SYNOPSES OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

2008

SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

Chapter 1 **SAFE SURRENDER OF INFANTS**

Prohibits the criminal prosecution of a parent who surrenders the parent's infant who is less than 21 days of age, is surrendered safely under the law, and is not the subject of a custody order. Provides for a safe surrender procedure, immunity from liability for a person or entity receiving the infant under the procedure, and cancellation of child support obligations and reunification efforts. **(CSHB 29(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 11, 2008

Chapter 2 **COMPASSIONATE GIFTS UNDER THE LEGISLATIVE ETHICS ACT**

Eliminates the limit on the value of compassionate gifts that a legislator or legislative employee may solicit, accept, or receive under the Legislative Ethics Act. **(HB 317)**

Effective Date: February 14, 2008

Chapter 3 **AIRFIELD OWNERS' AND OPERATORS' LIABILITY**

Limits the liability of persons who own or operate an airfield, runway, or landing area without compensation: the limitation on liability applies to personal injury or aircraft damage resulting from taking off, landing, parking, or operating an aircraft; it does not apply to conduct that is grossly negligent, reckless, or intentional. Repeals conditions applicable to limiting liability for airfield owners and operators that require marking closed runways or listing the runway as closed on aeronautical charts. **(HCS SSSB 139(JUD))**

Effective Date: May 13, 2008

Chapter 4 **CONSTRUCTION-RELATED PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACTS OF PUBLIC AGENCIES**

Requires a public agency to include in certain construction-related consultant contracts a provision for the consultant to indemnify, defend, and hold the agency harmless for the negligence of the consultant. Requires the provision to include an

apportionment of the indemnification, defense, and hold harmless obligation on a comparative fault basis. Declares that a provision that reads substantially like the provision set out in the statute satisfies the obligation enacted by this chapter. (SCS CSHB 151(JUD))

Effective Date: May 26, 2008

Chapter 5 **SUSAN BUTCHER DAY**

Establishes the first Saturday of every March as Susan Butcher Day. (HB 37(efd add))

Effective Date: February 29, 2008

Chapter 6 **ALASKA HISTORY WEEK**

Establishes the first week of every March as Alaska History Week. (HB 259(efd add))

Effective Date: March 27, 2008

Chapter 7 **TRUSTS, TRUSTEES, AND SETTLORS**

Allows a professional corporation to issue shares to certain revocable trusts. Establishes how to determine a trustee's compensation and how to accept or reject being a trustee. Provides rules relating to co-trustees, trustee vacancies, trustee resignations, trustee removal, trustee expense reimbursement, and trustee liens. Allows a trustee to provide non-beneficiaries with a trust certification rather than a copy of the trust instrument, addresses reliance on the certification, and sets a civil penalty for demanding the trust instrument in bad faith. Amends a section dealing with trustee power to appoint principal from one trust to another trust. Alters the test for when a trustee of a charitable trust may change the percentage of the trust value that is selected to be considered income. Provides for averaging a charitable trust's value when the trust has been in existence less than three years. States that a settlor's expressed intention to protect trust assets from a beneficiary's potential future creditors is not evidence of an intent to defraud. (HB 197 am)

Effective Date: March 28, 2008

Chapter 8 **SALMON PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT TAX CREDIT**

Extends to December 31, 2011, the date by which property must be placed into service in order to receive the salmon product development tax credit. Amends the definition of "qualified investment" to include conveyors used to produce a value-added salmon product. Requires the Department of Revenue to develop and implement procedures for issuing a decision on whether a taxpayer's proposed

investment will qualify for the salmon product development tax credit. Extends the date of repeal for the salmon product development tax credit to not later than January 1, 2015. **(CSHB 321(FSH))**

Effective Date: March 28, 2008

Chapter 9 PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING AND TRANSPORTATION

Provides a per student public school transportation multiplier, adjusted annually, for each school district. Stabilizes state aid for public schools for up to three years for significant decreases in the adjusted daily membership that are not caused by boundary adjustments. Increases the multiplier for intensive services funding for public schools over a three year period. Increases the public school district cost factor over a five year period. Increases the base student allocation over a three year period. **(CSHB 273(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 2 and 11 take effect June 25, 2008; sections 1, 3, 4, 7, and 8 take effect July 1, 2008; sections 5 and 9 take effect July 1, 2009; sections 6 and 10 take effect July 1, 2010

Chapter 10 FORT ROUSSEAU CAUSEWAY STATE HISTORICAL PARK

Establishes the Fort Rousseau Causeway State Historical Park to promote, support, and preserve public use by maintaining and protecting the area's fish and wildlife habitat, cultural resources, and scenic values. Describes the land to be included within the park and assigns management responsibilities to the Department of Natural Resources. **(CSHB 176(RES))**

Effective Date: June 30, 2008

Chapter 11 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

Makes supplemental, capital appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations, including appropriations to implement salary and benefit adjustments for state officers and employees. Makes an appropriation to the senior benefit payment program, amends certain appropriations, ratifies certain expenditures, and makes appropriations to capitalize funds. By item veto, the Governor eliminated certain grants to named recipients, grants to municipalities, and other appropriations to departments. **(HCS CSSB 256(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 21(d) and 32 are conditional; sections 1, 16 - 20, 21(a), 21(b), 21(d), and 34 take effect April 4, 2008; section 21(c) takes effect June 30, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect April 13, 2008

Chapter 12 **COMMUNITY REVENUE SHARING PROGRAM**

Establishes a new community revenue sharing program and repeals several other municipal assistance programs. Establishes a community revenue sharing fund consisting of appropriations to it, and authorizes annual payments totaling one-third of the fund balance if the balance is at least \$60,000,000 on June 30. Provides for basic payments to municipalities, unincorporated communities, and Indian reserves according to a formula. Permits increases in payments on a per capita basis to municipalities, unincorporated communities in the unorganized borough, and Indian reserves if extra money is available for distribution. Establishes payment eligibility requirements for reserves and unincorporated communities.

(HCS CSSB 72(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: April 9, 2008

Chapter 13 **STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM AMENDMENTS**

Amends the defined benefit plan of the Public Employees' Retirement System so as to change it into a cost-sharing program in which employers make contributions at a uniform contribution rate. Modifies the accounting system requirements applicable to participating employers and substitutes a revised employer contribution provision. Amends provisions of the plan covering additional state contributions to meet past service liability and the handling of medical benefit contributions. Makes procedural changes applicable to recovery of employer's contributions not timely submitted and to terminations of coverage and to recovery of termination coverage costs. Makes conforming amendments. Amends provisions of the defined benefit plan of the Teachers' Retirement System covering employers contributions, additional state contributions covering past service liability, and the handling of medical benefit contributions. **(FCCS SB 125)**

Effective Date: Sections 2 and 25 take effect April 9, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 14 **OFFERING OF PROMOTIONAL CHECKS**

Makes the offering of certain promotional checks an unfair trade practice under the state's general unfair trade practices law if cashing or depositing the check obligates the person to pay for goods or services. **(CSHB 182(JUD))**

Effective Date: July 8, 2008

Chapter 15 **CAPSTONE AVIONICS EQUIPMENT LOANS**

Establishes the Alaska capstone avionics revolving loan fund. Permits the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to make loans for the purchase and installation of capstone avionics equipment. Requires a loan applicant to be the owner of an aircraft that logs a substantial percentage of flight

hours in the state. Places limitations on the loans. Defines "capstone avionics equipment." (SB 249)

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect April 10, 2008; section 2 takes effect July 1, 2020; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 16 IDENTIFICATION SEALS FOR NATIVE WORKS OF ART

