**SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER**

**Chapter 1 FILING OF INFORMATION WITH, AND RELATING TO INFORMATION FILED WITH, THE ALASKA PUBLIC OFFICES COMMISSION**

Exempts certain candidates from filing information electronically with the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Requires the commission to accept certain information submitted electronically even though it is not filed on a form prescribed by the commission. Provides when and how certain information filed with the commission will be made open to public inspection. Prohibits the commission from changing the manner or format in which candidates must file reports during a campaign period. Creates a temporary exception to electronic filing requirements applicable to candidates and provides that certain candidates are not subject to civil penalties for not filing certain reports on forms prescribed by the commission. **(CCS HB 311)**

Effective Date: February 21, 2012; sections 1, 2, 4, and 5 are retroactive to December 1, 2011

**Chapter 2 SPECIAL REQUEST REGISTRATION PLATES**

Authorizes the Department of Administration to issue, and establishes fees for, the following special request registration plates for motor vehicles: "In God We Trust" United States flag plates, Lao veteran plates, National Rifle Association plates, breast cancer awareness plates, "Choose Life" plates, and "Pro-Family, Pro-Choice" plates. **(CCS HB 19)**

Effective Date: March 8, 2012

**Chapter 3 RETURN OF PROPERTY TO CRIME VICTIMS**

Provides a procedure for a crime victim to request the return of property belonging to the crime victim from a law enforcement agency. Authorizes the victims' advocate to request the return of property on behalf of a crime victim. **(CSSB 30(2d JUD))**

Effective Date: June 19, 2012

**Chapter 4 POSTING OF NOTICES AT UNITED STATES POST OFFICES**

To comply with a federal requirement that only governmental notices may be posted at U.S. Post Offices, eliminates requirements of posting at U.S. Post Offices for notices for changes to controlled livestock districts, personal property lien sales, consignee and bailee lien sales, and tax lien sales. **(HB 291)**

Effective Date: March 22, 2012



**Chapter 11** **NAMING A BYPASS ROAD AND CERTAIN BRIDGES AND AIRPORTS**

Naming the state-owned Nome Bypass Road Greg Kruschek Avenue; the bridge over the Eyak River at mile 5.7 of the Copper River Highway, the Marie Smith Jones Bridge; the Scott Glacier No. 1 bridge at mile 7.5 of the Copper River Highway, the Michael Dean Banta Bridge; the Scott Glacier No. 3 bridge at mile 8.1 of the Copper River Highway, the Warren Allen Paulsen Bridge; the Scott Glacier No. 5 bridge at mile 9.2 of the Copper River Highway, the David Alen Lape Bridge; the Scott Glacier No. 7 bridge at mile 9.7 of the Copper River Highway, the David Henry Elisovsky Bridge; the Scott Glacier No. 9 bridge at mile 10.4 of the Copper River Highway, the Leonard F. Olson Bridge; the Scott Glacier No. 11 bridge at mile 11 of the Copper River Highway, the Norman D. Osborne Bridge; the Sheridan Glacier East Channel bridge at mile 16.3 of the Copper River Highway, the Patrick A. Burchett Bridge; the Flag Point West bridge at mile 26.7 of the Copper River Highway, the John W. Jones Bridge; the Flag Point East bridge at mile 26.9 of the Copper River Highway, the W. H. Mumby Bridge; the Round Island bridge at mile 27.6 of the Copper River Highway, the Matthew Anderson Bridge; bridge number 334 at mile 34.6 of the Copper River Highway, the Lucian Platt Bridge; bridge number 339 at mile 36.2 of the Copper River Highway, the Steve Green Bridge; bridge number 342 at mile 37 of the Copper River Highway, the William M. Jones Bridge; bridge number 345 at mile 37.9 of the Copper River Highway, the James Bennett Bridge; the state-owned airport at Minto, the Minto-Al Wright Airport; the state-owned airport at Koyukuk, the Koyukuk Station Veterans' Airport; the bridge over Falls Creek at mile 10.4 of the Mitkof Highway, the Harry Kito Bridge; and the state-owned airport at Klawock, the Klawock-Frank Peratrovich Airport. (SCS CSHB 246(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: July 30, 2012

**Chapter 12** **RENEWABLE ENERGY GRANT FUND AND RECOMMENDATION PROGRAM**

Adds two members to the renewable energy grant fund and recommendation program advisory committee, one member from the house of representatives and one member from the senate. Extends the termination of the renewable energy grant fund and recommendation program to June 30, 2023. States that it is the intent of the legislature to, for the next ten years, appropriate \$50,000,000 each year to the renewable energy grant fund. (SCS CSHB 250(FIN))

Effective Date: May 3, 2012

**Chapter 13** **CONSTRUCTION WITH NATURALLY OCCURRING ASBESTOS**

Provides immunity from damages resulting from the use of gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos to landowners within a designated use area, to contractors for projects in compliance with site-specific use, monitoring,

and mitigation plans and within a designated use area, and to the state for performance of administrative duties related to construction projects using gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos. Defines the baseline for the presence of naturally occurring asbestos as 0.25 percent by mass. Allows the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to designate areas in which contractors using gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos may receive immunity. Sets out the application requirements for a site-specific use plan. Requires that gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos that is used in a project be buried or sealed to prevent asbestos fibers from becoming airborne or transferred. Directs the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to develop a monitoring and mitigation plan for construction projects that will use gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos. Requires the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to determine that a project is economically unreasonable to undertake with gravel or other aggregate material free from naturally occurring asbestos before approving a site-specific use plan. Instructs the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to develop standards related to the use of gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos. Authorizes the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to designate, on a temporary basis, a limited number of areas in which landowners and contractors using gravel or other aggregate material containing naturally occurring asbestos may receive immunity.

