SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

**Chapter 1**     **WASTEWATER DISCHARGE FROM COMMERCIAL PASSENGER VESSELS**

Creates a permanent exception to the commercial passenger vessel discharge standards for discharges of treated sewage, graywater, or other wastewater into marine waters of the state, including allowance of a mixing zone, so long as the discharger is using an advanced wastewater treatment system. Extends the duration of a small commercial passenger vessel discharge permit from three years to five years. Extends the 2010 general discharge permit for commercial passenger vessels until December 15, 2015. Repeals the advisory panel on wastewater treatment. **(HB 80)**

Effective Date:        March 1, 2013

**Chapter 2**     **TERM OF OFFICE OF DIRECTORS OF TELEPHONE OR ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES**

Extends the statutory maximum term of a director of a telephone or electric cooperative from three years to four years. Requires that not all terms of directors of a telephone or electric cooperative expire at the same time. **(SB 14)**

Effective Date:        June 5, 2013

**Chapter 3**     **VIETNAM VETERANS DAY**

Establishes March 29 of each year as Vietnam Veterans Day to acknowledge and commemorate the military service of American men and women in Vietnam. The day may be observed by suitable observances and exercises by civic groups and the public. **(CSHB 67(MLV))**

Effective Date:        March 28, 2013

**Chapter 4**     **COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS**

Amends the definition of "commercial motor vehicle" for purposes of financial responsibility to add that the vehicles must be used for commercial purposes. Amends the definition of "commercial motor vehicle" for other purposes by requiring a vehicle to weigh more than 10,000 pounds for interstate commerce and greater than 14,000 pounds for intrastate commerce to be defined as a commercial vehicle. Removes a requirement that transportation of hazardous materials makes a vehicle commercial for both definitions. **(HB 15)**

Effective Date:        July 8, 2013

**Chapter 5**     **DISCHARGE AUTHORIZATION EXEMPTION FOR FIRING OR MUNITIONS RANGES**

Adds a range operated by a United States Department of Defense service or a United States military service to the class of ranges exempted from the requirement for prior authorization by the Department of Environmental Conservation before engaging in waste management, disposal, or discharge. Replaces the reference to "discharge into waters of the United States" with a reference to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. **(HB 36)**

Effective Date:       July 8, 2013

**Chapter 6**     **ALASKA MINING DAY**

Establishes Alaska Mining Day on May 10 of each year to recognize and honor individuals and industry that have played an enormous role in settling and developing the territory and the state, and that continue to contribute to the economy of the state. **(SB 1(e) add H)**

Effective Date:       April 13, 2013

**Chapter 7**     **INTERSTATE MINING COMPACT**

Enacts the Interstate Mining Compact to allow the state to join with other member states to address common issues related to mining. Commits the state to formulate and establish an effective program for the conservation and use of mined land. **(SB 2)**

Effective Date:       April 16, 2013

**Chapter 8**     **EXCLUDING MOTORCYCLES AND MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLES FROM THE PASSENGER VEHICLE RENTAL TAX**

Excludes motorcycles and motor-driven cycles from the passenger vehicle rental tax. **(HB 56)**

Effective Date:       May 10, 2013

**Chapter 9**     **CORRECTIVE AMENDMENTS: 2013 REVISOR'S BILL**

Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the revisor of statutes. **(HB 81)**

Effective Date:       May 10, 2013

**Chapter 10**   **OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION TAX**

Alters the source of appropriations to the community revenue sharing fund. Changes determination of the rate of interest applicable on a delinquent tax under AS 43 and on other obligations to the state. Creates a corporate income tax credit for qualified oil and gas service industry expenditures. Increases the base tax rate on oil and gas production. Repeals the progressive portion of the oil and gas production tax on January 1, 2014. Extends the oil and gas production tax cap for oil and gas produced from a lease or property outside the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin and outside the

North Slope. Allows a producer or explorer to take a qualified capital expenditure credit in a single tax year rather than over two years. Terminates the qualified capital expenditure credit for expenditures incurred on the North Slope after January 1, 2014. Increases the carried-forward annual loss credit for oil and gas producers. Establishes two per barrel tax credits on oil produced, to be applied against the producer's annual production tax. Extends certain production tax credits for exploration conducted outside of the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin and outside of the North Slope. Establishes two reductions to the gross value at the point of production for certain oil production. Creates the Oil and Gas Competitiveness Review Board and provides for its sunset date. Repeals the issuance of certain transferable tax credit certificates. Repeals certain provisions relating to adjustments in a settlement with a royalty owner. Makes conforming amendments. **(HCS CSSB 21(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: August 19, 2013; sections 7, 16 - 19, 25, and 32 of this Act, AS 43.55.023(a)(1), as amended by section 14 of this Act, and AS 43.55.160(a)(1)(E), as amended by section 28 of this Act, are retroactive to January 1, 2013

**Chapter 11** **ALASKA GASLINE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN IN-STATE NATURAL GAS PIPELINE; REGULATION OF AN IN-STATE NATURAL GAS PIPELINE BY THE REGULATORY COMMISSION OF ALASKA; LEASING OF A STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR AN IN-STATE NATURAL GAS PIPELINE THAT OPERATES AS A CONTRACT CARRIER; COOPERATION OF STATE AGENCIES INCLUDING THE SHARING OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION RELATING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF AN IN-STATE NATURAL GAS PIPELINE PROJECT; REPEAL OF THE ALASKA NATURAL GAS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY**