Changes certain requirements for the use of a state identification seal identifying authentic Alaska Native works of art. Allows an individual who is a state resident and an enrolled member of an Alaska tribe to receive the seal for an article created or crafted by the individual. Requires an article to be an original article of authentic Alaska Native art created or crafted in the state in order to be entitled to have the seal affixed. Removes the provisions that relate to using agents to issue identification seal permits. Makes violations of certain identification seal provisions unfair trade practices under the state's general unfair trade practice law. Allows any person to report a violation of the identification seal provisions. (HCS CSSB 97(JUD))

Effective Date: July 9, 2008

Chapter 17 STATE ASSUMPTION OF REGULATION OF POINT SOURCE POLLUTANTS AND PERMITS UNDER FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT

Makes changes to the Department of Environmental Conservation's point source pollution permitting program to allow the department, under federal law, to assume from the Environmental Protection Agency full responsibility for regulating point source pollution. Requires an owner or operator of a facility to monitor, sample, and report effluent point source discharges. Adds new criminal penalties for violations of permits and regulations relating to the monitoring, sampling, and reporting of effluent point source discharges. Requires a person constructing, modifying, or operating a sewage system or treatment works to obtain prior approval from the department before disposal or discharge of solid or liquid waste material, heated process, or cooling waters into state waters or onto state land unless the person is discharging only domestic sewage into a publicly owned treatment works. (CSHB 149(RES))

Effective Date: April 15, 2008

Chapter 18 BOARD OF GAME MEMBERSHIP

Amends to July 1 the start date for the terms of the members of the Board of Game. Provides a procedure for the Governor appointing a person to fill a vacancy on the board. Provides a transition applicable to the terms of the Board of Game members serving on January 1, 2008. (SB 253)

Effective Date: April 15, 2008

Chapter 19 **REGULATION OF DISPENSING OPTICIANS; DISTRIBUTION OF USED EYEGLASSES BY NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS**

Amends and repeals statutory provisions to assign to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development the powers and duties of the former Board of Dispensing Opticians. Allows nonprofit organizations that are approved by that department to distribute and fit certain used eyeglasses if the eyeglasses are distributed and fitted free of charge and the fitting substantially conforms to an appropriate prescription. (CSSB 149(L&C))

Effective Date: July 18, 2008

Chapter 20 **CHARITABLE GAMING: USE OF BROADCASTING, PRIZE LIMITS, AND AUTHORIZING CABBAGE CLASSICS**

Increases the maximum amount of prizes that may be awarded each year for certain charitable gaming activities. Allows the use of broadcasting to promote a dog mushers' contest and radio and television broadcasting to promote raffles and lotteries. Authorizes cabbage classics as a form of charitable gaming. (CCS SB 59)

Effective Date: July 18, 2008

Chapter 21 **COMPENSATION OF PUBLIC OFFICERS, OFFICIALS, AND EMPLOYEES WHO ARE NOT COVERED BY COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS**

Increases salaries for certain public officials, officers, and employees who are not covered by collective bargaining agreements and, for certain positions, adds new longevity pay increments. Extends salary increases or adjustments to certain exempt officers and employees of the executive branch, legislative branch, Alaska Court System, and the University of Alaska. Establishes a State Officers Compensation Commission and prescribes its powers and duties concerning setting the compensation of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, executive branch department heads, and legislators. (SCS CSHB 417(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 2, 3, and 6 - 8 are conditional; sections 10, 11, 16, 19(a), 20(a), 21, 22, and 25 - 27 take effect May 3, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008; sections 11, 19(a), 20(a), and 21 are retroactive to July 1, 2007

Chapter 22 **LAND MANAGEMENT AND PROTECTION FROM WILDLAND FIRE AND OTHER DESTRUCTIVE AGENTS**
Changes the term "forest fire" to "wildland fire" throughout the Alaska Statutes. Defines "destructive agent" for the purposes of protecting forested land. (CSHB 370(RES))

Effective Date: May 6, 2008

Chapter 23 **PURPLE HEART TRAIL**
Designates the Alaska Highway and a portion of the Richardson Highway as the Purple Heart Trail. Directs the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to erect and maintain signs that show these highways are a part of the Purple Heart Trail and provide information about the trail at pullouts. (CSSB 216(TRA))

Effective Date: August 1, 2008

Chapter 24 **GAME REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF GAME**
Explicitly authorizes the Board of Game to regulate the conservation, development, or utilization of game in a manner that addresses whether, how, when, and where the public asset of game is allocated or appropriated. (SB 306)

Effective Date: August 11, 2008

Chapter 25 **BIG GAME COMMERCIAL SERVICES BOARD**
Extends the termination date of the Big Game Commercial Services Board to June 30, 2012. (HB 315)

Effective Date: May 18, 2008

Chapter 26 **WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR DISABLED FIREFIGHTERS**
Creates a rebuttable presumption that a workers' compensation claim by a fire fighter disabled as a result of respiratory disease, certain cardiovascular events, or certain cancers is within the provisions of the Alaska Workers' Compensation Act. Declares that the presumption of coverage applies if the fire fighter serves in the state for at least seven years, receives annual medical examinations, and meets other qualifying conditions. (CSHB 200(FIN))

Effective Date: August 19, 2008

Chapter 27 **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for state fiscal year 2009 for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, for certain programs, capitalizes funds, and makes appropriations under art. IX, sec 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska. **(CCS HB 310)**

Effective Date: Sections 11(a) and 30 take effect June 30, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008; those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific year 2008 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2008, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2008, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 28 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for state fiscal year 2009 for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program. **(CCS HB 312)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2008

Chapter 29 **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and appropriations to capitalize funds. Makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c) of the state constitution from the constitutional budget reserve fund. **(HCS CSSB 221(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: Sections 1, 4, 7, 10, 29 - 32, 33(a), 33(d), 33(e), 36(b), 36(c), 36(d), 36(e), 36(h), 42(d), 42(e), 42(f), 60(d), 61(a), 63(c), 63(d), 67(c), 68, 72(b), 73, and 76 take effect May 23, 2008; sections 33(b), 33(c), 34, 36(f), 39(a), 40, 41, 42(a), 42(b), 42(c), 43 - 57, 63(b), 65, 66(c), 67(b), 69, 70, and 72(a) take effect June 30, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008; section 33(a) is retroactive to March 10, 2008; section 42(d) is retroactive to January 1, 2008; certain appropriations in sections 10, 13, 22, 25, 35, 58, 61(b), 61(c), 66(g), and 66(i) are conditional

Chapter 30 **GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS**

Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not more than \$315,050,000 for listed state transportation projects. Provides for grants to municipalities for some of the projects. Directs that the question whether the bonds

are to be issued be placed before the voters at the next general election.
(SCS CSHB 314(FIN))

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 31 ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Establishes a renewable energy grant fund and a renewable energy grant recommendation program. Authorizes and provides a procedure for the Alaska Energy Authority to distribute renewable energy grants for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009. Establishes a state heating assistance program. Establishes an Alaska Renewable Energy Task Force. **(SCS CSHB 152(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date: Sections 2, 4, 9, and 11 take effect May 23, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect August 20, 2008; AS 47.25.621 and 47.25.623, enacted by section 4, are retroactive to November 1, 2007

Chapter 32 OIL SPILL TRAINING AND RESPONSE UNEMPLOYMENT TAX EXEMPTION

Exempts employers from paying unemployment tax for temporary services provided by fishing vessel crewmembers if the services are related to oil spill training and response activities. **(CSHB 289(FSH))**

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 33 ALASKA COMMISSION ON AGING