**(SCS CSHB 258(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 5, 2012

**Chapter 14 CRIME OF TEXTING WHILE DRIVING**

Provides clarification by the legislature that the use of cellular telephones, computers or personal data assistants, or any similar means for texting or communicating has been illegal in Alaska since AS 28.35.161 was enacted. Amends the existing offense of driving while a screen device is operating to clarify that this offense includes driving while texting or communicating on a computer. Clarifies the existing non-applicability section to allow the use of portable cellular telephones or data assistants for "voice" communication, and for equipment installed in an emergency vehicle used to respond to a health, safety, or criminal matter. **(CSHB 255(JUD))**

Effective Date: May 11, 2012

**Chapter 15 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the state fiscal year 2013 for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, amends appropriations and makes reappropriations. Appropriates \$6,855,991,600 from the general fund and other funds in addition to unspecified amounts from program receipts, federal receipts, insurance claim settlements and other sources. **(CCS HB 284)**

Effective Date: Section 26(f) takes effect December 1, 2012; sections 13(h), 14, 26(e), 27(d), 30, 32(a), 33, and 34 of this Act and the fiscal note for SB 182 as described in section 2 of this Act take effect June 30, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012; the appropriation made in section 13(i)(1) and those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2012 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2012, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2012, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

**Chapter 16 MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the state fiscal year 2013 for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program.  
**(CCS HB 285)**

Effective Date July 1, 2012

**Chapter 17 CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for capital projects, including \$2,777,480,061 for state and local capital projects. Amends prior appropriations and reappropriates money from prior appropriations for capital projects and other purposes. Makes supplemental appropriations for the operation of state government for fiscal year 2012. Capitalizes funds. Transfers \$60,000,000 from the general fund to the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act reimbursement fund. Transfers the unexpended and unobligated balance of the operating general fund on June 30, 2012, to the statutory budget reserve fund. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations.  
**(HSC CSSB 160(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: The appropriation made in section 26(a) is conditional; sections 7, 10, 24(b), 28(a), 28(c), 28(d), 34(b), and 45 take effect May 15, 2012; sections 19, 20, 22(a), 22(b), 24(a), 25, 26(b), 27, 28(b), 28(e), 29 - 32, 34(a), 34(c), 34(d), 34(e), 34(f), 35 - 44, 46, and 47(c) take effect June 30, 2012; sections 33 and 48 take effect May 15, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012; section 33 is retroactive to July 1, 2011

**Chapter 18 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS**

If ratified by a majority of qualified voters, authorizes the issuance of \$453,499,200 in state general obligation bonds. Establishes the State Transportation Project Fund

to which the bond proceeds shall be credited. Appropriates for certain named projects the sum of \$195,400,000 to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development, and the sum of \$254,500,000 to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. Appropriates \$3,599,200 to the State Bond Committee to pay bond expenses. Provides for lapse, redemption, and reimbursement of unexpended and unobligated balances of the appropriations. (SCS CSHB 286(FIN))

Effective Date: May 15, 2012

**Chapter 19 PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING AND PROGRAMS**

Increases the amount of pupil transportation funding, adjusted annually for a three year period, to schools that serve students in grades kindergarten through 12. Requires the Department of Education and Early Development to oversee and support local pupil transportation bidding and contracts. Increases the vocational funding adjustment for schools and makes middle schools eligible for the funding. Decreases the mill rate for local contributions to public school funding. Establishes a temporary parents as teachers program for parents of children under five years of age. (HCS CSSB 182(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 1 takes effect June 30, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012

**Chapter 20 CREATION OF MILITARY FACILITY ZONES TO FACILITATE PROJECTS NEAR MILITARY FACILITIES**

Establishes an application procedure and criteria the adjutant general of the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs shall apply when designating military facility zones adjacent to military facilities and expanding existing military facility zones. Adds infrastructure projects in a military facility zone to the list of projects the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority may own or finance. Grants priority consideration for financial assistance to projects in a military facility zone, grants the adjutant general authority to adopt regulations implementing the new chapter that governs military facility zones, grants municipalities authority to create public corporations to administer military facility zones, and requires that notice of an application to create a military facility zone appear on the Alaska Online Public Notice System. (HB 316 am S)

Effective Date: Section 4 takes effect May 17, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012

**Chapter 21 REVERSION OF RAILROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY**

Allows land in the Eielson Spur Line railroad right-of-way to revert to abutting landowners if the State of Alaska and the Alaska Railroad Corporation make no use

of the land for 18 continuous years, and the governor delivers the abutting landowners a notice with a legal description of the land. Upon request after reversion, the State of Alaska and the Alaska Railroad Corporation shall convey by quitclaim all of their rights, title, and interests in the right-of-way to the abutting landowners. If more than one landowner abuts a section of the right-of-way, each landowner's property shall be extended to the centerline of the right-of-way. (CSHB 146(RES))

Effective Date: May 17, 2012

**Chapter 22 UNFAIR TRADE PRACTICES**

Amends the Alaska Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Act to delete a general exemption for transactions regulated under federal law. Clarifies that the Act's exemption provision does not apply to transactions listed as unlawful acts or practices under AS 45.50.471(b). (HB 274)

Effective Date: August 15, 2012

**Chapter 23 TERMINATION DATES FOR VARIOUS BOARDS**

Extends the termination dates of the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers, Board of Dental Examiners, and Board of Nursing to June 30, 2019, extends the termination date of the Big Game Commercial Services Board to June 30, 2016, extends the termination date of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to June 30, 2015, and extends the termination date of the Alaska Seismic Hazards Safety Commission to June 30, 2014. (SCS CSHB 279(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: May 18, 2012; sections 1, 2, 4, 5, and 7 are retroactive to June 30, 2011

**Chapter 24 STATE SUPPORTED IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM**

Establishes a three year child and adult immunization program in the Department of Health and Social Services to distribute specified vaccines to state residents and providers. (CSHB 310(FIN))