Makes the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation (AGDC) a public corporation located for administrative purposes in the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development. Provides for the organization and administration of AGDC. Empowers AGDC to advance an in-state natural gas pipeline that is not in conflict with the limitations in the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act. Authorizes AGDC to develop, finance, construct, and operate an in-state natural gas pipeline, and to determine the form of ownership of that pipeline. Authorizes AGDC to issue bonds and borrow money for the purpose of financing an in-state natural gas pipeline. Provides for information sharing between state agencies and AGDC and provides for certain information to be confidential. Establishes the in-state natural gas pipeline fund. Exempts AGDC and its subsidiaries from the State Procurement Code. Makes the operating budget of AGDC subject to the Executive Budget Act. Requires reports to the governor, the legislature, and the public relating to the development, financing, construction, and operation of an in-state natural gas pipeline, including the results of an open season. Authorizes the commissioner of natural resources to issue a non-competitive lease of state land for a right-of-way to a natural gas pipeline that is a contract carrier. Provides for judicial review of certain actions relating to the lease of a pipeline right-of-way, regulation of an in-state pipeline, and other administrative actions. Provides for holding certain information held by AGDC to be confidential and not subject to public disclosure. Provides for a review by the

Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA) of certain agreements between public utilities and AGDC. Provides for regulation by RCA of in-state natural gas pipelines that provide transportation by contract carriage. Provides for the establishment of recourse tariffs. Provides for the expansion of an in-state natural gas pipeline and the resolution of disputes related to an in-state natural gas pipeline. Transfers certain functions of the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority to AGDC and repeals the statutes relating to the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority. **(SCS CSSSHB 4(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 22, 2013

**Chapter 12 AUTHORITY TO REGULATE DREDGE AND FILL ACTIVITIES**

Requires the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Environmental Conservation to take the necessary actions to obtain the authority from the federal government to administer a dredge and fill permitting program. **(SB 27)**

Effective Date: May 22, 2013

**Chapter 13 APPROVAL FOR OIL AND GAS OR GAS ONLY EXPLORATION OR DEVELOPMENT**

Authorizes the director of the division of lands in the Department of Natural Resources to approve exploration or development for all or part of an area approved for oil and gas or gas only leasing. The approval applies to exploration or development that commences during a period of up to 10 years, and once exploration or development commences, the approval continues for the term of the lease. **(CSHB 129(FIN))**

Effective Date: May 22, 2013

**Chapter 14 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, and makes reappropriations. **(CCS HB 65)**

Effective Date: Section 19(b) is conditional; the appropriations made in sections 27(i) and 28(o) are conditional; sections 16, 32, and 36 take effect June 30, 2013; section 28(e) takes effect December 1, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013; the appropriation in section 13(h)(1) and those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2013 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2013, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2013, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

**Chapter 15** **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for fiscal year 2014. **(CCS HB 66)**

Effective Date: Section 11 takes effect June 30, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013

**Chapter 16** **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for capital projects. Amends prior appropriations and reappropriates money from prior appropriations for capital projects and other purposes. Makes supplemental appropriations for the operation of the state government for fiscal year 2013. Capitalizes funds. Transfers funds from the general fund to the renewable energy grant fund, the regional educational attendance area school fund, the fish and game fund, and the regional educational attendance area and small municipal school district school fund. Appropriates \$25,000,000 to the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act reimbursement fund. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 18(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 17(b), 21(d), 21(e), 21(f), 22(d), 25, 26(b), and 47 are conditional; sections 4, 7, 10, 11, 12(a), 12(b), 13, 14(a), 15(a), 15(b), 17, 18, 19, 21(c), 22(c), 53, and 54(c) take effect May 22, 2013; sections 12(c), 14(b), 15(c) - (f), 16, 21(e), 26(a), 26(b), 26(c), 27(a), 27(b), 28 - 46, 48, 49(b), 50, 54(d), and 54(f) take effect June 30, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013; sections 15(b) and 19 are retroactive to June 30, 2012

**Chapter 17** **TRAVEL INSURANCE**

Amends the definition of "travel insurance" for the purpose of describing a person eligible for a travel insurance limited producer license, and authorizes a person selling travel services to sell travel insurance on behalf of, and under the direction of, a person licensed as a travel insurance limited producer. **(CSHB 168(L&C))**

Effective Date: August 21, 2013

**Chapter 18** **POSTING INSURANCE POLICIES ON THE INTERNET**

Subject to certain conditions, permits an insurer to provide certain insurance policies to an insured by posting the policy on the insurer's Internet website, as well as by mail or delivery. **(CSHB 175(L&C))**

Effective Date: August 21, 2013

**Chapter 19** **STATE AUDITS**

Requires the Legislative Finance Division to identify reductions in state expenditures in the first fiscal year following a performance review by the Legislative Audit Division. Requires Legislative Audit to conduct a performance review of specific agencies and make the final report available to the legislature not later than the first day of the regular session following the review. Requires Legislative Audit to ensure

that the review team conducts a performance review of the appropriate programs of state agencies. Lists a schedule of audits for each year starting in 2014. Requires the agency subject to review to provide program information to the review team before November 1 of the year before the performance review, including a list of programs or elements of programs that compose at least 10 percent of the general funds in the agency's budget that could be reduced or eliminated. Requires the review team to work with Legislative Audit, hold public hearings, analyze materials relevant to the performance of the agency, provide a confidential preliminary report to the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee, and provide a final report to the chairs or co-chairs of the Senate and House Finance Committees. Removes oversight of agency programs from the legislature. Defines "review team" as appropriate professionals hired by or under contract with Legislative Audit to complete a performance review of state agencies. Defines "agency" as a state department or agency, whether in the legislative, judicial, or executive branch, and includes the University of Alaska. **(CSHB 30(FIN))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2013

**Chapter 20 PRIMARY PERIOD AND EXTENSION OF AN OIL AND GAS OR GAS ONLY LEASE**

Authorizes the commissioner of natural resources to approve a one-time extension of an oil and gas or gas only lease for a limited period if the commissioner finds that the extension is in the best interest of the state. Allows the rental for a lease to increase, subject to certain limitations, during the extension of a lease. Includes factors that the commissioner may consider when granting a lease extension or setting the amount of rental for a lease extension. **(HB 198 am)**