Extends the termination date of the Alaska Commission on Aging to June 30, 2016. **(SB 209)**

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 34 OLDER ALASKANS PROGRAMS: DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COMMISSION ON AGING AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Transfers the administration of older Alaskans service, adult day care, and family respite care grants from the Commission on Aging to the Department of Health and Social Services. Requires the department to establish state policy to implement the federal Older Americans Act. Provides for the department's direct review of the state plan for older Alaskans. Excludes from state income calculations for certain purposes federal payments that by federal law are excluded from income for federal assistance purposes. **(HCS CSSB 243(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 20, 2008

Chapter 35 **LIABILITIES OF GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT SYSTEMS**

Permits a state or local government employer to prepay accrued actuarial liability to retirement systems. Addresses how prepayments will be accounted for in the state retirement systems. Authorizes certain state entities to issue obligations to prepay all or a portion of each participating state or local government employer's liability. Permits the issuance of pension obligation bonds only if the state bond rating is the equivalent of AA- or better. Limits the total value of unpaid principal of bonds issued by all state entities together to \$5,000,000,000. Addresses other financing terms and agreements relating to obligations to public retirement systems. Establishes the Alaska Pension Obligation Bond Corporation and prescribes its powers and duties. **(SCS CSHB 13(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 36 **ABSENCES FROM THE STATE AND PERMANENT FUND DIVIDEND ELIGIBILITY**

For purposes of eligibility for permanent fund dividends, adds absences from the state while participating in a student fellowship sponsored by certain federal agencies to the list of allowable absences. Makes the change retroactive to January 1, 2005. Authorizes individuals who may qualify because of the change to file applications for 2006, 2007, or 2008 dividends by September 15, 2008. **(CSHB 284(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 23, 2008; the amendments to AS 43.23.008(a) and (b) made in sections 1 and 2 are retroactive to January 1, 2005

Chapter 37 **CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE**

Allows the Board of Public Accountancy to grant a license to an applicant who has three years of accounting experience satisfactory to the board, has completed a baccalaureate degree or its equivalent before January 1, 2008, and has additional semester hours of post baccalaureate study, so that the applicant's total educational program includes at least 150 hours. **(HB 379)**

Effective Date: August 20, 2008

Chapter 38 **ADOPTIONS AND STATE CUSTODY OF CHILDREN**

Changes the age of consent for and notice of an adoption, without court approval, from 19 to 18 years of age. Makes changes to the amount and duration of subsidy payments for adoptions of hard to place children. Clarifies and amends penalty and civil liability provisions related to care of children in state custody. Authorizes the

child support services agency to require a parent to pay child support for a child in state custody. (CSHB 354(JUD))

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 39 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM EFFECTIVE DATES AND REPEALS

Repeals a provision of ch. 96, SLA 2006, that made certain provisions of that Act conditionally effective on federal approval of a revised state medical assistance plan. Repeals provisions of that Act, relating to application requirements for persons under 18 years of age and to eligibility for the medical assistance program, that did not receive federal approval. Gives immediate effect to certain provisions of ch. 96, SLA 2006, and retroactive effect to some of those provisions. (SB 259)

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 40 CORRECTIVE AMENDMENTS: 2008 REVISOR'S BILL

Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the revisor of statutes. (HCS CSSB 260(FIN))

Effective Date: May 23, 2008

Chapter 41 CONTRIBUTIONS FROM AND EXECUTION ON PERMANENT FUND DIVIDENDS

For permanent fund dividends for 2009, 2010, and 2011, directs the Department of Revenue to allow an applicant who applies electronically for a permanent fund dividend to make contributions from that dividend to educational organizations, community foundations, or charitable organizations that are listed on the application. Establishes eligibility and application requirements for organizations that are included on the application list. Authorizes a licensed civilian process server to use electronic execution procedures to serve the commissioner of revenue with a writ of execution upon a permanent fund dividend. (SCS CSHB 166(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: May 24, 2008

Chapter 42 SEX OFFENDER AND CHILD KIDNAPPER REGISTRATION

Amends the crime of failure to register as a sex offender or child kidnapper in the second degree. Provides that persons convicted of certain unclassified felony sex offenses may be required to submit to electronic monitoring for their probationary term upon release from a correctional facility. Provides that sex offenders and child kidnappers must include their electronic mail addresses, instant messaging addresses, and Internet communication identifiers as part of the sex offender and child kidnapper registration program. Authorizes the Department of Public Safety to

participate in a federal program that allows the public to check whether an electronic mail address, instant messaging address, or Internet communication identifier is registered to a sex offender or child kidnapper. (HCS CSSB 185(FIN))

Effective Date: January 1, 2009

Chapter 43 **UNCLAIMED ELECTRIC AND TELEPHONE COOPERATIVE DISTRIBUTIONS**

Changes the notice requirements that an electric or telephone cooperative must give before an unclaimed distribution of net margins to a person is presumed abandoned under the state's unclaimed property provisions and reverts to the cooperative. Adjusts the notice requirements according to whether the cooperative has an Internet website. In addition to the notice requirement that applies generally to the cooperatives, requires a cooperative with a website to post the notice on the website and to publish the notice in a newspaper. (SCS CSHB 233(L&C))

Effective Date: August 25, 2008

Chapter 44 **LIMITED STATE EXPENDITURES RELATING TO THE FEDERAL REAL ID ACT**

Prohibits state agencies from expending funds solely to implement or aid in the implementation of the requirements of the federal REAL ID Act. (HCS SB 202(STA))

Effective Date: August 26, 2008

Chapter 45 **UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION**

Changes unemployment insurance contribution rates by increasing the contribution required of employees and decreasing the contribution required of employers. Allows the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to provide certain wage and unemployment compensation information to the federal government or other persons who may request it, and limits how those persons may use the information. (CSSB 120(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1 - 8, 13, and 14 take effect May 29, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2009

Chapter 46 **STATE TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (STEP)**

Requires annual reviews of the state training and employment program (STEP) during each of state fiscal years 2009 and 2010, and extends the program's termination date to June 30, 2010. (SCS CSHB 226(FIN))

Effective Date: May 29, 2008

Chapter 47 **TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION**

Increases the amount of unemployment compensation contributions by an employee for payment into the Alaska technical and vocational education program and modifies the allocation percentage of that money to specified training centers. Requires annual expenditure and performance reports by those centers. Establishes a vocational education account for appropriations and contributions for approved vocational education programs provided by the state and political subdivisions of the state. (SCS HB 2(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2008

Chapter 48 **TAX CREDITS FOR CONTRIBUTIONS ACCEPTED FOR CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES, INCLUDING VOCATIONAL EDUCATION**

Adds contributions accepted by secondary school level vocational education courses and programs, and by a state operated vocational technical education and training school, to the list of eligible educational contributions for a tax credit against taxes on insurance premiums; corporate income; oil and gas production; oil and gas exploration, production, and pipeline transportation property; mining; and fisheries businesses. (SCS CSHB 61(FIN))

Effective Date: January 1, 2009

Chapter 49 **BIG GAME HUNTING GUIDES AND TRANSPORTERS**

Removes the requirement that there must be a hearing before the Big Game Commercial Services Board may impose a disciplinary sanction on a big game hunting guide or transporter licensee. Excludes from the chapter under which those guides and transporters are licensed a person who receives or intends to receive compensation if the person only accommodates a big game hunter in the field at a permanent lodge, house, or cabin on private land owned by the person, or at a state or federal cabin on state or federal land. (SCS HB 165(RLS))