Effective Date: May 23, 2012

**Chapter 25 LOAN REPAYMENT AND EMPLOYMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM**

Establishes a loan repayment and direct incentive payment program in the Department of Health and Social Services for specified health professionals employed in shortage areas in the state. (CSHB 78(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 2 and 3 are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect May 23, 2012

**Chapter 26** **APPROVING AN INTERIM CLASSIFICATION BY THE COMMISSIONER OF NATURAL RESOURCES CLOSING CERTAIN LAND WITHIN THE GLACIER CREEK AND WINNER CREEK DRAINAGES TO NEW MINERAL ENTRY**

Pursuant to the requirement of legislative approval of a closure of a state-owned mineral estate to new mineral entry by the commissioner of natural resources, the Act approved the closure of described land in the Glacier Creek and Winner Creek drainages to new mineral entry. (CSHB 295(RES))

Effective Date: May 23, 2012

**Chapter 27** **THE ALASKA LAND ACT, DISPOSAL OF STATE LAND AND MATERIALS, MINING PRODUCTION ROYALTIES, AND CONVEYING CERTAIN LAND RELATED TO A COMMERCIAL LOADING FACILITY TO THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU**

Amends the Alaska Land Act to provide for sale of state land by sealed bid in addition to other existing methods. Raises the value limit for land that the director may negotiate a lease for a period not to exceed 10 years without competitive bidding. Allows the director to cancel a competitive auction and negotiate a lease if only one person expresses interest in bidding. Modifies the criteria for lease renewal. Separates the regulation of sales of materials from sales of timber. Clarifies the method for selling and valuing materials owned by the state. Allows miners to file a mining lease tax on a calendar or fiscal year. Allows for the division to renew a submerged mining lease for up to 20 years. Sets out the method for valuing and selling materials owned by the state. Allows negotiated sales and personal use of materials without competitive procedures under certain conditions. Provides for negotiated sales and disposal of materials to municipalities, state and federal agencies, public utilities, permit holders, and lessees under certain conditions. Allows the department to convey materials as needed for certain flood control purposes. Revises public notice statutes relating to the disposal of state property. Provides for future modification of notice requirements. Defines "materials," and authorizes the transfer of a parcel of land to the City and Borough of Juneau for mitigation requirements relating to a commercial loading facility. (SCS CSHB 361(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 23 takes effect July 1, 2017; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012

**Chapter 28** **EXEMPTING QUARRY ROCK, SAND AND GRAVEL, AND MARKETABLE EARTH MINING OPERATIONS FROM THE MINING LICENSE TAX**

Excludes marketable earth, quarry rock, and sand and gravel from the definition of mining for the purposes of the mining license tax (AS 43.65). (CSHB 298(FIN))

Effective Date: May 23, 2012; sections 1 and 2 are retroactive to January 1, 2012

**Chapter 29** **RELATING TO THE AMENDMENT OF A DECLARATION THAT CREATES A COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY**

Provides for the amendment of time limits and development rights in a declaration creating a common interest community. (CSHB 269(JUD))

Effective Date: August 20, 2012

**Chapter 30** **EXTENDING THE LICENSING OF SPORT FISHING OPERATORS AND SPORT FISHING GUIDES**

Extends the termination date of the licensing statutes for sport fishing operators and sport fishing guides to January 1, 2015. (HCS CSSB 91(FIN))

Effective Date: May 23, 2012

**Chapter 31** **BOATING SAFETY STATUTES**

Amends the boating safety enforcement statutes to prevent an agreement with the federal government that cedes state authority for management of state waterways to the federal government. Excludes federal government employees from the class of peace officers who may enforce the boating safety statutes. Removes the termination date for the boating safety statutes so that the statutes will only be repealed if the state does not receive federal funding for a statewide boating and safety education program. (SCS CSHB 301(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 2 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect May 23, 2012

**Chapter 32** **ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION REVIEW**

Allows the Legislative Affairs attorney who reviews regulations that implement newly enacted legislation to consult with the prime sponsor of the newly enacted legislation if the prime sponsor is still a member of the legislature. Allows the reviewing attorney to notify the sponsor of recently enacted legislation or the requester of a review (in addition to notifying the Department of Law, the state agency, the Administrative Regulations Review Committee, the Speaker of the House, and the President of the Senate) if regulations fail to meet the statutory standards after review under AS 24.20.105. Also requires the reviewing attorney to notify the entity that requested a review when the regulations meet the statutory standards. (HB 169)

Effective Date: May 24, 2012

**Chapter 33**    **MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATEWIDE SUICIDE PREVENTION COUNCIL**  
Adds a seventeenth member to the Statewide Suicide Prevention Council who is an active, retired, or reserve member of the armed forces of the United States or a person who actively provides a health care service to active, discharged, or retired military personnel. Amends the qualifications of the council's "youth" member.  
**(CSHB 21(FIN))**

Effective Date:            August 21, 2012

**Chapter 34**    **SUICIDE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION TRAINING**  
Requires school districts and the Department of Education and Early Development to provide suicide awareness and prevention training annually for four years to teachers, administrators, counselors, and specialists employed by the district or department. Provides for civil immunity from damages that result from an act or omission in providing suicide awareness and prevention training, unless intentional misconduct with complete disregard for the safety or property of others was involved.  
**(HCS SB 137(FIN))**

Effective Date:            August 21, 2012

**Chapter 35**    **ALASKA RAILROAD LEASES**  
Extends the length of time the Alaska Railroad Corporation may lease land without reserving the right to terminate the lease from 55 years to 95 years. **(HB 314)**

Effective Date:            May 24, 2012

**Chapter 36**    **ALASKA COMMUNITY AND PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY BOARD**  
Establishes the Alaska Community and Public Transportation Advisory Board. The board consists of 13 members appointed by the governor. The board is to prepare a strategic plan that includes the mission, objectives, initiatives, and performance goals for coordinated community and public transportation in the state. The board will also analyze community and public transportation services in the state and make recommendations for improved agency coordination and combining of services to achieve cost savings in the funding and delivery of community and public transportation services. The board is required to analyze the use of alternative fuels, including compressed natural gas, liquefied natural gas, propane, and biodiesel in community and public transportation vehicle fleets and make recommendations for the use of alternative fuel vehicles where cost effective.  
**(SCS CSHB 131(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date:            Section 2 takes effect January 1, 2017; remainder of Act takes effect May 25, 2012