Effective Date: May 29, 2013

**Chapter 21 CORPORATION INCOME TAX RATES; FILM PRODUCTION TAX CREDITS**

Reduces the tax rates applicable to the income of a corporation. Makes certain types of film productions ineligible for the film production tax credit. **(HCS SB 7(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 2 and 4 take effect July 1, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect August 26, 2013

**Chapter 22 EXPERIMENTAL VEHICLES**

Allows the issuance of license plates for experimental vehicles. Defines "experimental vehicle" as a vehicle in the developmental stage that has not yet reached production in the United States. Exempts experimental vehicles from registration. **(CSSB 85(TRA))**

Effective Date: August 27, 2013

**Chapter 23** **SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICE AGENCY**

Increases the allocation for, and extends the termination date of, the special education service agency. Deletes reduction of the agency's allocation for retirement contributions paid by the Department of Education and Early Development. (CCS HB 87)

Effective Date: May 30, 2013; section 2 is retroactive to June 30, 2013

**Chapter 24** **DISPLAYING PROOF OF INSURANCE ON MOBILE ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

Allows a person to meet the obligation to have proof of motor vehicle liability insurance in the person's immediate possession by displaying the proof on a mobile electronic device. Expands the definition of "proof" for purposes of verifying motor vehicle liability insurance to include display on a mobile device. Provides that display of the proof of insurance on a mobile device to a peace officer does not constitute consent to access other contents of the mobile device. (CSHB 146(TRA))

Effective Date: July 1, 2013

**Chapter 25** **PORTABLE ELECTRONICS INSURANCE**

Provides for the regulation of portable electronics insurance. Authorizes the director of insurance to issue a limited producer license to a portable electronics vendor. Authorizes employees of the vendor to transact portable electronics insurance under certain conditions. (HCS CSSB 52(L&C))

Effective Date: January 1, 2014

**Chapter 26** **ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY PROJECT FINANCING; DIVIDENDS; FINANCING OF A LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION SYSTEM AND NATURAL GAS DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM**

Amends the authority of the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (Authority) with regard to development project financing. Allows the Authority to provide financing for a project it does not intend to own and operate. Provides for payment of a dividend to the state from the Authority's revolving fund and the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority sustainable energy transmission and supply development fund. Approves financing for a liquefied natural gas production plant on the North Slope, and for a natural gas distribution system in Interior Alaska. (HCS CSSB 23(FIN))

Effective Date: May 30, 2013

**Chapter 27**    **WAIVING THE COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVING SKILLS TEST FOR CERTAIN DRIVERS WITH MILITARY COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE EXPERIENCE**

Requires the commissioner of administration to provide a waiver of the commercial motor vehicle driving skills test for drivers with recent military commercial vehicle driving experience in regulations necessary to implement the commercial motor vehicle driver's licensing program. (HB 46)

Effective Date:            August 31, 2013

**Chapter 28**    **MILITARY EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND SERVICE CREDIT**

Requires the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development and applicable occupational licensing boards to accept military education, training, and service for some or all of the qualifications required for licensing. Provides for a temporary license on the same basis. Also requires the University of Alaska and other postsecondary educational institutions to implement a procedure for acceptance of academic credit for relevant military education, training, and service. (CSHB 84(FIN)(efd am S))

Effective Date:            Sections 1 - 4 take effect December 31, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect June 3, 2013

**Chapter 29**    **ESTABLISHING A MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR THE WIDOW OR WIDOWER OF A PERSON WHO DIES OF A CAUSE CONNECTED TO THE PERSON'S SERVICE IN THE ARMED FORCES OR NATIONAL GUARD**

Grants a municipality authority to create a property tax exemption by ordinance approved by voters on the first \$150,000 of the assessed value of the primary residence owned and occupied by a resident who is the widow or widower of a person who dies from a cause connected to the person's service in the United States Armed Forces or National Guard. A widow or widower who remarries is ineligible for the exemption. (CSSB 73(STA))

Effective Date:            June 3, 2013; section 1 is retroactive to January 1, 2013

**Chapter 30**    **BOARD OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Public Accountancy to June 30, 2021. (HB 26)

Effective Date:            June 4, 2013

**Chapter 31**    **BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE ALASKA BAR ASSOCIATION**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Governors of the Alaska Bar Association to June 30, 2021. Requires all members of the Board of Governors to

complete the mandatory ethics continuing legal education requirements and the voluntary legal education requirements as set out in the Alaska Bar Rules. **(CSHB 63(FIN))**

Effective Date: June 4, 2013

**Chapter 32 ALASKA FIRE STANDARDS COUNCIL**

Removes the requirement that the two chief administrative officers or fire chiefs serving on the council be from a local government. Removes the requirement that one firefighter member be an administrative officer of the Alaska State Firefighters Association, and instead requires that the governor appoint a member representing the Alaska State Firefighters Association, and a member representing the Alaska Professional Fire Fighters Association from a list of at least three nominees submitted by each organization respectively. **(HB 113)**