Effective Date: August 26, 2008

Chapter 50 **USE OF MILITIA AND THE ALASKA NATIONAL GUARD TO FIGHT WILDLAND FIRE**

Allows the Governor to order the organized militia into active state service to fight wildland fire and, in that circumstance, to delegate authority over the militia to the adjutant general. Allows the Governor to authorize, at rates of pay established for certain emergency fire-fighting personnel, payment of the Alaska National Guard called into active state service to fight wildland fire. (CSHB 326(FIN))

Effective Date: June 3, 2008

Chapter 51 **HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSES FOR MEMBERS OF THE MILITARY**
Allows nonresident members of the military or the United States Coast Guard to obtain a hunting license at the resident rate and a numbered, nontransferable tag for mountain goat or sheep at no cost. Allows active members of the Alaska National Guard and military reserves to obtain a free hunting or sport fishing license. **(HCS CSSB 214(FIN))**

Effective Date: January 1, 2009

Chapter 52 **MARINE PARK UNITS**
Restricts the commissioner of natural resources from prohibiting fishing, hunting, or trapping within a marine park unit of the Alaska state park system. Expands the boundaries for the marine park system in Lynn Canal within the City and Borough of Juneau. **(CSSB 57(RES))**

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 53 **CONSERVATORS AND GUARDIANS AND RELATED COURT AND OFFICE OF PUBLIC ADVOCACY PROCEDURES; ADOPTION OF UNIFORM ACT**
Adopts the Uniform Adult Guardianship and Protective Proceedings Jurisdiction Act and makes conforming statutory changes. Changes licensing categories, requirements, and procedures for guardians and conservators. In a court hearing on incapacity, allows a court to make a finding of incapacity without obtaining evidence from an expert if a respondent stipulates to incapacity. Amends court procedures related to guardians, conservators, and protected persons. Changes Office of Public Advocacy procedures related to the office's role as public guardian. **(HCS CSSB 101(JUD))**

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 54 **SHIRLEY DEMIENTIEFF MEMORIAL BRIDGE**
Designates the bridge on the George Parks Highway directly north of the Alaska Native Veterans' Honor Bridge as the Shirley Demientieff Memorial Bridge. **(SB 158)**

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 55 **PUBLIC LIBRARY SUPPORT**
Converts the existing library assistance grant fund to a grant program. Provides for a matching grant program within the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development for construction and major expansion of eligible libraries.

Establishes a public school library collection development program within the Department of Education and Early Development. (HCS CSSB 119(FIN))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 56 MOTOR VEHICLE SALE DISCLOSURES

Repeals a disclosure provision that required the dealer selling a used motor vehicle to disclose information related to warranties and foreign manufacture of the vehicle by posting it in the window of the vehicle. Applies the repeal retroactively to sales on or after October 24, 2004, to the extent allowed by law. Removes from the retroactivity provision a sale that is or has been the subject of a court action based on the repealed section if the court action is pending on or was completed by January 1, 2008. (CSSB 164(JUD))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 57 OFFERING INSURANCE FOR WELL-BABY EXAMS

Requires health care insurers to offer coverage for the cost of well-baby exams. (CSSB 170(FIN))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 58 CRIMINAL SENTENCING: AGGRAVATING FACTOR AT SENTENCING RELATING TO THE VULNERABILITY OF THE VICTIM DUE TO HOMELESSNESS

Amends the aggravating factor at sentencing relating to the defendant's knowledge of the victim's vulnerability or incapability of resistance to include the victim's homelessness as one of the factors among a number of listed factors. (HCS SB 211(JUD))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 59 MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT'S RIGHTS

Establishes a right to staff choice for the provision of intimate care for patients 18 years of age or older who are receiving mental health treatment and intimate care at a hospital. Requires certain actions of hospital staff to provide privacy and to accommodate staff choice. Sets out specific exceptions to these requirements. (CSSB 8(FIN))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 60 **ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION: POWERS RELATING TO HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS**

Authorizes the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to participate in the development of buildings and in demonstration housing projects that address homelessness, to provide financial assistance to prevent homelessness, to support housing retention services, and to facilitate transition from dependency on low-cost housing. (HCS CSSB 231(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2008

Chapter 61 **RELEASE OF INFORMATION IN WORKERS' COMPENSATION RECORDS**

Prohibits the release of an employee's name, address, social security number, electronic mail address, and telephone number from workers' compensation records unless disclosure is authorized by the employee. (SCS CSHB 121(FIN)(efd fld))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 62 **ALASKA MARINE TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY BOARD**

Establishes the Alaska Marine Transportation Advisory Board and prescribes the membership and duties of the board. Requires the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to consult with the board in preparing a comprehensive long range plan for the Alaska Marine Highway System. Provides a procedure for initial appointments to the board. (SCS CSSSHB 294(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: June 5, 2008

Chapter 63 **FILM OFFICE AND FILM PRODUCTION TAX CREDIT**

Establishes a film office and a film production incentive program, administered by the film office and the Department of Revenue, that provides a transferable tax credit for certain film production expenditures incurred in the state. Establishes the duties of the film office. Provides what film productions are eligible for a tax credit and how the qualified expenditures and the tax credit for a film production will be determined. Allows the film office, in cooperation with the Department of Revenue, to review and withhold a tax credit. Allows the film office to recover the amount of a tax credit awarded to a film producer if the office determines the film producer or production is liable for damages to the state. Repeals the film production incentive program on the earlier of July 1, 2013, or when the number of tax credits provided in the aggregate and the estimated amount of tax credits that could be claimed, based on applications for the credits approved by the film office, together equals \$100,000,000. (HCS CSSSB 230(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 3 and 4 are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect September 2, 2008

Chapter 64 **REMOVAL OF A PARTIALLY CONSUMED BOTTLE OF WINE FROM LICENSED PREMISES**

Allows a person to leave a licensed premise with the unconsumed portion of a bottle of wine that was partially consumed with a meal if the bottle is recorked or sealed in a manner approved by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Declares that the recorked or sealed bottle is not an open container. **(SB 305)**

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 65 **MINTO FLATS STATE GAME REFUGE AND TANANA VALLEY STATE FOREST**

Amends the descriptions of land and water included in the Minto Flats State Game Refuge and the Tanana Valley State Forest. Provides for a net increase in the area of both the refuge and the state forest, and transfers some land and water from the state forest to the refuge. **(SB 229)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2008

Chapter 66 **STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, AND LAND SURVEYORS**

Provides that, if a qualified mining engineer is not available for appointment to the board seat designated for a mining engineer, the Governor may appoint a petroleum or chemical engineer. Exempts authorized persons who design fire detection or suppression systems from having to register with the board. **(CSSB 263(L&C))**

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 67 **ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY BONDS**

Gives legislative approval for the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority to issue bonds to refund outstanding bonds that financed the acquisition of the Snettisham hydroelectric project. Extends a municipal tax exemption for certain assets and projects of the authority. **(SB 255 am H(reengrossed))**

Effective Date: June 5, 2008; section 3 is retroactive to July 1, 2007

Chapter 68 **ARSON IN THE THIRD DEGREE**

Creates a new crime of arson in the third degree committed when a person intentionally damages a motor vehicle by fire or explosion when the vehicle is on state or municipal land. **(HB 268)**

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 69 **ALASKA REGIONAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AND COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION**

Extends the termination date for the Alaska regional economic assistance program to July 1, 2013. Authorizes the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission to continue to maintain a vessel-based limited entry fisheries system for the weathervane scallop and Bering Sea hair crab fisheries by delaying the repeal of the program authorization to December 30, 2013. (HCS SB 254(FIN)(efd am H))

