB 53(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Sections 1, 10, 13 - 19, 20(a), 20(b), 20(c), 20(d), 20(e), 20(f), 20(g), 20(h), 20(i), 20(j), 20(m), 20(n), 20(o), 20(p), 20(q), 20(r), 20(s), 20(t), 20(u), 21 - 24, 28(b), 31(a), 33 - 46, 47(a), 47(c), 48(a), 49 - 51, 53, 54, 56, 57, 61, and 62 take effect June 30, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2007; section 14(b) is retroactive to June 30, 2006; sections 37(b) and 37(c) are retroactive to July 1, 2006; sections 20(k) and 20(l) are retroactive to December 1, 2006; section 20(n) is retroactive to March 16, 2007; sections 20(h) and 20(i) are retroactive to April 16, 2007; section 14(c) is retroactive to May 1, 2007

Chapter 31 **BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE ALASKA BAR ASSOCIATION**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Governors of the Alaska Bar Association to June 30, 2009. (HB 22 am)

Effective Date: July 3, 2007

Chapter 32 **ALASKA AGRICULTURE DAY**
Designates the first Tuesday in May each year as Alaska Agriculture Day. (HB 132)

Effective Date: October 1, 2007

Chapter 33 **COMPUTER-ASSISTED REMOTE HUNTING**
Prohibits computer-assisted remote hunting and prohibits providing or operating a facility for computer-assisted remote hunting. Makes an exception for use of certain equipment by a person with physical disabilities while the person is meaningfully participating in the act of hunting. (CSHB 220(JUD))

Effective Date: October 1, 2007

Chapter 34 **OPERATIONS OF THE LEGISLATURE**
Requires the Legislature to convene in regular session every year on the third Tuesday in January at 1:00 p.m. Requires that certain reports be available to the Legislature earlier in a regular session. Requires that fiscal notes for measures be delivered within three days. Permits transfers from appropriations between legislative entities. Requires the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee to organize within 10 days after the organization of each Legislature. Shortens the time within which a directory of registered lobbyists must be published, an advance copy of the Governor's budget workbooks must be provided to the legislative finance division, the Governor must request supplemental appropriations and budget amendments, and the Governor must present appointees to the Legislature for confirmation. Requires the Alaska Legislative Council to report to each house on issues relating to the 90-day regular session. (CCS HB 171)

Effective Date: Sections 6 and 18 take effect July 4, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2008; section 6 is retroactive to January 1, 2007

Chapter 35 **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD**
Extends the termination date of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to June 30, 2010. (CSHB 155(FIN))

Effective Date: July 4, 2007

Chapter 36 **REGULATORY COMMISSION OF ALASKA: FINAL ORDER TIMELINE REQUIREMENTS**

Amends the timeline requirements for final orders of the Regulatory Commission of Alaska. Sets timelines for adjudicated docket matters that come before the commission under state or federal law that are not subject to a timeline under federal law or under any state statutes. States the outcome of petitions if a final order of the commission is not issued within the timeline requirements. (SCS CSHB 209(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 1, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect October 1, 2007

Chapter 37 **REGULATORY COMMISSION OF ALASKA: POWERS AND DUTIES, ANNUAL REPORTS, AND TERMINATION DATE**

Amends the powers and duties of the Legislative Audit Division regarding the Regulatory Commission of Alaska by requiring the division to audit the information in the commission's annual reports every two years. Amends the information required to be included in the commission's annual report. Extends the termination date of the commission to June 30, 2011. (CSHB 110(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 1 takes effect January 1, 2009; sections 2 and 3 take effect January 1, 2008; section 4 takes effect July 4, 2007

Chapter 38 **INSURANCE**

Requires insurers to file an annual audited financial report prepared by an independent certified public accountant. Requires an insurer to respond to weaknesses in internal control over financial reporting. Removes an indemnification requirement for a custodian of an insurer's assets. Allows merger of an insurer's securities with other securities held by a clearing corporation, but requires the custodian to keep a record of securities held for an insurer. Allows transfer of an insurer's securities held by a clearing house to be transferred without physical delivery. Requires that a custodial agreement be approved by an insurer's board of directors or a committee approved by the board. Provides that a monthly surplus lines broker report need not be verified. Clarifies that the four definitions of wet marine and transportation insurance are alternative definitions. Prohibits a person from making false or misleading statements or omissions concerning an insurer's annual financial audit, or to improperly influence a certified public accountant performing an insurer's annual financial audit. Allows a health care insurer to apply deductible or copayment requirements to a high deductible health plan. Exempts a tax credit for losses and administrative expenses assessed against the members of the Comprehensive Health Insurance Association, the tax credit for contributions to colleges or universities, and the tax credit for cash contributions to the Alaska Fire Standards Council from a retaliation determination made by the director of the

division of insurance. (CSHB 170(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1 and 3 take effect January 1, 2008, except that AS 21.09.200(i), enacted by section 1, takes effect December 31, 2010, and AS 21.09.200(k), enacted by section 1, takes effect January 1, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 4, 2007