Effective Date: September 1, 2013

**Chapter 33 PERMANENT FUND DIVIDEND**

Amends the allowable absence exception for Olympic Team members to include members of a United States national team for an Olympic sport. Repeals the statute that prevented a person from receiving a permanent fund dividend after being allowably absent for more than 180 days in each of the 10 preceding qualifying years. Creates a rebuttable presumption that after an individual has been allowably absent for more than 180 days in each of the five preceding qualifying years the individual is no longer a state resident. Allows an individual to rebut the presumption by providing clear and convincing evidence to the Department of Revenue that the individual was physically present in the state for at least 30 cumulative days during the past five years and that the individual is a resident as defined in AS 43.23.095(7). Sets out the factors the department may use to determine whether an individual intends to return and remain in the state indefinitely. Includes transitional language to allow a person who was ineligible for a 2013 dividend because of the 10-year rule to apply for and receive a 2013 permanent fund dividend if the individual applies within 90 days of the effective date of the Act. Allows a person who was eligible for the 2013 dividend but who is no longer eligible due to the changes in the eligibility statute to receive a 2013 dividend under the eligibility statute as it read on December 31, 2012. **(SCS HB 52(FIN))**

Effective Date: June 4, 2013; sections 1 - 4 are retroactive to January 1, 2013

**Chapter 34 ALASKA MINERALS COMMISSION**

Creates three-year terms for the members of the Alaska Minerals Commission and limits members to two consecutive terms. Extends the termination date of the Alaska Minerals Commission to February 1, 2024. Ends the terms of the current members of the Alaska Minerals Commission on January 31, 2014, and provides for staggered terms on the Alaska Minerals Commission for members appointed to terms beginning on February 1, 2014. **(CSHB 99(RES))**

Effective Date: September 1, 2013

**Chapter 35**    **EXTENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE AUTISM EARLY DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT TASK FORCE**

Amends the uncodified law of the State of Alaska to extend to January 15, 2015, both the reporting date for the Comprehensive Autism Early Diagnosis and Treatment Task Force, and the termination date. (HB 147)

Effective Date:            June 4, 2013; this Act is retroactive to January 14, 2013

**Chapter 36**    **BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, AND LAND SURVEYORS**

Authorizes the Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers, and Land Surveyors to hire an investigator. Removes the requirement that an examination must be written. (SB 16)

Effective Date:            September 1, 2013

**Chapter 37**    **STATEWIDE SUICIDE PREVENTION COUNCIL**

Extends the termination date of the Statewide Suicide Prevention Council to June 30, 2019. (SB 37)

Effective Date:            June 4, 2013

**Chapter 38**    **PRESCRIPTION EYE MEDICATION REFILLS**

Prohibits an insurer from denying coverage for an early refill of prescription topical eye medication under certain circumstances. (CSHB 125(L&C) am)

Effective Date:            September 1, 2013

**Chapter 39**    **BOARD OF MARINE PILOTS**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Marine Pilots to June 30, 2019. (CSHB 22(L&C))

Effective Date:            June 4, 2013

**Chapter 40**    **ALASKA MARINE TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY BOARD**

Adds a member to the Alaska Marine Transportation Advisory Board from southcentral Alaska, representing the cities of Old Harbor, Kodiak, Port Lions, Ouzinkie, Seldovia, and Homer. Adds Gustavus to the cities represented by the member from southeast Alaska. Removes the requirement that the member who is a marine captain or marine engineer be retired, and adds a requirement that the marine captain or marine engineer have 20 or more years of experience. (HCS SB 24(TRA))

Effective Date:            September 1, 2013

**Chapter 41**    **STATE MEDICAL BOARD**

Extends the termination date for the State Medical Board to June 30, 2020. Places the executive secretary of the State Medical Board in the partially exempt service

with a salary equal to a step in Range 23 on the salary schedule set out in AS 39.27.011(a). **(CSSB 38(FIN))**

Effective Date: June 4, 2013

**Chapter 42 CHANGING THE TERMS "MENTAL RETARDATION" AND "MENTALLY RETARDED"**

Changes the terms "mental retardation" and "mentally retarded" as used in the Alaska Statutes to "persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities" and variations of the phrase to fit the context in which the phrase is used. **(CSHB 88(HSS))**

Effective Date: September 1, 2013

**Chapter 43 CRIMES; VICTIMS; CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT**

Eliminates the statute of limitations for civil actions for felony sex trafficking and felony human trafficking and amends the limitations period for certain other sexual offenses. Criminalizes certain sexual acts committed by probation or parole officers or by the staff of a juvenile facility. Amends the crime of unlawful contact in the first degree. Allows a court to order a person to participate in a monitoring program with a global positioning device as a condition of release before or after trial, or pending appeal, for a prosecution for certain offenses. Requires a prosecuting attorney to provide to a crime victim, on request, copies of letters of support submitted with a defendant's presentence report. Makes numerous changes to laws relating to sentencing. Sets a time limit and a standard of proof for a defendant to request credit for time spent in a treatment program toward a sentence of imprisonment. Amends laws relating to forfeiture, introduction of evidence, wiretapping, registration of sex offenders and child kidnappers, notices provided within protective orders, the confidentiality of communications concerning victims of sexual assault and domestic violence, and crime victims' compensation. Requires the Alaska Judicial Council to include certain information about crime victims in the information it provides to the public about judges standing for retention or rejection. Allows a victim of sexual assault to obtain legal or equitable remedies for damages from the assault, even if parental rights of the perpetrator who caused the damages have been terminated. Restricts offenders convicted of certain sexual offenses from earning reductions in sentence for good behavior. Permits the attorney general to designate an alternate to issue certain administrative subpoenas. Allows a court to determine that the Department of Health and Social Services need not make reasonable efforts to provide services to a parent or guardian in a child-in-need-of-aid case where the parent or guardian has abused the child or another child of the parent or guardian, or is registered, or is required to register, as a sex offender. Requires paid athletic coaches to report suspected child abuse or neglect. Amends the Alaska Rules of Criminal Procedure relating to discovery, sentencing, and victim impact statements. Amends the Alaska Rules of Evidence concerning the admission into evidence of prior acts of assault or abuse of a minor. **(HCS CSSB 22(FIN))**