Effective Date: June 5, 2008

Chapter 70 **IMPROVING INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICES IN PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS**

Requires the Department of Education and Early Development to establish criteria for intervention in a school district to improve instructional practices. Authorizes the department to adopt regulations and intervene in district and school personnel and funding decisions. (HCS CSSB 285(HES))

Effective Date: June 5, 2008

Chapter 71 **BOARD OF REGENTS REPORT ON TEACHERS**

Requires the University of Alaska Board of Regents to prepare an annual report for each of three years and, thereafter, a biennial report for the Legislature that describes the University's efforts to attract, train, and retain qualified public school teachers. (HCS CSSB 241(HES))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect July 1, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect September 2, 2008

Chapter 72 **WATER QUALITY, WATER SUPPLY, SEWAGE, AND SOLID WASTE FACILITY GRANTS**

Modifies the grant requirements for water quality, water supply, sewage, or solid waste facility grants by allowing the Department of Environmental Conservation to make a grant for up to 70 percent of the eligible costs for a municipality with a population of 1,001 to 10,000 persons and a grant for up to 60 percent of the eligible costs for a municipality with a population greater than 10,000 persons. (HCS SB 303(FIN))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 73 HOME ENERGY CONSERVATION AND WEATHERIZATION

Eliminates certain training program requirements used to demonstrate that a residential building complies with thermal and lighting energy standards for purposes of participation by the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation in a loan for the building. Provides that energy conservation standards are met based on a rating under a home energy rating system adopted by the corporation. Eliminates the requirement that the corporation consult with the Board of Directors of the Alaska Craftsman Home Program before adopting guidelines for the Alaska energy efficient home grant fund. Eliminates the requirement that the corporation assist the Alaska Craftsman Home Program and the Energy Rated Homes of Alaska Program. (SB 289)

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 74 MOTOR VEHICLES, INSURANCE, AND DRIVER'S LICENSES

Provides that a person with various driver's licenses or permits or vehicle titles or registrations who fails to provide the required change of name or address to the appropriate department commits an infraction with a maximum fine of \$25. Provides an affirmative defense to a charge of driving with license suspended for failure to provide proof of insurance. Provides that failure to carry proof of insurance is a class B misdemeanor. Requires the Department of Administration to provide notice to the person's last known address when suspending the person's driver's license for failure to provide proof of insurance after an accident. (CSHB 331(L&C))

Effective Date: September 2, 2008

Chapter 75 CRIMINAL LAW AMENDMENTS: OMNIBUS CRIME PACKAGE

Changes the term of probation for persons convicted of minor consuming or in possession or control of alcohol and repeat and habitual minor consuming. Provides that a court may terminate the probation of a person convicted of minor consuming or repeat minor consuming if certain criteria are satisfied. Consolidates offenses by alcoholic beverage licensees and their employees and agents with regard to minors. Increases penalties and amends crimes relating to bootlegging of alcohol. Changes procedures relating to recordkeeping by pawnshops and similar stores. Makes changes to crimes relating to shoplifting and theft. Makes changes to laws relating to arson and criminally negligent burning. Amends statutes and court rules relating to search warrants. Makes changes to statutes relating to criminal defendants who are incompetent. Expands the availability of probation to certain offenses under the criminal code and the fish and game laws. Adds an aggravating factor at sentencing for a defendant's previous assaultive behavior. Makes changes to the procedures for criminal extradition. Reduces the availability of certain petitions for post-conviction relief under law and court rule. Establishes a restitution schedule for certain unlawfully taken game and amends laws relating to post-conviction relief. Requires the Alaska Court System to make certain reports to the Department of

Administration. Allows a court to utilize certain specialized court procedures for prosecutions of bootleggers. Requires the Department of Revenue to withhold payment of permanent fund dividends to sex offenders and child kidnappers who are not current with their registrations and provides other procedures relating to that withholding and notices relating to permanent fund dividends. Requires computer installation and repair technicians and Internet and cellular telephone service providers to report to law enforcement suspected child pornography that they might discover. **(HCS CSSB 265(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: Sections 38 and 45 take effect June 6, 2008; sections 32 - 34 take effect January 1, 2009; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008; section 38 is retroactive to July 1, 2007

Chapter 76 DOCUMENTS FILED OR RECORDED WITH THE STATE

Removes the requirement that recording offices must provide facilities for persons to inspect records in order to examine titles, make title abstracts, insure titles, or build and maintain title and abstract plants. Repeals the forms currently provided in statute for filing secured transaction financing statements under the Uniform Commercial Code and allows the Department of Natural Resources to authorize the forms to be used. Precludes a record from being considered filed for a secured transaction under the Uniform Commercial Code if the filing office refuses to accept the record because it is not communicated on a form authorized by regulation. **(HB 295)**

Effective Date: Section 6 takes effect June 7, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 77 BOARD OF PAROLE

Extends the termination date for the Board of Parole to June 30, 2016. **(HB 296)**

Effective Date: June 7, 2008

Chapter 78 IMPERSONATING A PUBLIC SERVANT

Creates a new class C felony of impersonating a public servant in the first degree, committed when a person pretends to be a peace officer and purports to exercise the authority of a peace officer in relation to another person. Amends the existing crime of impersonating a public servant, redesignating it as impersonating a public servant in the second degree, by providing that it is committed when a person pretends to be a public servant and purports to exercise the authority of a public servant in relation to another person. **(SCS HB 286(JUD))**

Effective Date: September 4, 2008

Chapter 79 **PERMANENT FUND DIVIDEND: NOTICE REQUIREMENT EXEMPTION AND ELECTRONIC EXECUTION PROCEDURES**

Exempts appropriations of certain amounts for grants to minor children of incarcerated individuals from requirements that appropriations from the permanent fund dividend fund be disclosed. Permits a writ of execution on a permanent fund dividend to be served on the commissioner of revenue by a civilian process server using electronic execution procedures, and amends court rules to allow the electronic execution procedures. **(HB 366 am)**

Effective Date: Section 1 takes effect June 7, 2008; sections 2 and 3 take effect January 1, 2009; remainder of Act takes effect September 4, 2008

Chapter 80 **PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT LEAVE**

Provides for paid leave under certain circumstances for public and court system employees to make organ or bone marrow donations. **(CSHB 252(STA))**

Effective Date: September 4, 2008

Chapter 81 **COUNCIL ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT**

Extends the termination date of the Council on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault to June 30, 2014. **(HB 334)**

Effective Date: June 7, 2008

Chapter 82 **DISTRIBUTION OF ALASKA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE AND ALASKA ADMINISTRATIVE REGISTER**

Enables a local government unit to exclude itself from receiving copies of the Alaska Administrative Code and the Alaska Administrative Register after notifying the Lieutenant Governor. Allows the local government unit to begin receiving these publications again after notifying the Lieutenant Governor. **(HB 344)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2008

Chapter 83 **DENTIST LICENSING EXAM EXEMPTION**

Provides an exemption from the dentist licensing examination for certain persons who have been engaged in continuous active clinical practice averaging at least 20 hours a week, or in a full time dental supervisory position, in an agency or the armed forces of the United States. **(CSHB 383(L&C))**

Effective Date: September 4, 2008

Chapter 84 **CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE PRESCRIPTION DATABASE**

Establishes a controlled substance prescription database to be administered by the Board of Pharmacy. Provides for access to the information in the database for certain persons for certain reasons. Provides criminal penalties for unauthorized access to or disclosure of information in the database. **(HCS CSSB 196(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: September 7, 2008