**Chapter 37**    **REAL ESTATE COMMISSION AND REAL ESTATE LICENSEES**

Authorizes the Real Estate Commission to issue a temporary permit to a licensee for the purpose of securing proper administration, temporarily managing, or concluding the affairs of the real estate business of a broker if an investigation produces substantial evidence that the broker has misappropriated trust funds, the broker's license is suspended, or the broker becomes incapacitated. Clarifies language relating to licensed assistants and prohibits a licensed assistant from working for more than one broker. Allows a real estate licensee to share the licensee's commission with a charitable organization and advertise the licensee's intent to make the donation. **(2d CSHB 267(JUD))**

Effective Date:            July 1, 2012

**Chapter 38**    **RECORDS DISCLOSURE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

Adds specified agencies to the list of recipients of otherwise confidential records involving children to which the Department of Health and Social Services may disclose the records. Modifies public disclosure standards and exceptions for records involving a minor who has been adjudicated as delinquent. **(CSHB 343(JUD) am)**

Effective Date:            Section 5 takes effect May 25, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012

**Chapter 39**    **EXAMINATION OF REAL ESTATE TITLE, TITLE INSURANCE LIMITED PRODUCERS, AND REAL ESTATE TRANSFER FEE COVENANTS**

Requires that title insurance research and examination of the title must be performed by a licensed title insurance limited producer; requires a title insurance limited producer to be a resident of the state. Prohibits a grantor in a real estate conveyance from requiring a subsequent seller to pay a transfer fee. **(HCS CSSB 122(L&C))**

Effective Date:            May 25, 2012

**Chapter 40**    **ADOPTION OF RESUSCITATION PROTOCOL DOCUMENTS**

Allows the Department of Health and Social Services to adopt future amended versions of a document relating to a resuscitation protocol when the department adopts the document by reference by regulation and when the document is published, compiled, or prepared based on the recommendations from the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation. **(SB 202)**

Effective Date:            August 22, 2012

**Chapter 41**    **PROCEDURE FOR REMOVAL OR SUSPENSION OF A MEMBER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA BOARD OF REGENTS**

Establishes a procedure, including notice and an opportunity for a hearing, for the governor to suspend or remove for cause a member of the University of Alaska Board of Regents. (SCS CSHB 6(JUD))

Effective Date:            August 22, 2012

**Chapter 42**    **ADOPTION, AMENDMENT, AND REPEAL OF REGULATIONS: DEADLINES AND BRIEF DESCRIPTIONS**

Requires state departments to include deadlines for the adoption, amendment, or repeal of regulations in fiscal notes for bills when the bills direct or will result in a state agency adopting, amending, or repealing regulations. Establishes the procedure for an agency to follow when it cannot meet the deadline. Exempts most boards and commissions from these requirements. Requires state agencies to accompany their notices about the proposed adoption, amendment, or repeal of regulations with a brief description of the changes to be made by the proposed action. To the extent practicable, requires the brief description to be in clear, easily readable language that a person without a legal background can understand. Does not allow a person to bring a court action for failure of the brief description to comply with the requirements relating to the description of the changes or its clarity and readability. Exempts the Regulatory Commission of Alaska, the Board of Fisheries, and the Board of Game from the notice requirement. (SCS CSHB 216(STA))

Effective Date:            July 1, 2012

**Chapter 43**    **SELLING OR PROVIDING NICOTINE TO MINORS**

Provides that it is a violation punishable by a fine of not less than \$300 to sell or give a product containing nicotine to a person under 19 years of age, unless certain exceptions apply. (CSHB 224(FIN) am)

Effective Date:            August 22, 2012

**Chapter 44**    **CONTRIBUTIONS IN STATE ELECTION CAMPAIGNS**

Provides how campaign contributions that are unused at the end of the term of office following the campaign for which the contributions were received must be disposed of by candidates for the state legislature and municipal office. Eliminates public office expense term account reserves for state legislators and provides how funds in existing accounts must be transferred. Clarifies that an opportunity to participate in a candidate forum that is provided without compensation to a candidate is not a "contribution" to that candidate. (CSHB 333(STA) am S)

Effective Date:            August 22, 2012

**Chapter 45**    **LEGISLATIVE ETHICS ACT**

Clarifies that the Legislative Ethics Act allows legislators and legislative employees to accept certain gifts. Allows legislators and legislative employees who are representing persons in an administrative hearing to contact hearing officers for the purpose of influencing the outcome of the hearing in certain instances. Requires the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics to maintain a public record of certain ethics disclosures. Prohibits public members of the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics from disclosing confidential information without authorization. Clarifies Legislative Ethics Act disclosure requirements for tickets to, or gifts in connection with, charity events. Changes certain Legislative Ethics Act disclosure deadlines. Allows the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics to approve or deny requests for waivers of Legislative Ethics Act disclosure requirements, on a case-by-case basis. Makes certain provisions of the Legislative Ethics Act applicable to certain legislative employees, volunteers, and interns. Establishes a seat for an alternate public member on the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics. Changes the requirements for committee participation by alternate members of the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics. **(HCS CSSB 89(JUD))**