Chapter 39 WORKERS' COMPENSATION FEES FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT

Provides that usual, customary, and reasonable fees for workers' compensation treatment and services provided before August 1, 2007 may not exceed the fee schedule specified by the board in its December 1, 2004 bulletin. Provides that the usual, customary and reasonable fees for workers' compensation treatment and services provided between August 1, 2007 and March 31, 2009 may not exceed the fee schedule specified by the board in its December 1, 2004 bulletin, adjusted by the percentage change, from 2004 to 2006, in the medical care component of the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers. (CSHB 228(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 4, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 31, 2007

Chapter 40 CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMISSION ON FEDERAL MANAGEMENT AREAS

Reestablishes the Citizens' Advisory Commission on Federal Management Areas. Provides for the qualifications and terms of commission members and the composition and duties of the commission. Allows the commission to establish advisory groups and to request the state attorney general file suit against a federal official or agency if the commission determines that the official or agency is violating a Congressional Act, congressional intent, or the best interest of the state. Requires all state entities to cooperate with the commission. Repeals the commission effective June 30, 2014. (CSHB 87(FIN) am)

Effective Date: July 4, 2007

Chapter 41 RECORDS OF SPORT FISHING GUIDES

Allows the Department of Fish and Game and the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission to release records required of sport fishing guides to certain federal agencies. (CSHB 186(FSH))

Effective Date: July 4, 2007

Chapter 42 **DEBT FOR SMALL BOAT HARBORS**

Extends the date by which a municipality may incur debt for a small boat harbor from before July 1, 2007, to before July 1, 2012, for purposes of qualifying for state reimbursement for the debt. (CSSB 105(TRA))

Effective Date: July 4, 2007

Chapter 43 **TASK FORCE TO REVIEW COUNCIL ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT**

Creates a task force to review the Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault. Provides that the task force shall consider and develop recommendations that address the council's mission; compliance with grant management requirements; location in the state administrative structure; member appointment process; statutory responsibilities; and relationship and consultation with other state agencies. Requires the task force to examine "Preventing Intimate Partner Violence, Sexual Violence and Child Maltreatment" for best practices, and make recommendations about these practices. Provides that the task force submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature by March 1, 2008. (SCS CSHB 215(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: October 1, 2007

Chapter 44 **AGGRAVATING FACTOR FOR CRIMES COMMITTED AT OR AFFECTING PERSONS AT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT SHELTERS**

Adds as an aggravating factor at sentencing that the defendant committed the offense, or affected persons or property, on the premises of a recognized shelter or facility providing services to victims of domestic violence or sexual assault. (CSHB 213(JUD))

Effective Date: October 1, 2007

Chapter 45 **ALASKA DECORATION OF HONOR**

Creates an Alaska Decoration of Honor that may be awarded to individuals who meet certain criteria who are killed in action. Provides the method for determining who receives the Alaska Decoration of Honor, requires the Joint Armed Services Committee to make arrangements for the design and award of the decoration, and requires the adjutant general to obtain each year from the United States government a list of individuals eligible for the honor. (CSHB 244(FIN) am)

Effective Date: October 1, 2007

Chapter 46 **MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND LICENSE PLATES;
ANATOMICAL GIFTS**

Authorizes the appropriation of money in the anatomical gift awareness fund to organizations promoting anatomical gift donation programs. Authorizes disabled persons and disabled veterans to receive license plates other than plates displaying the international symbol of accessibility. Authorizes the issuance of special request plates commemorating and supporting troops. Authorizes an exemption from the registration fee for disabled persons. (SCS CSHB 184(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 2 - 5 take effect July 4, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect October 1, 2007