**Chapter 44 APPROVAL AND RATIFICATION OF THE SALE OF ROYALTY OIL**

Approves and ratifies an agreement for the sale and purchase of state royalty oil between the state and Flint Hills Resources Alaska, LLC. (SB 86)

Effective Date: June 12, 2013

**Chapter 45 RETIREMENT PLAN BENEFICIARY INTEREST EXEMPTIONS; CREDITOR ACTIONS AGAINST LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY AND LIMITED PARTNERSHIP INTERESTS; UNIFORM PROBATE CODE; TRUSTS; ALASKA UNIFORM PRUDENT INVESTOR ACT; UNITRUST TREATMENT UNDER ALASKA PRINCIPAL AND INCOME ACT; TRANSFERS TO MINORS BY CUSTODIANS; DIRECTIONS FOR DISPOSITION OF HUMAN REMAINS; INSURABLE INTERESTS; SPOUSAL COMMUNITY PROPERTY INTERESTS**

Extends retirement plan exemptions to plan beneficiaries. States that, other than a court-ordered charging order, legal and equitable remedies are not available to a creditor to satisfy a judgment out of the interest of a member in a limited liability company or a partner in a limited liability partnership. In the Uniform Probate Code provision that addresses pleadings, notice, and persons bound by other persons, applies the section to nonjudicial proceedings, settlement negotiations, and fiduciary account settlements. Covers the liabilities and obligations of trustees who are excluded from exercising certain powers. Expands the provisions dealing with exercising powers of appointment. Under certain conditions, removes some trustee duties and liabilities with respect to the acquisition of life insurance contracts for a trust. Describes the liability and obligations of trustees who are required to follow the directions of an advisor. Adjusts and adds to the unitrust provisions in the Alaska Principal and Income Act. Allows the custodian of a minor's property to extend the custodial term by following certain procedures, subject to the minor's right to compel distribution of the property. Establishes in the Disposition of Human Remains Act the authority and procedures for a person to provide directions for the disposition of the person's remains. Allows a trustee under certain conditions to obtain an insurance contract on the life or body of an individual with the proceeds payable to the trustee. Allows a person with an insurable interest to form a business firm to purchase, hold, or administer an insurance contract on the life or body of an individual. Establishes rules to govern the relationship between a discretionary interest in an irrevocable trust and a creditor's claim against the interest. Allows a person to voluntarily transfer or assign the person's interest in an individual retirement account if the person owns or is a participant in the account, or acquired the interest as a result of another individual's death. Amends the statutes governing spousal community property interests, including community property trusts. (CSSB 65(JUD))

**Chapter 46**    **NELLIE "THE ORIGINAL MRS. CLAUS" MILLER BRIDGE; CON "THE ORIGINAL SANTA CLAUS" MILLER BRIDGE; AND THE LOWELL J. RAY MEMORIAL CORRIDOR**

Names the northbound Chena Flood Channel Crossing Bridge, bridge number 1364, the Nellie "the original Mrs. Claus" Miller Bridge. Names the southbound Chena Flood Channel Crossing Bridge, bridge number 1866, the Con "the original Santa Clause" Miller Bridge. Designates that portion of East Blue Lupine Drive in Wasilla between Hyer Road and Hay Street the Lowell J. Ray Memorial Corridor. (SCS HB 94(FIN))

Effective Date:            September 9, 2013

**Chapter 47**    **COMPENSATION OF PUBLIC OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AND EMPLOYEES WHO ARE NOT COVERED BY COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS**

Provides cost-of-living pay increases, paid over three years, and establishes new geographic pay differentials for public officials, officers, and employees, including justices and judges, who are not covered by collective bargaining agreements. Allows the governor to authorize pay in excess of the monthly basic salary schedule for certain partially exempt employees in the executive branch. Adds petroleum engineers and petroleum geologists employed by the division of geological and geophysical surveys in the Department of Natural Resources to the exempt service in the executive branch. Changes the way personal leave may be accrued, accumulated, and used by certain state employees who are not covered by collective bargaining agreements. (HCS CSSB 95(FIN))

Effective Date:            Sections 6 - 8 take effect December 16, 2013; section 13 takes effect July 1, 2015; section 25 takes effect June 14, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013

**Chapter 48**    **BOARDING SCHOOLS OPERATED BY DISTRICTS**

Doubles the per-pupil monthly stipend claimed by a school district for room and board expenses for students enrolled in a boarding school operated by a district. Authorizes a school district to offer variable-length or 180-day school terms and to cooperate with an Alaska Native organization or a nonprofit organization to provide room and board services. Repeals the limit of three additional statewide boarding schools. (HCS CSSSSB 47(FIN))

Effective Date:            July 1, 2013

**Chapter 49**    **SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION GRANTS**

Makes small municipal school districts, as defined, eligible to receive state grants provided to regional educational attendance areas for school construction. (SB 62)

Effective Date:            September 16, 2013

**Chapter 50 UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION**

Allows the commissioner of the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to authorize electronic filing of certain unemployment insurance information. Expressly authorizes the legislature to appropriate money to the unemployment trust fund account. In certain instances prohibits the department from granting relief to employers from charges for erroneous payments from the unemployment trust fund account. Requires employers to pay a solvency adjustment surcharge if the reserve rate is less than three percent. Authorizes a solvency adjustment credit under certain circumstances. Limits the amounts of surcharges and credits. Allows the commissioner to suspend, in certain circumstances, some or all of a scheduled annual increase in the rate used to determine the amount of contributions employers and employees are required to make to the unemployment trust fund account. Eliminates the department's authority to waive collection of penalties owed by persons who have sought and obtained an unemployment insurance benefit by knowingly making a false statement or misrepresenting a material fact, or by knowingly failing to report a material fact, and requires the department to deposit at least 30 percent of collected penalties into the unemployment trust fund account. Authorizes the department to offset a claimant's unemployment compensation debt against the claimant's federal income tax refund in accordance with the federal income tax code. (CSHB 76(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 12 takes effect June 20, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013