**Chapter 46**    **POWER PROJECT FUND AND BULK FUEL REVOLVING LOAN FUND**

Moves the Bulk Fuel Revolving Loan Fund (BFRLF) from the Alaska Energy Authority to the Division of Community and Regional Affairs, Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development. Removes the BFRLF from the list of entities to which the Alaska Energy Authority may make loans from the power project fund. Makes an entity maintaining community facilities or infrastructure eligible for a bulk fuel loan, and removes the requirement for a written endorsement from the governing body of each community benefitting from a loan. Provides for technical assistance for borrowers applying for a bulk fuel loan. Establishes the bulk fuel loan account and the bulk fuel bridge account as separate accounts within the BFRLF. Establishes interest rates for the bulk fuel loans and bulk fuel bridge loans. **(CSHB 196(FIN))**

**Chapter 47**    **LOANS FOR THE PURCHASE OF COMMERCIAL FISHING ENTRY PERMITS**

Extends the limit on the total of balances outstanding on loans made under the Commercial Fishing Loan Act. Permits a subsequent loan to be made to a borrower for the purchase of an entry permit. **(CSHB 261(FIN))**

Effective Date:            July 1, 2012

**Chapter 48** **ALASKA NATIVE LANGUAGE COUNCIL**

Establishes the Alaska Native Language Preservation and Advisory Council in the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development for the purpose of advising the governor and legislature on programs, policies, and projects for the preservation, restoration, and revitalization of Alaska Native languages in the state. **(HCS CSSB 130(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 26, 2012

**Chapter 49** **STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES**

Requires clearance by an athletic trainer or other qualified person before a student who was removed from a practice or game because of a suspected concussion may return to the practice or game. Allows a student in an alternative education program for grades nine through 12 to participate in an interscholastic activity program at a public school if the student would be eligible to attend the school based on residence, or the student shows good cause for participation at another school and the governing body of that school approves. Requires the student to meet eligibility requirements of the school, school district, and statewide interscholastic activities governing body; provide documentation and records; and claim the same school for interscholastic activities purposes during the school year. **(HCS CSSB 119(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 1 takes effect May 30, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013

**Chapter 50** **VEHICLE TRANSACTIONS**

Changes advertising requirements for motor vehicle dealers covering the use of the manufacturer's suggested retail price, dealer fees and costs included in the advertised price, price comparisons, the advertisement of specific motor vehicles, and offers of free merchandise, gifts, and services. Requires motor vehicle dealers to get signed background information on used vehicles. Requires motor vehicle dealers to hold certain documentation for motor vehicles before entering into sales contracts. Changes requirements related to financing arrangements for motor vehicle sales, including the delivery of motor vehicles before financing approval and the parties' obligations when financing is not approved. Changes the items required to be contained in applications for motor vehicle service contracts. **(SB 125)**

Effective Date: August 27, 2012

**Chapter 51** **FILM PRODUCTION TAX CREDITS AND INCENTIVES; LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS STORAGE FACILITIES; OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION TAX ON NEW PRODUCTION AND CREDIT FOR EXPLORATION WELLS; INCOME TAX EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN SMALL CORPORATIONS**

Extends and amends the film production tax credit program, establishes the Film Incentive Review Commission, makes changes relating to the administration and duties of the film office, and establishes a film production promotion program. Provides a tax credit against the income tax on corporations or a payment to persons not subject to the income tax on corporations for certain liquefied natural gas storage facilities and authorizes an exemption from rental payments on state land leased for those facilities. Authorizes the Department of Revenue to purchase tax credits allowed for liquefied natural gas facilities. Provides for the regulation of liquefied natural gas storage facilities by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska and requires cost savings from tax credits and rental exemptions to be reflected in rates. Requires the repayment of the tax credit or payment if the liquefied natural gas storage facility prematurely ceases commercial operation. Makes certain qualified small business corporations exempt from the income tax on corporations until July 1, 2023. Provides for an oil and gas production tax limit of four percent of gross value at the point of production for commercial production of oil or gas outside of Cook Inlet and south of 68 degrees North latitude that commences after December 31, 2012, and before January 1, 2022. Provides for the monthly installment of oil and gas production taxes that take into consideration the tax rate limit on certain new oil and gas production. Provides a new transferable tax credit for drilling the first four exploration wells in the state that are located within certain defined areas of the state, and for the first four seismic exploration projects in the state that occur within those defined areas. Limits the credit for an exploration well to no more than two wells in a defined area, and limits the credit for seismic exploration projects to not more than one in a single defined area. Limits the total number of credits available for certain exploration wells to four and for certain seismic exploration projects to four. **(HCS CSSB 23(RLS) am H)**

Effective Date: Sections 31 and 32 are conditional; section 33 takes effect January 1, 2022; sections 1, 20 - 30, and 34 - 39 take effect July 1, 2013; sections 6 and 7 take effect July 1, 2012; section 8 takes effect July 1, 2023; sections 10 - 15, 18, and 19 take effect January 1, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect May 31, 2012

**Chapter 52** **HIGHER PRICES FOR CERTAIN PRESCRIPTION DRUGS; REINSURANCE PROGRAM FOR STATE HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM FOR RESIDENTS WHO ARE HIGH RISK**

Allows a health care insurer that provides coverage for drugs in unique categories or specialty tiers to impose cost sharing, deductibles, or copayment terms that exceed the cost sharing, deductibles, or copayments of nonpreferred brand drugs or the drug's

equivalent if the insurer notifies the insured of the increase at least 90 days before the terms apply. Authorizes the division of insurance to establish a reinsurance program for the state health insurance high risk insurance program. (CSHB 218(L&C) am S)