Chapter 47 **ETHICS: LEGISLATIVE AND EXECUTIVE BRANCHES**

Expands bribery offenses to cover campaign contributions, makes criminal the failure of any public servant to report a witnessed bribe, and prohibits a public servant from receiving a state pension if convicted of a certain type of felony. Narrows a general exception to the requirement that all candidates for public office file Alaska Public Offices Commission reports and requires that a candidate for public office must, unless exempted from doing so, file commission reports electronically. Requires the commission to administer, and registered lobbyists to complete, an annual course on lobbying ethics. Prohibits certain types of felons from registering as lobbyists, prohibits lobbyists from providing non-exempt gifts to legislators and legislative staff at any time of year, and requires registered lobbyists to report to the commission a gift to a legislator or legislative employee of food and beverage unless the gift is worth less than \$15. Allows a legislator or legislative employee to use a state telephone or fax machine for the legislator's or employee's own benefit or the benefit of another only if the use is minimal and occasional. Establishes a 60-day pre-election period during which a legislator or legislative employee may not cause publication of a political mass mailing. Codifies a finding by the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics that no period during a person's legislative service is exempt from ethics disclosure requirements. Modifies procedures for publication of information from legislative ethics disclosures and ethics complaints, and modifies procedures related to meetings, complaint hearings, and other activities of the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics. Establishes new prohibitions and exemptions for gifts that a legislator and legislative employee, and the immediate family members of both, may accept. Establishes new legislative ethics disclosure requirements and deadlines, including a general deadline of 30 days. Prohibits a serving legislator from directly or indirectly being compensated by a source other than the state for an act that is legislative, administrative or political. Adds to what a legislator must disclose in financial reports to the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Changes deadlines and other ethics disclosure requirements, including financial disclosure requirements, for public officials and public officers in the executive branch. Changes the requirements applicable to a blind trust in order to be used by a public official as an ethical means of eliminating a conflict of interest. Adds to the duties of the Alaska Public Offices Commission, and modifies commission procedures, in

connection with financial disclosures by public officials. Changes the exemptions and prohibitions of the Executive Branch Ethics Act by, among other things, limiting the use of state aircraft, adding to the list of persons prohibited from lobbying for one year after leaving public office, adding to the list of persons prohibited from serving on a governing board for one year after leaving public office, and establishing a rebuttable presumption that any gift from a lobbyist to a public officer is intended to influence official action. Establishes disclosure requirements relating to executive clemency petitions, and relaxes nepotism restrictions to allow family members to work together as public employees in certain situations.
(SCS CSHB 109(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: Sections 8, 45, and 60 take effect January 1, 2009; remainder of Act takes effect July 10, 2007

Chapter 48 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR CHILDREN AND PREGNANT WOMEN

Increases income eligibility limits for children and pregnant women to receive medical assistance and eliminates fixed dollar amounts for eligibility and co-pay requirements. **(HCS CSSB 27(FIN))**

Effective Date: July 10, 2007

Chapter 49 STATE MEDICAL BOARD

Extends the termination date for the State Medical Board to June 30, 2013. **(SB 85)**

Effective Date: July 10, 2007

Chapter 50 MORTGAGE LENDING

Requires that mortgage lenders, mortgage brokers, and originators be licensed. Exempts qualifying persons from this requirement and specifies who may qualify for the exemption and how it may be obtained. Requires small mortgage lenders and originators to be registered. Requires licensed mortgage lenders and mortgage brokers to be bonded. Regulates business locations, business transfers, business records, business personnel, business ownership, and business practices, including loan refinancing. Establishes criminal and civil penalties for violations. Establishes the originator surety fund to pay claims for losses caused by originators. Provides for the collection of a program administration fee when a mortgage loan document is recorded. Makes a violation of certain parts of the Mortgage Lending Regulation Act an unfair trade practice under the state's principal consumer protection act. **(SCS CSHB 162(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 11 takes effect July 13, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 51 **REAL ESTATE BROKERS AND SALESPEOPLE**

Provides that the Real Estate Commission may not issue a license to a broker, associate broker, or real estate salesperson who is under indictment for, or as to whom seven years have not yet elapsed since the person has completed a sentence for, a crime that in the judgment of the commission affects the ability of that person to practice as a broker, associate broker, or real estate salesperson. Provides that the commission shall revoke a license to a broker or associate broker who is convicted of a crime that in the judgment of the commission affects the ability of that person to practice as a broker or associate broker. Requires additional hours of education within one year of licensure for all real estate licensees and as a licensure requirement for real estate salespeople. Allows real estate brokers to own, operate, or be employed by multiple business organizations for which a license from the commission is required if each business organization is registered with the commission and all principal offices of those business organizations share the same physical address. Requires real estate brokers to adopt and make available certain written policies and procedures. (CSHB 205 (FIN))