Chapter 85 **OMBUDSMAN'S OFFICE JURISDICTION**

Removes the victims' rights advocate and the staff of the office of victims' rights from the jurisdiction of the ombudsman. **(HB 92)**

Effective Date: September 8, 2008

Chapter 86 **STATE FISCAL PLAN AND BUDGET PLANNING**

Requires the Governor annually to prepare and deliver to the Legislature a state fiscal plan with estimates of significant sources and uses of funds for the succeeding 10 fiscal years. Sets out specific requirements for the plan. Directs the Department of Revenue to prepare an inventory of state bonded debt, an estimate of state bonded debt that will be acquired within the next three years, and an evaluation of debt affordability. Requires the report on debt to be available to the Legislature and the public by January 31 each year. Permits the presiding officer of each house to refer the fiscal plan to one or more committees. **(SCS CSHB 125(FIN))**

Effective Date: September 8, 2008

Chapter 87 **WILDLIFE VIOLATOR COMPACT**

Adds the state as a party to the Wildlife Violator Compact. Excludes commercial fishing and big game commercial hunting services from the provisions of the compact. Provides a procedure for a peace officer initiating a civil action to revoke an appropriate license for a violation in a state that is a party to the compact. **(CSHB 267(RES))**

Effective Date: September 8, 2008

Chapter 88 **CRIMINAL SENTENCE MITIGATING FACTOR: SEEKING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR ANOTHER PERSON EXPERIENCING A DRUG OVERDOSE**

Provides a mitigating factor at sentencing for a person convicted of a felony drug offense who sought medical assistance for another person experiencing a drug overdose contemporaneously with the commission of the drug offense. **(HB 400)**

Effective Date: September 8, 2008

Chapter 89 **MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION**

Permits a municipality to partially or wholly exempt from taxation the permanent place of abode of a resident widow or widower of a member of the armed forces injured serving on active duty while eligible for hostile fire or imminent danger pay who dies because of the injury. (CSHB 285(CRA))

Effective Date: September 11, 2008

Chapter 90 **VETERANS INFORMATION ON PERMANENT FUND DIVIDEND APPLICATIONS**

Permits an individual to voluntarily indicate on the permanent fund dividend application that the applicant is a veteran, together with reporting the person's service branch and dates of service. Requires the Department of Revenue to release the information to the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs. Permits the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs to release the information to congressionally chartered veterans service organizations in the state. (CSHB 44(FIN))

Effective Date: September 11, 2008

Chapter 91 **SUBMISSION OF FINGERPRINTS BY APPLICANTS FOR CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMITS**

Reduces from two to one the number of sets of fingerprints that an applicant for a concealed handgun permit is required to submit. (CSHB 351(JUD))

Effective Date: June 14, 2008

Chapter 92 **PERSONAL INFORMATION PROTECTION**

Enacts a new chapter for personal information protection. Addresses what steps an information collector must take when personal information on state residents contained in an information system is acquired without authorization and the acquisition compromises the security, confidentiality, or integrity of the personal information. Makes a violation by an information collector who is not a governmental agency an unfair trade practice under the state's general unfair trade practices law. Allows a consumer to place a security freeze on the consumer's credit report or credit score held by a consumer credit reporting agency by prohibiting the consumer credit reporting agency from releasing the consumer's credit report or credit score without the consumer's express authorization. Establishes procedures for placing a security freeze, accessing the items during a security freeze, and removing a security freeze. Sets the charges that the consumer credit reporting agency may impose for these actions. Sets out a notice of rights that a credit agency must give to

a consumer under certain conditions. Requires a consumer credit reporting agency to notify a consumer if the agency violates a security freeze by releasing the consumer's credit report or score. Establishes exemptions from the provisions. Sets limits on the use, request, collection, sale, lease, loan, trade, or rental of an individual's social security number. Requires businesses and governmental agencies who dispose of records that contain personal information to take all reasonable measures necessary to protect against unauthorized access to or use of the records. Allows a victim of identity theft to petition the superior court under certain conditions for a determination that the victim is factually innocent of a crime. Prohibits a person who accepts credit cards or debit cards for a business transaction from printing more than the last four digits of the card number, or the card's expiration date, on a receipt that is electronically printed. Prohibits a person from selling a device that electronically prints more than the last four digits of a credit card or debit card number, or the card's expiration date, on a consumer receipt for a business transaction or on a copy retained by the business. Allows the state to release the names and addresses of permanent fund dividend applicants to a legislator and the legislator's office staff for official legislative purposes. **(SCS CSHB 65(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date: Section 7, and AS 45.48.470, enacted by section 4, take effect June 14, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2009

Chapter 93 INTERSTATE COMPACT FOR THE PLACEMENT OF CHILDREN

Adopts the Interstate Compact for the Placement of Children who are in state custody for abuse or neglect or as adjudicated delinquents. Includes the establishment of an interstate commission for adopting rules pertaining to the placement of children. Makes the compact's effect based on the adoption of the compact by at least 34 other states. **(CSHB 50(JUD))**

Effective Date: Sections 1 - 10 are conditional; section 11 takes effect September 14, 2008

Chapter 94 LEGISLATIVE ETHICS AND REGULATION OF LOBBYING

Adds certain charitable gifts and compassionate gifts to the exemptions for gifts that a legislator and legislative employee may accept from a lobbyist. Allows provisions of a gift that is unconnected with the recipient's legislative status from a member of the legislator's or legislative employee's immediate family. Clarifies the Legislative Ethics Act as it relates to legislative volunteers and educational trainees. Changes from semi-annual to annual the publication requirement for summaries of decisions and opinions to be prepared by the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics. Revises procedures and fines related to the late filing of disclosures required by the Legislative Ethics Act. **(SCS CSHB 368(STA) am S)**

Effective Date: September 14, 2008

Chapter 95 **STANDARDS OF CONDUCT AND PUBLIC DISCLOSURE BY OFFICIALS, LOBBYISTS, AND CANDIDATES FOR PUBLIC OFFICE: REGULATION AND OVERSIGHT**

Requires certain candidates for state and municipal office subject to AS 15.13 to report the principal occupation and employer of contributors making contributions in excess of \$50 in the aggregate during a year. Requires candidates, groups, nongroup entities, and persons required to report under AS 15.13 to preserve certain records relating to the reports for a period of six years. Requires persons who employ, retain, or contract for the services of a lobbyist to preserve certain records for a period of six years. Extends to five years the statute of limitations for filing complaints relating to violations of AS 15.13 with the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Allows any person to file a complaint with that commission alleging that a lobbyist has not complied with the provisions of the Regulation of Lobbying Act (AS 24.45). Provides that a member of the commission who files a complaint relating to a lobbyist under the Regulation of Lobbying Act or to public official financial disclosure under AS 39.50 may not participate in any proceeding of the commission related to the complaint. Extends to five years the statute of limitations for the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics to consider violations of AS 24.60. Allows any person to file with the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics a complaint relating to financial disclosure by legislators, public members of the committee, and legislative directors. Allows any person to file a complaint alleging a violation of AS 39.50 with the Alaska Public Offices Commission within five years of the alleged violation. Repeals the one year statute of limitations for prosecution of violations of the Alaska Election Code. (SCS CSHB 281(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 14 takes effect June 17, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2009

Chapter 96 **CRIMES OF ASSAULT, CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, AND PROMOTING AN EXHIBITION OF FIGHTING ANIMALS**

Provides that certain misdemeanor assaults are punished as class C felonies if the offender has two prior convictions for certain crimes. Provides that a person commits cruelty to animals if the person knowingly kills or injures an animal with the intent to intimidate, threaten, or terrorize another person. Provides that third and subsequent offenses of attending an exhibition of fighting animals is a class A misdemeanor. (SCS CSHB 307(JUD) am S)