Effective Date: January 1, 2013

**Chapter 53 RELATING TO DENTAL HYGIENISTS, DENTISTS, DENTAL ASSISTANTS, DENTAL HYGIENE, AND DENTISTRY**

Removes the examination requirements for dental hygienists. Removes the requirement of registration for dental hygienists, so that a license is all that is required. Sets out the requirements to receive a dental hygienist license. Revises the requirement to obtain a license by credentials so that an applicant must meet the general license requirements, submit proof of continuing competence, and be currently licensed to practice dental hygiene in another state. Amends the list of procedures that a dental hygienists may perform. Allows the board to impose a civil fine not to exceed \$25,000 for each violation of the dental hygiene statutes or regulations. Updates references to dental hygienists employed by an Indian health program. Requires the president of the board of dental examiners to be a licensed dentist or dental hygienist. Changes references from the American Association of Dental Examiners to the American Association of Dental Boards. Authorizes the board of dental examiners to employ an investigator. Removes the requirement that a dentist have a certificate of registration. Allows the board to interview an applicant for a license and to waive the examination requirement for applicants under certain circumstances. Requires the board to interview a person applying for a license without examination. Repeals the statutes relating to licenses to perform acupuncture in the practice of dentistry and specialist licenses. Allows a person enrolled in a program or course of study to perform dental assisting procedures under certain conditions. Exempts dentists employed by an Indian health program from the license requirements. Prevents anyone other than a licensee from owning, operating, or maintaining a dental practice, office, or clinic, with some exceptions. (HCS CSSB 92(FIN))

Effective Date: August 29, 2012

**Chapter 54 MITIGATING FACTOR AT SENTENCING**

Amends AS 12.55.155(d) to provide a mitigating factor at sentencing for a defendant who committed an offense while suffering from a condition diagnosed as a fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, in all felony cases except crimes against a person under AS 11.41, or in the case of arson in the first degree under AS 11.46.400. (CSSB 151(JUD))

Effective Date: September 19, 2012

**Chapter 55 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD**

Moves the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board from the Department of Public Safety to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development. Amends the peace officer powers of the director of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and persons employed by the director by providing that unless authorized by a search warrant, the director and persons employed by the director may not use metal keys, magnetic card keys, or identification cards to access private clubs.

**(CSHB 125(L&C)(efd am))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2012

**Chapter 56 PERMITTING OF AQUATIC GEODUCK FARMS AND ALLOWING CERTAIN GEODUCK SEED TRANSFERS**

Provides that an aquatic farm permit will not be denied on the basis of an absence of wild geoduck stock within the farm's management area. Provides that if a permit is issued for an aquatic farm in such an area, the permit may not allow culturing of geoducks in the intertidal habitat or environment. Permits a certified hatchery to transfer geoduck seed to an aquatic farm in a management area contiguous to the Gulf of Alaska. **(HB 60)**

Effective Date: September 4, 2012

**Chapter 57 CLASSIFYING CATHINONE AND SIMILAR SYNTHETIC SUBSTANCES AS CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES**

Classifies cathinone and certain similar synthetic substances as Schedule IIA controlled substances and provides penalties related to those substances.

**(CSSB 140(JUD))**

Effective Date: June 7, 2012

**Chapter 58 COMMERCIAL FISHING, CHARTER FISHING, MARICULTURE, AND BUSINESS LOANS AND LOAN FUNDS**

Amends the terms of loans made under the state Commercial Fishing Loan Act. Establishes the community quota entity revolving loan fund, the commercial charter fisheries revolving loan fund, the mariculture revolving loan fund, and the Alaska microloan revolving loan fund. Provides for the administration of these newly established loan funds and the purposes, terms, and limitations of each loan fund. Repeals the community quota revolving loan fund established by the Act after a period of five years. **(SCS CSHB 121(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 3, 6, 8, 11, and 14 take effect June 30, 2017; remainder of Act takes effect June 7, 2012

**Chapter 59**    **PROCEDURES AND JURISDICTION FOR CHILDREN IN STATE CUSTODY**

Changes procedures of the Department of Health and Social Services for making child placement and custody decisions. Modifies the jurisdiction of the department and courts for extending, resuming, and releasing from state custody a child who is or was in state custody. (HCS CSSSSB 82(HSS))

Effective Date:            September 9, 2012

**Chapter 60**    **ENERGY TRANSMISSION AND SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT**

Creates an energy development program in the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) for projects for distribution or storage of refined petroleum products; transmission, generation, conservation, storage, or distribution of heat or electricity; and liquefaction, regasification, distribution, storage, or use of natural gas (excluding a natural gas pipeline project for transporting natural gas from the North Slope or Cook Inlet to market). Establishes the sustainable energy transmission and supply development fund for financing projects under the new program. Creates an exception for qualified energy development to the \$20,000,000 limit on AIDEA loan participation purchased with assets of the enterprise development account, excepts financing for improvements in energy efficiency from the requirement that 10 percent of the principal amount of a loan be retained by the loan originator, provides for waiver of AS 44.88.155 requirements for qualified energy development, and allows a 50-year loan term for qualified energy development. Requires the authority to adopt regulations to govern interest rates for loans purchased with bonds secured by the new fund, and applies AIDEA's existing interest rate provisions to financing under the new program. Establishes the powers and duties of AIDEA in relation to the new program and sets limits on the amount of a loan guarantee and the term of financing for qualified development projects. (HCS CSSSSB 25(L&C))

Effective Date:            September 10, 2012

**Chapter 61**    **NEW MARKETS TAX CREDIT ASSISTANCE GUARANTEE AND LOAN PROGRAM, ALASKA ENERGY AUTHORITY LOAN AUTHORIZATION, AND EXTENSION OF MUNICIPAL TAX EXEMPTIONS**

Allows the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA) to use money and other assets of the enterprise development account to fund new markets tax credit assistance guarantees or loans leveraged by tax credits under 26 U.S.C. 45D. Allows AIDEA to guarantee tax credit assistance leveraged loans and make leveraged loans. Limits tax credit assistance guarantees and loans to in-state projects for which tax credits are allocated by a qualified community development entity as defined in federal law. Grants AIDEA the authority to agree to federal restrictions and guidelines under the new markets tax credit program. Asserts that the loan

guarantee does not create a state debt or liability, but prohibits termination, cancellation, or revocation of a guarantee except by its terms. Allows a business that qualifies for new markets tax credits to apply for a loan guarantee, and gives AIDEA discretion to adopt regulations to establish guarantee or loan application requirements, or additional applicant qualifications. Gives AIDEA discretion to require an applicant to submit an economic benefit analysis. Authorizes the Alaska Energy Authority to issue a loan for \$26,000,000 or less from the power project fund for the Metlakatla Power and Light Triangle Lake hydroelectric project. Extends the municipal tax exemption for certain assets of AIDEA for an additional five years to November 30, 2017. **(HCS CSSB 66(FIN))**