Effective Date: February 1, 2008

Chapter 52 **LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANIES**

Clarifies that a limited liability company may be organized to render professional services. Allows a limited liability company to use the company's articles of organization to vary certain statutory consent requirements for authorizing company affairs. Removes a restriction on the level of consent that may be established by a company's operating agreement. (SB 141)

Effective Date: October 10, 2007

Chapter 53 **KODIAK NARROW CAPE PUBLIC USE AREA**

Creates the Kodiak Narrow Cape Public Use Area and provides for the management of the area by the commissioner of natural resources. Identifies grazing and missile launch activity as allowable uses within the public use area. Authorizes the commissioner to allow additional uses within the public use area that are consistent with maintaining, enhancing, and perpetuating the present uses of the area. (CSSB 111(RES))

Effective Date: October 10, 2007

Chapter 54 **ALASKA OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Amends the authority of the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to gather information about and regulate oil and gas wells, drilling, and production. Describes information received by the commission that is to be held confidential. Provides for

reconsideration of commission action and an appeal to the superior court following the commission's disposition of the reconsideration. Authorizes the allocation of costs among the parties involved for the costs of any time devoted to an investigation or hearing by commission staff. Describes the requirements for applying for and receiving a permit to drill an oil or gas well. Provides penalties for violations of laws, permits, orders, and stipulations within the jurisdiction of the commission. (CSSB 109(RES))

Effective Date: July 13, 2007

Chapter 55 UNIFORM MONEY SERVICES ACT

Adopts the Uniform Money Services Act. Requires that persons who engage in certain money services businesses be licensed. Covers currency exchange and money transmission transactions. Exempts qualifying persons from the licensing requirement. Requires money transmission licensees to be bonded or to maintain other security. Regulates business net worth, control, records, confidentiality, investments, and practices affecting consumers, including requiring the display of information for contacting the state with complaints. For money transmission transactions, requires receipts and sets time limits for transmitting the money and making refunds. Regulates, without licensing, the persons whom licensees designate to provide services on their behalf. Establishes civil and criminal penalties for violations. (HCS CSSB 116(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 17, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 56 SMALL COMMERCIAL PASSENGER VESSELS

Eliminates a distinction between large and small commercial passenger vessels in the provisions prohibiting discharge of treated sewage, graywater, or other wastewater from those vessels. Re-establishes provisions of ch. 153, SLA 2004, eliminated by 2006 Primary Election Ballot No. 2 (the August 2006 cruise ship initiative), authorizing the Department of Environmental Conservation to approve plans for alternative terms and conditions for discharges from small commercial passenger vessels constructed before 2004, including provisions requiring gathering and maintenance of operational records that relate to those discharges. Requires those approved plans to incorporate best management practices for protecting the environment. Authorizes the department to approve an alternative plan for a three-year period, but a plan may not be approved for a period extending beyond 2015. (CSSB 121(L&C))

Effective Date: Sections 2, 5, and 7 take effect January 1, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect July 17, 2007; sections 1, 3, 4, 6, and 8 are retroactive to December 17, 2006

Chapter 57 **JUDICIAL RETENTION ELECTION CANDIDATES**
Establishes how a judicial retention election candidate may withdraw and how the candidate's name may be removed from the general election ballot. (SB 171)

Effective Date: July 18, 2007

Chapter 58 **COLLEGE SAVINGS FOR FOSTER AND OTHER CHILDREN**
Establishes a higher education savings program at the University of Alaska for children who have been in state custody for not less than two years and authorizes certain disclosures of confidential records needed for the program. (CSSB 76(HES))

Effective Date: October 15, 2007

Chapter 59 **ALCOHOL AND DRUG TREATMENT**
Makes findings concerning and amends powers and duties of the Department of Health and Social Services to establish additional standards and priorities for drug and alcohol treatment programs, emphasizing treatment for co-occurring substance abuse and mental health disorders. (HCS CSSB 100(HES))

Effective Date: October 15, 2007

Chapter 60 **LINNY PACILLO PARKING GARAGE**
Names the state parking garage being constructed in Anchorage north of the Robert B. Atwood Building the Linny Pacillo Parking Garage. (CSSB 131(STA))