**Chapter 51 USE OF DEADLY FORCE IN SELF-DEFENSE: ADDITIONAL EXCEPTION TO THE DUTY TO RETREAT**

Adds the exception of "in any other place where the person has a right to be" to allow that a person may use deadly force in self-defense. (CSHB 24(JUD))

Effective Date: September 18, 2013

**Chapter 52 EXEMPTS CERTAIN FIREARMS, AMMUNITION, AND ACCESSORIES FROM FEDERAL REGULATION; PROHIBITS THE USE OF PUBLIC ASSETS TO IMPLEMENT CERTAIN FEDERAL STATUTES, REGULATIONS, RULES, AND ORDERS; DECLARES SUCH FEDERAL STATUTES, REGULATIONS, RULES, AND ORDERS, UNCONSTITUTIONAL; AND REQUIRES THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO FILE LEGAL ACTION TO PREVENT IMPLEMENTATION OF ANY FEDERAL STATUTE, REGULATION, RULE, OR ORDER THAT VIOLATES THE RIGHTS OF RESIDENTS OF THE STATE**

Prohibits the use of state and municipal assets for the implementation of an order of the President of the United States, or a federal regulation or law that is applied either to infringe on the right to bear arms under the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution, or to deny the right to due process under the United States Constitution or the Constitution of the State of Alaska. Prohibits the use of state or municipal assets to implement the federal REAL ID Act. Declares that possession of a personal firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition in this state does not constitute interstate commerce and is not subject to federal law or regulation. Allows the attorney general to defend a person charged with violation of a federal law for

possession of a firearm in this state. Declares that a federal statute, regulation, rule, or order effective after the date of the act is unenforceable if it violates the Second Amendment, or art. I, sec. 19 of the Constitution of the State of Alaska by banning or restricting ownership of a semiautomatic firearm or firearm magazine, or by requiring a firearm, magazine, or other firearm accessory to be registered. Requires the attorney general to file any legal action necessary to prevent the implementation of a federal statute, regulation, rule, or order that violates the rights of a resident of this state. (SCS CSHB 69(JUD))

Effective Date: June 21, 2013

**Chapter 53** **ATTORNEY GENERAL REVIEW OF FEDERAL STATUTES, REGULATIONS, PRESIDENTIAL EXECUTIVE ORDERS AND ACTIONS, AND SECRETARIAL ORDERS, AND PROVIDING AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE**

Requires that the attorney general submit a report to the legislature on or before January 15 of each year if the attorney general believes a federal statute, regulation, presidential executive order or action, or secretarial order is unconstitutional or not properly adopted, and would preempt state law even if constitutional and properly adopted. Provides that the house or senate committees that have jurisdiction over judicial matters may consider legislative action in response to the report. Requires that the attorney general's annual report include a copy of the federal statute, regulation, presidential executive order or action, or secretarial order that is unconstitutional or not properly adopted, citation to the state law which is in conflict, and written findings explaining the basis for the attorney general's opinion, the nature of the conflict, the effect on the state if a court finds federal preemption, and litigation the attorney general is a party to or aware of concerning a conflict between a federal statute, regulation, presidential executive order or action, or secretarial order or action that would preempt state law if constitutional. (CSHB 83(JUD))

Effective Date: June 21, 2013

**Chapter 54** **KNIVES: CHANGES IN CRIMINAL LAW, DEFINITIONS, AND MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY**

Repeals AS 11.61.220(a)(5), which forbids the possession of switchblades or gravity knives. Prohibits the sale or transfer of switchblades or gravity knives to a person under 18 years of age without the prior written consent of the minor's parent or guardian. Prohibits an unemancipated minor under 16 years of age from possessing switchblades or gravity knives. Provides definitions for "gravity knife" and "switchblade." Reserves the authority to regulate knives to the state. Limits the authority of municipalities to adopt penalties related to knives to those identical to state law. Allows a municipality to restrict the areas where knives are sold provided the businesses selling knives are not treated more restrictively than other businesses. Allows a municipality to prohibit the possession of knives in restricted access areas of public buildings provided that the municipal assembly posts notices of the restriction at each entrance. (SCS HB 33(JUD))

Effective Date: September 18, 2013

**Chapter 55** **EXEMPTING CERTAIN INCOME RECEIVED BY A REGIONAL AQUACULTURE ASSOCIATION OR SALMON HATCHERY PERMIT HOLDER FROM THE CORPORATION INCOME TAX; ASSIGNMENT OF CERTAIN OIL AND GAS TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATES**

For a tax year beginning after June 30, 2007, exempts from the corporation income tax, income from the sale of salmon or salmon eggs or from a cost recovery fishery that is received by a qualified regional aquaculture association or hatchery permit holder. Provides for the assignment of certain oil and gas production tax credit certificates. **(HCS CSSB 83(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect July, 1 2023; remainder of Act takes effect June 27, 2013; section 3 is retroactive to January 1, 2013

**Chapter 56** **NEWBORN SCREENING**

Requires a provider of birthing services, as defined, to screen for congenital heart defects, to make referrals for abnormal screening results, and to report results to the Department of Health and Social Services. Provides for delayed applicability for providers who attend fewer than 20 births a year. **(CSSB 87(HSS))**

Effective Date: January 1, 2014

**Chapter 57** **AUTHORIZING THE ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION TO ALLOW COMMERCIAL USE OF MULTI-UNIT RESIDENTIAL HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS IT OWNS OR FINANCES**