Effective Date: June 13, 2012

**Chapter 62 AUTHORIZING "SNOW CLASSICS" AND THE USE OF THE INTERNET TO PROMOTE CHARITABLE GAMING ACTIVITIES**

Authorizes "snow classics" as a form of charitable gaming. Authorizes the use of the Internet and Internet communications to promote a charitable gaming activity. **(CSHB 245(FIN))**

Effective Date: September 10, 2012

**Chapter 63 INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR AUTISM**

Requires health care insurers to cover the cost of diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorders. Exempts certain small employers from the requirement to provide coverage. Establishes the autism task force. **(HCS SB 74(RLS) am H)**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect June 28, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2013

**Chapter 64 MANUFACTURED HOMES; MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAXATION**

Enables owners of manufactured homes that are permanently affixed to real property to treat them as part of the real property for mortgage loans, conveyances, municipal taxation, and other legal purposes. Establishes procedures for converting manufactured homes to real property and for severing converted manufactured homes from real property. Modifies motor vehicle titling and transfer requirements to allow for the conversion and severance of manufactured homes. Allows for the recording of affixation and severance affidavits for manufactured homes. Allows for deferral of municipal property tax on the increase in the assessed value of real property when the increase is attributable to subdivision of the property. **(HCS CSSB 104(RLS))**

Effective Date: Section 30 takes effect June 13, 2012; sections 22 and 32 take effect July 1, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2013

**Chapter 65**    **PRISONERS AND CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES**

Provides a definition for "correctional facility" for service of process on state prisoners. Amends Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure relating to service of process on state prisoners. Amends the crime of escape in the second degree for a person who removes oneself from a secure correctional facility while under official detention for a misdemeanor, and defines "secure correctional facility." (CSHB 296(JUD))

Effective Date:            June 15, 2012

**Chapter 66**    **CRIME OF CONSPIRACY**

Amends the definition of "serious felony offense" for purposes of application of the crime of conspiracy to include arson in the first degree, or arson in the second degree. (HB 56)

Effective Date:            September 16, 2012

**Chapter 67**    **INTRASTATE MUTUAL AID SYSTEM**

Establishes a mutual aid system between participating political subdivisions of the state. Provides that every political subdivision is a participating member of the mutual aid system unless the subdivision withdraws. Specifies the disaster emergency response, preparation, and prevention activities for which a political subdivision may request assistance from another political subdivision. Addresses qualifications and employment of, and workers' compensation for, emergency responders. Establishes reimbursement procedures for, and tort liability of, participating political subdivisions. Requires the Alaska division of homeland security and emergency management and the Alaska State Emergency Response Commission to assist in developing and implementing the mutual aid system. (HB 366)

Effective Date:            September 16, 2012

**Chapter 68**    **TAX CREDIT FOR EMPLOYING A VETERAN, AND VETERAN STATUS DESIGNATION ON A DRIVER'S LICENSE OR STATE IDENTIFICATION CARD**

Provides a credit against the income tax on corporations for the employment in the state of an honorably discharged or disabled veteran. Authorizes the Department of Administration to note an individual's status as a retired veteran or honorably discharged veteran on a driver's license or state identification card. Prohibits the Department of Administration from charging a fee to add the veteran's designation, but allows for a charge of \$5 to replace a valid driver's license or state identification card. Authorizes the Department of Administration, with the consent of the veteran,

to provide the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs with the name and address of a person receiving a veteran designation on a driver's license or state identification card. (HCS CSSB 136(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1 and 2 take effect March 1, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012

**Chapter 69 DEATH CERTIFICATE FOR A DECEASED VETERAN**

Permits the Bureau of Vital Statistics to issue, without charge only to a qualified person, up to four certified copies of the death certificate of a veteran who was a state resident at the time of the veteran's death. (SCS CSHB 129(STA))

Effective Date: September 16, 2012

**Chapter 70 CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN, CRIMES OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, SEX TRAFFICKING, AND PROMOTION OF PROSTITUTION, AND POST-CONVICTION PROCEEDINGS**

Makes the causation of certain physical injuries to a child who is 10 or 11 years of age a class C felony. Re-defines "serious physical injury" as that term applies to certain crimes against children under the age of 12. Makes it a class C felony for a person who is legally charged with the care of a child under the age of 16 to recklessly fail to provide an adequate quantity of food or liquids to that child. Raises the legal standard of proof required for establishing whether a person found guilty of a crime was mentally ill when the person committed the crime. Changes the procedural requirements applicable to post-conviction determinations of "guilty but mentally ill." Sets new limits on the court's post-conviction discretion to reduce specific periods of probation or specific terms of suspended incarceration. Lowers the legal standard of proof required for a court to impose a mandatory term of imprisonment of 99 years, in certain circumstances, for a person who has been convicted of murder in the first degree. Requires the state to give advance notice to the defendant if the state is seeking to establish certain facts that would preclude the defendant from being eligible for a "good time" deduction or that would increase the defendant's presumptive sentencing range, and requires the state to prove those facts beyond a reasonable doubt. Allows a sentencing court, in certain circumstances, to increase a term of imprisonment up to the maximum and determine additional aggravating factors, based on clear and convincing evidence and without a jury. Creates a task force in the executive branch to examine the prevalence of the crimes of human trafficking, sex trafficking, and promoting prostitution, and to examine the services that are available under state law to victims of those crimes. (HCS CSSB 210(JUD))