Effective Date: October 15, 2007

Chapter 61 **TOBACCO PRODUCTS**
Makes it a crime for the holder of a tobacco business license endorsement to allow a minor to sell tobacco products. Establishes ignition propensity testing, marking, and banding requirements for cigarettes sold in the state. Establishes civil penalties for violations involving sales of cigarettes that do not satisfy those requirements. Establishes a fire prevention and public safety fund to pay state expenses for implementing the new requirements. With regard to tobacco business license endorsements, allows an endorsement suspension period to be reduced or increased under certain conditions. Requires that an endorsement holder be notified when the holder's agent or employee is cited for certain tobacco sales violations. (HCS CSSB 84(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect August 1, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect October 16, 2007

Chapter 62 **ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION: TRANSFER OF LAND TO EKLUTNA, INC.**

Authorizes a transfer of land from the Alaska Railroad Corporation to Eklutna, Inc. (SB 103)

Effective Date: July 19, 2007

Chapter 63 **CIVIL LEGAL SERVICES FUND**

Allows the Legislature to appropriate the state's share of punitive damage awards to the civil legal services fund and allows the Legislature to appropriate from the fund to provide civil legal services to low-income individuals. (CSSB 69(FIN))

Effective Date: October 29, 2007

Chapter 64 **MUNICIPAL IMPOUNDMENT AND FORFEITURE OF MOTOR VEHICLES FOR UNPAID TRAFFIC FINES**

Authorizes municipalities to adopt ordinances providing for the impoundment and forfeiture of motor vehicles used by persons who have \$1,000 or more in unpaid tickets for moving violations. (HCS SB 145(JUD))

Effective Date: October 29, 2007

Chapter 65 **ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION PARTICIPATION IN KENAI GASIFICATION PROJECT AND PORT MACKENZIE RAIL LINK**

Allows the Alaska Railroad Corporation to participate in a project for transporting coal from Healy to the northern Kenai Peninsula, utilizing a rail link from Healy to Port MacKenzie. Allows for bonds to be issued up to \$2,900,000,000 in order to fund the corporation's involvement in the project, \$300,000,000 of which is to be used for the Port MacKenzie portion of the project. Provides that the authorization to issue bonds for the Port MacKenzie portion of the project terminates June 30, 2012, and that the authorization to issue bonds for the transportation of coal from Healy to the northern Kenai Peninsula terminates June 30, 2015. (SCS HB 229(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: August 26, 2007

Chapter 66 **OPTOMETRISTS' PRESCRIPTION AND USE OF PHARMACEUTICAL AGENTS**

Requires additional training and education for optometrists before the Board of Examiners in Optometry may issue a license endorsement allowing the prescription and use of pharmaceutical agents. Restricts what pharmaceutical agents may be

prescribed and the manner in which those agents may be used by optometrists. Requires optometrists prescribing and using pharmaceutical agents to have a physician-patient relationship with the patient for which the agent is prescribed or used and to have on file with the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development the licensee's federal Drug Enforcement Administration registration number. (SCS CSHB 113(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 4 takes effect January 1, 2009; remainder of Act takes effect December 6, 2007

FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

Chapter 1 SENIOR CASH ASSISTANCE

Establishes the senior benefits payment program that provides monthly cash assistance on a graduated scale beginning August 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2011, to residents 65 years of age and older who meet specified poverty levels and other eligibility criteria. Provides legislative intent that the program will be funded with existing appropriations under the general relief assistance allocation to the Department of Health and Social Services. Waives the reduction or elimination of benefits provisions for inadequate appropriations during fiscal year 2008.

(HCS CSSB 4(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: July 29, 2007

Chapter 30 **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and appropriations to capitalize fund. Ratifies certain expenditures. (HCS CSSB 53(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Sections 1, 10, 13 - 19, 20(a), 20(b), 20(c), 20(d), 20(e), 20(f), 20(g), 20(h), 20(i), 20(j), 20(m), 20(n), 20(o), 20(p), 20(q), 20(r), 20(s), 20(t), 20(u), 21 - 24, 28(b), 31(a), 33 - 46, 47(a), 47(c), 48(a), 49 - 51, 53, 54, 56, 57, 61, and 62 take effect June 30, 2007; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2007; section 14(b) is retroactive to June 30, 2006; sections 37(b) and 37(c) are retroactive to July 1, 2006; sections 20(k) and 20(l) are retroactive to December 1, 2006; section 20(n) is retroactive to March 16, 2007; sections 20(h) and 20(i) are retroactive to April 16, 2007; section 14(c) is retroactive to May 1, 2007