Authorizes the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) to allow certain commercial uses of multi-unit residential housing developments that it owns or finances. Limits commercial uses to a percentage of space in a development that AHFC determines is consistent with increasing the availability of affordable housing. Prohibits AHFC from authorizing commercial use for adult entertainment, substance abuse treatment, the sale, transfer, or storage of tobacco products, or the sale of alcoholic beverages other than in a restaurant or eating place licensed by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Authorizes the Board to approve restaurant or eating place licenses for premises located in multi-residential housing developments owned or financed by AHFC if the use is authorized by AHFC. **(CSHB 50(FIN))**

Effective Date: September 24, 2013

**Chapter 58** **CONTRACTS FOR THE PREPARATION OF ELECTION BALLOTS**

Requires that on or after January 1, 2014, the director of the Division of Elections shall contract under the state procurement code (AS 36.30) for the preparation of election ballots, and corrects and relocates existing terms in AS 15.15.030. **(CSSB 63(STA))**

Effective Date: September 24, 2013

**Chapter 59**    **PROCUREMENT BY PUBLIC ENTITIES**

Reorganizes the Alaska bidder and related preferences. Coordinates the procurement code preferences among themselves and with the state's general forest, agricultural, and fisheries product preferences. Specifies when in the procurement process a bidder or an offeror is to submit proof of having a state business license or proof of registration as a construction contractor. Authorizes agencies to allow bids and proposals to be submitted electronically. Removes the requirement that the state maintain a list of persons available for contracts. Increases the contract amounts and lease sizes for which small procurement procedures may be used. Reduces the annual salary of the state's chief procurement officer. **(SB 12)**

Effective Date:            June 27, 2013

**Chapter 60**    **ALASKA ENTITY TRANSACTIONS ACT**

Adopts the Alaska Entity Transactions Act, which allows entities to merge with other entities, to convert themselves into other types of entities, to become entities of this state, and to exchange interests with other entities. Applies to a broad range of entity types. Establishes procedures for approving, amending, and abandoning plans for the mergers, conversions, domestications, and interest exchanges. Gives dissenters' rights to interest holders of domestic entities. Describes the effects that each type of transaction has on the participating entities. Exempts financial institutions, insurers, public corporations, municipalities, and certain other entities from its coverage. States that the new provisions are not exclusive. Retains the merger authority currently provided by statute for for-profit corporations, limited liability companies, nonprofit corporations, and partnerships, but removes existing conversion authority. **(CSHB 57(JUD))**

Effective Date:            Section 31 takes effect June 27, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2014

**Chapter 61**    **ALASKA POLICE STANDARDS COUNCIL**

Expands the definition of "police officer" used by the Alaska Police Standards Council to include certain part-time state or municipal employees who have police powers. **(HB 186)**

Effective Date:            September 24, 2013

**Chapter 62**    **INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES**

Provides for the eligibility of a full-time student who is enrolled in an alternative education program, as defined, to participate in interscholastic activities available in a religious or other private school if the student is otherwise eligible under school and other requirements. Deletes the term "entirely," allowing the student of an alternative education program in the state to participate in interscholastic activities at a public school. **(SSSB 41)**

Effective Date:            July 1, 2013

**Chapter 63**    **FINANCING FOR THE ALASKA NATIVE MEDICAL CENTER**

Authorizes the State Bond Committee to issue certificates of participation to finance the construction and equipping of residential housing for the Anchorage campus of the Alaska Native Medical Center. Authorizes the Department of Administration to enter into a lease-purchase agreement related to the financing. **(SB 88)**

Effective Date:            September 25, 2013

**Chapter 64**    **UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE**

Updates and revises provisions in the state's Uniform Commercial Code relating to funds transfers and secured transactions. Establishes state coverage of certain remittance transfers to fill a gap caused by a recent change in federal law. Provides a method for a creditor's perfected security interest to continue to cover property acquired after a debtor moves to another state by providing the creditor with a grace period of four months to perfect the security interest in the new state. States what name a creditor can use for a debtor on a financing statement that will be considered sufficient for the financing statement. Changes the term "correction statement" to "information statement" to avoid giving the impression that a filing of the statement has the legal effect of correcting a problem. Allows a secured party to file an information statement about a filed record related to its financing statement if the secured party believes that the record filing was not authorized. Directs the Department of Natural Resources to adopt regulations to implement the changes and to provide filing forms that are identical to certain uniform forms and that reflect the changes. Makes the changes effective on July 1, 2013, so that the changes can take effect at the same time as the changes in other states. **(HB 9)**

Effective Date:            Section 34 takes effect June 28, 2013; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2013

**Chapter 65**    **ABANDONED AND DERELICT VESSELS**

Changes responsibility for abandoned and derelict vessels from the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to any state agency or municipality. Prevents a vessel that has been denied entrance to a harbor by a state agency or municipality from being stored on waters of the state for more than 14 consecutive days unless all hazardous materials and petroleum products have been removed. Permits a state agency, municipality, or peace officer to take a derelict vessel into custody immediately. Defines "state agency" as a state department or agency in the executive branch, excludes an agency of the legislative or judicial branch, the University of Alaska, and public corporations. Repeals the statute authorizing the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to adopt regulations regarding abandoned and derelict vessels. **(HB 131)**

Effective Date:            September 25, 2013

**Chapter 66** **MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN FARM STRUCTURES**

Grants municipalities the authority to create a property tax exemption by ordinance approved by voters for certain farm structures owned or leased by a person actively engaged in farming activity. The authority to create an exemption is repealed 10 years after the effective date of the Act. The exemption may partially or wholly exempt structures used exclusively for the growing, storage, or processing of crops intended for human consumption, the storage or processing of dairy products, the storage and processing of feed for farm animals, or the stabling or milking of dairy animals. (CSHB 40(CRA) am S)