Effective Date: July 1, 2012

**Chapter 71**    **VULNERABLE ADULTS**

Changes the description of "elderly person or disabled adult" to "vulnerable adult" for purposes of protection of a person and property, and for purposes of aggravating factors for criminal sentencing. Adds fraud to the list of reasons for appointment of a conservator and issuance of a protective order. Makes various changes pertaining to conservators and adds provisions for temporary conservators. Makes various changes pertaining to protective orders. Adds undue influence of a vulnerable adult as cause for reports to and investigations by the Department of Health and Social Services and the local police department. Makes various changes to definitions relevant to the protection of vulnerable adults. Amends court rules relating to the scheduling of criminal cases and to the continuance of a trial to require consideration of the victim's circumstances. **(CSSB 86(JUD)(efd am))**

**Chapter 72**    **RIGHTS OF CRIME VICTIMS, VICTIMS' ADVOCATE, APPOINTMENT OF COUNSEL IN CRIMINAL CASES, AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE**

Requires notification by the prosecuting attorney to victims where a continuance may substantially delay a criminal case and provides for a definition of "substantial delay." Modifies the factors for determining whether a person charged with a crime is indigent for purposes of appointing counsel to include consideration of the person's financial resources in addition to the person's ability to pay. Amends the victims' advocate appointment statute to require a currently serving victims' advocate seeking reappointment by the legislature to submit to the victims' advocate selection committee, an application for reappointment. Provides that if the term of the victims' advocate expires without the appointment of a successor, that the person appointed as the acting victims' advocate serves until a new victims' advocate is appointed for a full term. Removes the restriction on compensation for the victims' advocate to allow the victims' advocate to be compensated at Range 26, with pay increases allowed as provided by Alaska law. Amends Alaska Rule of Criminal Procedure 39.1(e), by requiring a defendant seeking court appointed counsel to complete a signed financial statement subject to penalties for perjury. Amends Alaska Rule of Criminal Procedure 45(d)(2) to require that a court considering a request for a continuance in a criminal case consider the interests of the crime victim, if known, before granting a continuance. Amends Alaska Rule of Criminal Procedure 45 by adding a new section (h), requiring that before a court issues a ruling on a request for a continuance, the court shall consider the victim's position, if known, and the effect of a continuance on the victim. **(HCS CSSB 135(FIN))**

**Chapter 73 BIG GAME COMMERCIAL SERVICES BOARD**

Expands the authority of the Big Game Commercial Service Board to adopt regulations. Creates a retired status license for guides. Permits a registered guide-outfitter to work as a class-A assistant guide in a management unit that the guide-outfitter has adequate knowledge and experience of, and as an assistant guide in any management unit. Amends the duties, in the field, of a registered guide-outfitter who contracts for a guided hunt. Permits the board to suspend or permanently revoke a transporter license or any class of guide license if the board makes certain findings. Increases the period of time a court may order the board to suspend a guide license or a transporter license for certain violations under AS 08.54.720(a)(8). **(CSHB 229(JUD))**

Effective Date: Sections 3 - 5 take effect April 1, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 3, 2012

**Chapter 74 POSTSECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL AID FUNDING**

Makes various changes to the existing Alaska scholarship and AlaskAdvantage financial aid programs for state residents, including renaming the scholarship program, adjusting eligibility provisions for applicants, adding requirements for postsecondary educational institutions, and establishing the Alaska higher education investment fund in the Department of Revenue, requiring the commissioner to identify one-third of the amount available for appropriation from the fund for AlaskAdvantage grants, and two-thirds for Alaska performance scholarships, and making other changes. **(CCS HB 104)**

## THIRD SPECIAL SESSION

### Chapter 1

#### **CRIMES OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND SEX TRAFFICKING**

Amends the definition of "serious felony" for purposes of the offense of conspiracy to include the offenses of human trafficking in the first degree, and sex trafficking in the first degree. Removes the element from the offense of human trafficking in the first degree requiring the person induced or compelled to "come to this state." Amends the offense of distribution of indecent materials to minors to raise the mental state to a specific intent crime, and to include possession with the intent to distribute indecent material to a minor. Changes the title of the offense of prostitution to sex trafficking, and makes conforming amendments. Provides for an increase in the penalty for prostitution where the offense involves a prostitute under 18 years of age. ### **Chapter 15** **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the state fiscal year 2013 for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, amends appropriations and makes reappropriations. Appropriates \$6,855,991,600 from the general fund and other funds in addition to unspecified amounts from program receipts, federal receipts, insurance claim settlements and other sources. **(CCS HB 284)**

Effective Date: Section 26(f) takes effect December 1, 2012; sections 13(h), 14, 26(e), 27(d), 30, 32(a), 33, and 34 of this Act and the fiscal note for SB 182 as described in section 2 of this Act take effect June 30, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2012; the appropriation made in section 13(i)(1) and those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2012 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2012, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2012, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

### **Chapter 17** **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for capital projects, including \$2,777,480,061 for state and local capital projects. Amends prior appropriations and reappropriates money from prior appropriations for capital projects and other purposes. Makes supplemental appropriations for the operation of state government for fiscal year 2012. Capitalizes funds. Transfers \$60,000,000 from the general fund to the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act reimbursement fund. Transfers the unexpended and unobligated balance of the operating general fund on June 30, 2012, to the statutory budget reserve fund. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations.

### **TRANSFER OF CERTAIN HEARINGS AND APPEALS TO DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION**

Transfers certain hearings and appeals previously heard by the Department of Health and Social Services, including proceedings affecting the certificate of need program, nursing facilities, public assistance programs, alcohol safety action program, alcohol and intoxication treatment facilities, and the senior benefits program shall be heard and appealed through the office of administrative hearings, Department of Administration. Provides that employees of the Department of Health and Social Services displaced by the transfer of functions to the office of administrative hearings may apply for and be considered for jobs created as a result of the transfer. Provides that pending proceedings may be conducted under prior law. **(EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 116)**
