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

#### SYNOPSES OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

#### Chapter 1 ALASKA LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' DAY

Establishes January 9 of each year as Alaska Law Enforcement Officers' Day. (CSHB 43(STA))

Effective Date:

July 2, 2015

#### Chapter 2 GREAT ALASKA GOOD FRIDAY EARTHQUAKE REMEMBRANCE DAY

Establishes March 27 as Great Alaska Good Friday Earthquake Remembrance Day. (CSHB 35(STA))

Effective Date:

July 17, 2015

#### Chapter 3 SCHOOL BOND DEBT REIMBURSEMENT

Puts a moratorium on state reimbursement for school construction bond debt authorized by voters on or after January 1, 2015. For school construction bond debt authorized by voters on or after July 1, 2020, state reimbursement is reinstated at a rate of 50 percent for certain projects, and 40 percent for other projects. (CSSB 64(EDC)(efd fld H))

Effective Date:

July 23, 2015; sections 1, 2, 4, and 5 are retroactive to

January 1, 2015

#### Chapter 4 MARIJUANA CONTROL BOARD

Creates the Marijuana Control Board (board). Sets the qualifications for the board members. Requires one board member from the public safety sector, one from the public health sector, one residing in a rural area, one actively engaged in the marijuana industry, and one person who is either from the general public or actively engaged in the marijuana industry. Allows only two board members to have a financial interest or have an immediate family member with a financial interest in the marijuana industry. Sets the term of office, provides for per diem and expenses, and requires board members to meet at least once each year in each judicial district of the state. Outlines the powers and duties of the board. States that the director of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board is the director of the board. Sets out the duties of the director. Prevents registration of a marijuana establishment if an owner, officer, or agent of the

marijuana establishment has been convicted of a felony within five years or is on probation or parole for a felony. (SCS CSHB 123(FIN))

#### Chapter 5 <u>EXTENDING THE TERMINATION DATE OF THE ALCOHOLIC</u> <u>BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD</u>

Extends the termination date of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to June 30, 2018. **(HB 116)**

#### Chapter 6 STATE LIBRARY, ARCHIVES, AND MUSE UM BUILDING IN JUNEAU

Names the state library, archives, and museum building in Juneau the Father Andrew P. Kashevaroff State Library, Archives, and Museum Building. Names the public reading room in that building the Representative Richard Foster Reading Room. (CSSB 63(STA))

Effective Date:

August 3, 2015

#### Chapter 7 ALASKA FIREFIGHTERS' DAY

Establishes the Sunday on or preceding October 9 of each year as Alaska Firefighters' Day. (SCS HB 56(STA))

Effective Date:

#### Chapter 8 ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION REVENUE BONDS

Authorizes the Alaska Railroad Corporation to issue revenue bonds to finance a positive train control rail transportation safety project that qualifies for federal financial participation. Limits the revenue bonds to \$37,000,000. (HB 140)

Effective Date:

May 6, 2015

#### Chapter 9 TIRE FEES

Requires a seller of tires to file a tire fee return to the Department of Revenue no later than the last day of each month. States that the Department of Revenue may only collect information related to tires subject to the tire fee on a form related to the tire fee. (HCS SB 33(FIN))

Effective Date:

May 12, 2015

#### Chapter 10 ARCTIC POLICY

Sets out legislative findings and intent related to the Arctic policy of the state. Codifies the Arctic policy of the state, including policy related to the environment, local communities and government, security, and indigenous culture of the Arctic. Supports the findings and recommendations of the Alaska Arctic Policy Commission. (SCS CSHB 1(STA))

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

## Chapter 11 INVESTMENT OF THE POWER COST EQUALIZATION ENDOWMENT FUND

Requires the commissioner of revenue to invest the power cost equalization endowment fund to achieve a four percent nominal return over a five-year period, replacing the previous seven percent nominal return requirement. (CSSB 34(FIN))