**Chapter 67** **WALTER J. HICKEL PARKWAY**

Designates Minnesota Drive and the portion of O'Malley Road in Anchorage from Minnesota Drive to the New Seward Highway the Walter J. Hickel Parkway. (CSHB 153(TRA))

Effective Date: October 8, 2013

**Chapter 68** **JAY HAMMOND DAY**

Establishes July 21 of each year as Jay Hammond Day. (HB 130)

Effective Date: October 8, 2013

**Chapter 69** **TEACHER TENURE NOTICE, PUPIL TRANSPORTATION FUNDING, AND EARLY LITERACY INFORMATION**

Requires school districts to annually provide information related to early literacy to parents and guardians of children enrolled in public schools in grades kindergarten through three. Changes the date for notification of the layoff or nonretention of tenured school teachers in grades kindergarten through 12 to May 15, applicable to collective bargaining agreements binding after the effective date of the Act. Repeals a temporary pupil transportation adjustment and adds a three-year pupil transportation adjustment based on the Consumer Price Index. (HCS CSSB 57(EDC))

Effective Date: July 11, 2013

**Chapter 70** **JIM ANDIE AND ROBIN STARRETT MEMORIAL RUNWAY AND BENNY BENSON STATE AIRPORT**

Names the state-owned airport in Akhiok the Jim Andie and Robin Starrett Memorial Runway. Names the state-owned airport in Kodiak the Kodiak Benny Benson State Airport. (HCS SB 31(RLS) am H)

Effective Date: October 8, 2013

**Chapter 71** **MISSING VULNERABLE ADULT PROMPT RESPONSE AND NOTIFICATION PLANS**

Requires the Department of Public Safety to develop and implement prompt response and notification plans and to coordinate the use of those plans to locate a vulnerable adult who is missing. Requires the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs to cooperate in the development and implementation of such plans. Requires that the plans include standards that address, at a minimum, when a vulnerable adult is to be considered missing, and the format, contents and distribution of reports prepared by participating agencies searching for a missing vulnerable adult. Requires that plans provide standards for voluntary participation by radio and television broadcasters, newspaper publishers, and owners and operators of other communications media. Provides that participating radio and television broadcasters, newspaper publishers, and owners and operators of other communications media are not civilly liable for participation if they have verified the authenticity of the plan's implementation with the law enforcement agency involved. Provides that law enforcement agencies and personnel, and other persons and groups are not civilly liable if they fail to participate in, or fail to implement, a missing vulnerable adult response and notification plan, and are not civilly liable for activating a plan in good faith. Defines "vulnerable adult" as a person 18 years of age or older who, because of a physical or mental impairment, is unable to meet the person's own needs or to seek help without assistance. **(SCS CSHB 59(STA))**

Effective Date: October 8, 2013

**Chapter 72** **ALASKA MILITARY YOUTH ACADEMY**

Changes the name of the Alaska Challenge Youth Academy to the Alaska Military Youth Academy and authorizes the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs to establish and operate the academy consistent with applicable federal law. Repeals the authorization of the Department of Education and Early Development to allocate funds to the academy. **(HB 180)**

Effective Date: January 1, 2014

**Chapter 73** **ELECTION PRACTICES AND PROCEDURES**

Allows the lieutenant governor to hold an election for an advisory school board in a regional education attendance area. Permits a United States citizen residing outside of the United States to register to vote in a federal election conducted in the state so long as the person is 18 years or older, has never been a resident of another state, territory, or possession of the United States, and the person's parent or legal guardian was domiciled in the state immediately before leaving the United States. Requires a poll watcher or member of the state ballot counting review to be a citizen of the United States. Clarifies that contributions may not be made to a candidate later than the 45th day after the date of the primary election if the candidate was on the primary ballot and was not nominated at the primary election. Exempts a political party from

the requirement to disclose the largest contributors to the party in a communication paid for by the political party. Requires a candidate seeking nomination by petition for state legislative or executive office to file certain financial disclosures before the primary election. Allows a person to keep their name confidential in a request or an advisory opinion from the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Permits certain municipal clerks to serve as absentee voting officials for the limited purpose of distributing absentee ballots. Provides that if an application for an absentee ballot from certain voters is received at least 45 days before an election, an absentee ballot will be sent to the voter not later than 45 days before that election. Shortens the period of time for a voter outside of the United States to return an absentee ballot cast in a primary election or special election for United States senator and representative. Moves the date of the state's primary election to the third Tuesday in August of even-numbered years. Requires earlier notification of the director of elections of a candidate's withdrawal from the primary election or general election in order to remove the candidate's name from the primary or general election ballot. Prohibits the filling of vacancies on the ballot by party petition within 63 days of the general election. Increases the number of days before the primary election in which the death, disqualification, or certification of incapacity of the incumbent office holder will not affect the counting and review of ballots. Requires earlier notice to the director of a judge's withdrawal in order for the judge's name to be removed from the general election ballot. Establishes a special run-off election for the office of United States senator or United States representative when no candidate for the office receives over 50 percent of the vote in the special election for the office. Provides for the timing of a special election and a special run-off election for the office of United States senator and United States representative and makes conforming changes for the new special run-off elections for United States senator or United States representative. Requires that the lieutenant governor prepare and publish a timely filed candidate photo and statement on the division's Internet website. Adds new definitions to the elections chapter. **(CSHB 104(2d JUD))**

**Chapter 14**    **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, and makes reappropriations. **(CCS HB 65)**

**Chapter 16**    **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Transfers funds from the general fund to the renewable energy grant fund, the regional educational attendance area school fund, the fish and game fund, and the regional educational attendance area and small municipal school district school fund. Appropriates \$25,000,000 to the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act reimbursement fund. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 18(FIN) am H)**