Effective Date: September 14, 2008

Chapter 97 **MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATION PRIVILEGE**

Amends the crime of avoidance of ignition interlock device. Provides that a court may not enforce a municipal ordinance for driving under the influence unless the municipal ordinance requires ignition interlock requirements as provided under state

law. Amends the availability of limited driver's licenses when driving privileges or licenses have been revoked. Requires the use of an ignition interlock device for certain persons convicted of driving under the influence or refusal to submit to a chemical test. (SCS CSHB 19(JUD)(efd am S))

Effective Date: January 1, 2009

Chapter 98 SEARCH AND RESCUE ACTIVITIES

Specifies the officials who may authorize persons to participate in search and rescue training and search and rescue parties. Directs that temporary search and rescue volunteers who suffer injury or death be considered state employees for purposes of workers' compensation coverage if the volunteer is an authorized participant in a training exercise or a search and rescue party. Allows a political subdivision of the state to provide workers' compensation coverage to volunteer search and rescue personnel. (CSHB 320(FIN))

Effective Date: September 14, 2008

Chapter 99 USE OF TELEVISIONS, MONITORS, AND SIMILAR DEVICES IN MOTOR VEHICLES AND ADDING A DEFINITION FOR THE ALASKA UNIFORM VEHICLE CODE

Creates a new crime of driving with a screen device operating if, while a person is driving a motor vehicle, a television, monitor, computer, or similar device is operating in full view of the driver. Provides exceptions for cellular telephones, global positioning system, map, and navigation devices, audio equipment, vehicle information or controls, emergency vehicles, and others. Provides a definition of "physical injury" for the Alaska Uniform Vehicle Code. (SCS CSHB 88(JUD))

Effective Date: September 1, 2008

Chapter 100 HANDLING MATTERS AFTER DEATH; ANATOMICAL GIFTS

Changes the estate property information that must be recited on an affidavit in order for the person entitled to a decedent's property to collect the property by affidavit. Uses the same estate information for determining when a judge may appoint a person to settle certain small estates. Prevents, with certain exceptions, the benefits paid under nonprobate transfer on death provisions in life insurance contracts or certain retirement plans from being subject to the debts of the decedent or the claims of the decedent's creditors. Allows money appropriated to the anatomical gift awareness fund to be spent for fund purposes without further appropriation and states that money appropriated to the fund does not lapse. Replaces the current anatomical gift provisions with the Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act. Identifies who may make a gift and establishes how the gift may be made. Indicates how a gift may be amended or revoked. Describes how a person may indicate a refusal to make a gift.

Indicates which individuals and organizations may receive an anatomical gift and how the gift passes after death. Describes the purposes for which an anatomical gift may be made and used. Describes the rights and duties of procurement organizations, and the rights of donor recipients. Prohibits knowingly selling or buying a body part for transplantation or therapy when removal is intended to occur after death, but allows charges related to the removal, preservation, implantation, disposal, and certain other handling of a body part. Considers a gift valid if executed under this state's laws or those of certain jurisdictions having connections with the individual or the execution. Addresses the situation when the terms of a health care directive and a gift conflict. Requires a coroner, a state medical examiner, and a procurement organization to cooperate to maximize the recovery of anatomical gifts and provides rules to guide the coordination among these persons. Indicates that a gift made under former gift provisions continues in effect under the new provisions until revoked. (SCS CSHB 196(JUD) am S)

Effective Date: September 15, 2008

Chapter 101 MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION: NATIVE CORPORATION LAND EXCHANGES

Exempts from municipal property taxes land acquired from a municipality in exchange for certain land of Native corporations that is itself exempt. Applies the exemption for exchanged land only if it is not developed or made subject to a lease. Makes the exemption retroactive to January 1, 2008. (CSHB 356(CRA))

Effective Date: June 18, 2008; sections 1 and 2 are retroactive to January 1, 2008

Chapter 102 NOXIOUS WEED, INVASIVE PLANT, AND AGRICULTURAL PEST MANAGEMENT AND EDUCATION

Requires the commissioner of natural resources to employ or appoint a statewide coordinator for noxious weed, invasive plant, and agricultural pest management and education. Defines the coordinator's powers and duties. Repeals these requirements effective June 30, 2011. (SCS CSHB 330(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect June 30, 2011; remainder of Act takes effect September 15, 2008

Chapter 103 STATE TOURISM MARKETING CONTRACTS

Reduces the matching funds that a trade association must provide when contracting with the state to plan and execute the state's annual destination tourism marketing campaign. Calculates the matching funds at 30 percent of the state money to be used for the campaign. Limits the amount of state money that may be used for the marketing campaign unless the appropriation that funds the campaign exceeds that

limit. Effective July 1, 2011, restores these requirements to the way they read before amendment by this Act. **(CSHB 147(RLS))**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect July 1, 2011; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 104 BUSINESS LICENSES

Authorizes the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to establish that a business license expires at the same time as a license, certificate, permit, registration, or similar document issued under AS 08, the title dealing with the licensing of persons engaging in businesses and professions. Establishes a \$300 civil fine for failing to have a business license. Reduces the general fee for a business license to \$50. Reduces to \$25 the business license fee for sole proprietors who are 65 years of age or older when they apply for the license or who will reach that age during the year for which the license is issued. **(SCS CSHB 111(FIN))**

Effective Date: October 1, 2009

Chapter 105 STATE LEASE-PURCHASES OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

Permits executive branch agencies, the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska, the legislative council, the legislative budget and audit committee, the office of victims' rights, the office of the ombudsman, and the Supreme Court to enter into lease-purchase agreements for acquisition of equipment or other personal property. Requires that notice be given to certain legislative entities when a lease-purchase agreement exceeds \$100,000 in payments. Directs the office of management and budget to list each lease-purchase agreement entered into by an executive branch agency, together with certain information regarding the purchase, for use in budgeting. **(SCS CSHB 419(FIN))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2008

Chapter 106 CAMPAIGN FUNDRAISING DURING A LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Prohibits a legislator or legislative employee from soliciting or accepting a campaign contribution to be used toward a state or municipal election during a legislative session. Makes exceptions to this prohibition if the campaign contribution is solicited or accepted in a municipality other than where the Legislature is convened and made for that legislator's or legislative employee's own campaign, and the campaign solicitation or acceptance occurs in the 90 days immediately preceding the election in which the legislator or legislative employee is a candidate. **(SCS CSHB 305(JUD))**

Effective Date: June 21, 2008

Chapter 107 PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE GRANT PARTICIPATING SHARES AND SCHOOL BOND DEBT REIMBURSEMENT

Lowers a municipal school district's participating share required for school construction and maintenance grants. Extends to November 2010 school bond debt reimbursement at the 70 percent level for municipal school districts.

(SCS HB 373(FIN))

Effective Date: June 21, 2008

Chapter 108 VETERINARY PRACTICE

Exempts certain persons providing veterinary services from application of the statutes governing veterinary practice and licensing. Establishes a student permit, issued by the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development and approved by the Board of Veterinary Examiners, for certain students of veterinary medicine who are participating in externship programs. Sets out the limitations and requirements of the student permit. **(CSHB 297(RLS))**

Effective Date: September 22, 2008

Chapter 109 ALASKA POLICE STANDARDS COUNCIL

Increases the size and changes the composition of the Alaska Police Standards Council by adding two members, one police officer and one probation, parole, municipal correction, or correctional officer each of whom has been certified for five or more years by the Council. **(SCS CSHB 193(STA))**

Effective Date: June 26, 2008

Chapter 110 BULK FUEL BRIDGE LOAN FUND AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE UNDER THE POWER PROJECT FUND

Establishes the bulk fuel bridge loan fund and program and defines the purposes and uses of each. Authorizes the Alaska Energy Authority to borrow money from the power project fund for the bulk fuel revolving loan fund and to repay money borrowed. Increases the amount that can be loaned to one borrower in a fiscal year from the bulk fuel revolving loan fund. **(SCS CSHB 338(FIN))**

Effective Date: June 26, 2008

Chapter 111 DENTISTRY, DENTAL HYGIENISTS, AND DENTAL ASSISTANTS

Establishes a restorative function license endorsement for qualified dental hygienists and dental assistants that allows a dental hygienist or assistant, under the direct supervision of a dentist, to perform certain restorative work. Allows for certain board

approved collaborative agreements between hygienists and dentists that allow a hygienist to perform various dental operations without the presence of the dentist and in a setting other than the usual place of practice of the licensed dentist. Creates a coronal polishing certificate for qualified dental assistants that allows a dental assistant, under the direct supervision of a dentist, to perform coronal polishing on teeth without calculus. Enumerates the dental operations that may be delegated by a dentist to a dental assistant acting under direct or indirect supervision.

(SCS CSHB 319(HES))

Effective Date: September 23, 2008

Chapter 112 CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FUND

Makes various changes to the crime victim compensation fund. Provides that the program receipts of the fund are not considered part of the unrestricted general fund for appropriations. **(HB 414)**

Effective Date: September 23, 2008

Chapter 113 REGULATION AND OVERSIGHT OF REAL ESTATE PRACTICES

Requires a real estate licensee to carry errors and omissions insurance. Allows the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to regulate the terms and conditions of the required insurance. Allows the real estate commission to solicit bids for and administer a master policy of errors and omissions insurance that may be made available to licensees, and provides that licensees are not required to carry insurance if the commission is unable to make available a master policy. Requires a real estate broker to maintain a place of business in the state. Changes the name of the real estate surety fund to the real estate recovery fund. Requires a person with a claim against the real estate recovery fund to obtain a final judgment, arbitration award, or settlement agreement before filing a claim for an award from the fund. Modifies the procedure for filing a claim against the recovery fund.

(CSHB 357(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 25 takes effect June 27, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect March 1, 2010

Chapter 114 REAL ESTATE COMMISSION

Extends the termination date for the Real Estate Commission to June 30, 2016. **(HB 413)**

Effective Date: June 27, 2008

Chapter 115 HOUSING LOANS FOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS

Extends coverage under a housing loan program of the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation that benefits teachers and registered nurses to other health care professionals who are licensed or certified. Repeals the housing loan program on July 1, 2013. (CSHB 325(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect June 27, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008

Chapter 116 RECREATIONAL LAND USE IMMUNITY

Protects a landowner who records a recreational use easement and allows recreational use without charge. Specifies the nature of the landowner's immunity. Declares that the recreational use immunity does not protect a landowner from liability based on intentional, reckless, or grossly negligent conduct, and does not affect liability releases between a recreational user and a landowner. Relates that use for recreational activity without charge may not form the basis for a claim of adverse possession, prescriptive easements, or similar claims. (SCS HB 25(JUD) am S)

Effective Date: June 27, 2008

Chapter 117 PRE-ELEMENTARY PROGRAMS INCLUDED IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Redefines an elementary school to include specified pre-elementary programs and students. (CSHB 332(FIN)(title am))

Effective Date: October 21, 2008

Chapter 118 DRIVER'S LICENSES AND ALCOHOL AND DRUG AWARENESS TESTING

Provides that a driver's license issued to a person under 21 years of age expires when the person reaches 21 years of age. Requires that every applicant for a new driver's license after expiration of the person's license on reaching 21 years of age must pass a test on alcohol and drug awareness, safety, and laws. (CSHB 75(STA))

Effective Date: October 21, 2008

FOURTH SPECIAL SESSION

Chapter 1 SUPPLEMENTAL AND CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS

Makes supplemental appropriations, capital appropriations, appropriations to capitalize funds, and other appropriations. (SCS CSHB 4001(FIN))

Effective Date: August 26, 2008; section 5(d) is conditional; section 2(a) is retroactive to June 30, 2008

Chapter 2 ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Increases the amount a borrower may receive under the bulk fuel bridge loan program and bulk fuel revolving loan program. Temporarily amends the parameters for a community to be eligible to receive power cost equalization. Implements a one-time Alaska resource rebate payment to be added to the 2008 permanent fund dividend. Suspends the motor fuel tax for a period of one year. Eliminates authority to make retroactive certain provisions of the state heating assistance program established in ch. 31, SLA 2008. (HCS CSSB 4002(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect October 1, 2008; section 3 takes effect June 30, 2009; remainder of Act takes effect August 26, 2008

Chapter 3 APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF A LICENSE UNDER THE ALASKA GASLINE INDUCEMENT ACT

Authorizes the commissioner of revenue and the commissioner of natural resources to issue a license under the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act (AS 43.90) to Trans Canada Alaska Company, LLC and Foothills Pipe Lines Ltd., jointly, thereby expressing the legislative approval of the license that is required under AS 43.90.190. (HB 3001(efd fld))

Effective Date: November 25, 2008

Chapter 11 **SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes supplemental, capital appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations, including appropriations to implement salary and benefit adjustments for state officers and employees. Makes an appropriation to the senior benefit payment program, amends certain appropriations, ratifies certain expenditures, and makes appropriations to capitalize funds. By item veto, the Governor eliminated certain grants to named recipients, grants to municipalities, and other appropriations to departments. **(HCS CSSB 256(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 21(d) and 32 are conditional; sections 1, 16 - 20, 21(a), 21(b), 21(d), and 34 take effect April 4, 2008; section 21(c) takes effect June 30, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect April 13, 2008

Chapter 27 **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for state fiscal year 2009 for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, for certain programs, capitalizes funds, and makes appropriations under art. IX, sec 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska. **(CCS HB 310)**

Effective Date: Sections 11(a) and 30 take effect June 30, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008; those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific year 2008 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2008, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2008, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 29 **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, and appropriations to capitalize funds. Makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c) of the state constitution from the constitutional budget reserve fund. **(HCS CSSB 221(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: Sections 1, 4, 7, 10, 29 - 32, 33(a), 33(d), 33(e), 36(b), 36(c), 36(d), 36(e), 36(h), 42(d), 42(e), 42(f), 60(d), 61(a), 63(c), 63(d), 67(c), 68, 72(b), 73, and 76 take effect May 23, 2008; sections 33(b), 33(c), 34, 36(f), 39(a), 40, 41, 42(a), 42(b), 42(c), 43 - 57, 63(b), 65, 66(c), 67(b), 69, 70, and 72(a) take effect June 30, 2008; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2008; section 33(a) is retroactive to March 10, 2008; section 42(d) is retroactive to January 1, 2008; certain appropriations in sections 10, 13, 22, 25, 35, 58, 61(b), 61(c), 66(g), and 66(i) are conditional

Transfers certain permit functions relating to the protection of anadromous fish habitat in rivers, lakes, and streams and other matters relating to the protection of anadromous fish from the deputy commissioner of natural resources to the Department of Fish and Game. Transfers duties related to forestry and forest practices from the state forester in the division of forestry, Department of Natural Resources, to the commissioner of natural resources. Makes conforming amendments necessary due to transfer of duties and functions. **(EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 114)**