Effective Date: May 12, 2015

#### Chapter 12 NATURAL GAS PIPELINE RIGHT-OF-WAY LEASE

Allows the state to lease a right-of-way for a natural gas pipeline from the North Slope in specified parcels in Denali State Park, Captain Cook State Recreation Area, Nancy Lake State Recreation Area, and Willow Creek State Recreation Area, if the lease becomes effective before January 1, 2025. Removes the special purpose area designation of those specified parcels. Requires the Department of Natural Resources to manage the specified state-owned parcels as part of the park or recreation area until the land is leased under AS 38.35, and requires that the state-owned land revert to the park or recreation area once the pipeline lease terminates and restoration and revegetation is complete. Requires that any right-of-way lease allow for traditional public access along and across the leased land and that the lease terminate if pipeline construction does not begin within 10 years of the effective date of the lease. (HCS CSSB 70(RES))

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

#### Chapter 13 TAX ON POLICY PREMIUMS FOR LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES

Increases the tax rate on an individual life insurance policy to 0.08 percent of a policy year premium exceeding \$100,000, replacing the previous .001 percent rate. (SSSB 15)

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

#### Chapter 14 ROAD SERVICE AREA BOUNDARY CHANGES

Creates exceptions from the voting requirements for changes to road service areas in boroughs and unified municipalities so that under certain circumstances a vote is not required for a change to road service area boundaries to include or exclude a parcel that is located in more than one service area, or a parcel that is partially located in the road service area. (CSSB 19(CRA))

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

## Chapter 15 <u>CIVIL LIABILITY OF NONPROFIT OR UNIVERSITY FIRE</u> <u>DEPARTMENTS AND EMPLOYEES OR MEMBERS OF NONPROFIT OR</u> UNIVERSITY FIRE DEPARTMENTS

Provides immunity from tort or breach of contract suits for employees or members of nonprofit or university fire departments where a suit is based on the act or omission of an employee or member of the fire department. Allows for suits against a nonprofit or university fire department if the suit alleges intentional misconduct or gross negligence or is based on the act or omission of an employee or member of the fire department under contract with a private entity. Immunity covers a fire department registered with the state fire marshal that is either operated and maintained by a university or operated under contract with a municipality or village. (HCS CSSB 43(JUD))

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

#### Chapter 16 ADMINISTRATION OF VACCINES BY PHARMACISTS

Authorizes pharmacists to independently administer vaccines and related emergency medications in accordance with standards to be adopted by the Board of Pharmacy. (SB 71)

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

#### Chapter 17 ORDERS OF RESTITUTION

Allows the court to consider a victim's loss of income when determining the amount of restitution a convicted criminal must pay. Requires a court to value property at the market value of the property at the time and place of the crime when determining the amount of actual damage or loss for restitution. (SB 5)

Effective Date: August 9, 2015

## Chapter 18 <u>BOARD OF CERTIFIED DIRECT-ENTRY MIDWIVES -- TERMINATION</u> DATE AND INTERIM REPORTING

Extends the termination date of the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives to

June 30, 2017. Requires the legislative audit division to provide the legislature with a report concerning the status of the board's deficit and the board's compliance with recommendations set out in the division's June 30, 2014, audit of the board under AS 44.66. (SCS HB 26(L&C))

Effective Date:

May 15, 2015

#### Chapter 19 <u>AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR IMMUNITY</u>

Provides immunity from civil damages for a person who acquires or provides an automated external defibrillator device for use on a victim of a medical emergency, except in cases involving gross negligence. (HB 4)

Effective Date:

August 12, 2015

#### Chapter 20 CREDITS TOWARD A SENTENCE OF IMPRISONMENT

Allows a court to grant a credit against a sentence of imprisonment for time spent under electronic monitoring if the person has not committed a criminal offense while under electronic monitoring and the court imposes restrictions on the person's freedom of movement and behavior while under the electronic monitoring program, including, but not limited to, confinement to a residence except for a court appearance, a meeting with counsel, or court-ordered employment, educational or vocational training, community volunteer work, a rehabilitative activity, or a medical appointment. Adds a sentencing mitigator if the defendant successfully completes an alcohol and substance abuse monitoring program. (SCS CSHB 15(JUD))

Effective Date:

August 12, 2015

#### Chapter 21 CREAMER'S FIELD MIGRATORY WATERFOWL REFUGE

Adds state-owned land and water to the Creamer's Field Migratory Waterfowl Refuge. (SCS CSHB 70(RES))

Effective Date:

August 12, 2015

#### Chapter 22 CORRECTIVE AMENDMENTS: 2015 REVISOR'S BILL

Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the revisor of statutes. (SB 35)

Effective Date:

Section 35 takes effect July 1, 2015; remainder of Act takes

effect May 15, 2015

#### Chapter 23 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, amends appropriations, and makes appropriations. (CCS HB 72(brf sup maj fld H))

Effective Date: Sections 31, 32(c), 33, 35, and 36 take effect June 30, 2015;

remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2015; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2015 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2015, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2015, solely for the purpose of carrying

forward a prior fiscal year balance

#### Chapter 24 MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for the fiscal year 2016. (CCS HB 73)

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 25 PALMER HAY FLATS STATE GAME REFUGE

Adds state-owned land to the Palmer Hay Flats State Game Refuge. (SCS CSHB 153(RES))

Effective Date: August 17, 2015

#### Chapter 26 MEDICAID: DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

Gives the Department of Health and Social Services discretion to require recipients of medical assistance to purchase used or refurbished durable medical equipment if the equipment is less expensive than new equipment, can withstand at least three years of use, and equally meets the needs of the recipient. (CSHB 161(HSS))

Effective Date: May 20, 2015

#### Chapter 27 PRACTICE OF MANICURING; NAIL TECHNICIANS

Changes the qualifications for a license to practice manicuring by requiring an applicant to complete 250 hours of instruction, pass an examination, and serve an apprenticeship. Authorizes a person licensed to practice manicuring to use the title "nail technician." Eliminates the advanced manicurist endorsement. Allows a current licensee to practice under an existing license if, before August 31, 2017, the licensee provides proof that the licensee has completed 250 hours work experience as

a manicurist and has taken the required examination. Authorizes the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers to adopt regulations to implement the new requirements. (HB 131 am)

Effective Date: Section 14 takes effect May 27, 2015; remainder of Act takes

effect January 1, 2016

#### Chapter 28 ALASKA MUNICIPAL BOND BANK AUTHORITY

Allows the Alaska Municipal Bond Bank Authority to issue bonds or notes to regional health organizations in principal amounts not to exceed \$205,000,000 at any one time. Limits the Alaska Municipal Bond Bank Authority's financing for regional health organizations to 50 percent of a single project and no more than \$102,500,000 for a single project. Allows joint action agencies to obtain financing from the Alaska Bond Bank Authority. (CSSB 46(FIN))

Effective Date: May 27, 2015

#### Chapter 29 ROTH CONTRIBUTION PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYEES

Allows the administrator of deferred compensation programs for public employees in the state to enter into contracts for which state and federal income tax is either paid before investment, or deferred until benefits are received. Allows an employer to designate whether contributions are tax-deferred or not, and provides that in the absence of a designation, contributions will be considered tax-deferred. Makes the employee contributions subject to dollar limits established in federal law. Allows the administrator to establish rules and procedures governing public employee participation in deferred compensation programs. Requires the administrator to allocate each employee's contributions to an account that defers taxes until benefits are paid, or an account that taxes earnings and pays post-tax benefits to the employee. (HB 135)

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 30 CHILDREN'S DAY

Establishes the second Sunday of June of each year as Children's Day. (HB 180(efd add))

Effective Date: June 2, 2015

#### Chapter 31 WORKERS' COMPENSATION FEES

Changes the effective date of sec. 5, ch. 63, SLA 2014, from July 1, 2015, to December 1, 2015, allowing the medical services review committee more time to establish fee schedules and other items related to fees and charges for workers' compensation medical treatment and services. (HB 178)

Effective Date: June 2, 2015

#### Chapter 32 UNIFORM INTERSTATE FAMILY SUPPORT ACT

Updates state laws relating to the recovery of child support to conform to the 2008 Uniform Interstate Family Support Act. Adds new sections pertaining to the enforcement of child support orders in international cases that fall under the Hague Convention on the International Recovery of Child Support and Other Forms of Family Maintenance. (CSHB 106(STA) am)

Effective Date: Section 104 takes effect June 3, 2015; remainder of Act takes

effect July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 33 ALASKA WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Adds a veteran's seat to the Alaska Workforce Investment Board; reduces from five to four the number of additional private members who can be added to the board to ensure a private sector majority and regional and local representation. (HB 46)

Effective Date: August 31, 2015

#### Chapter 34 INSURANCE SOLVENCY AND RISK MANAGEMENT

Amends provisions relating to requirements governing risk based capital for insurers and fraternal benefit societies. Amends provisions relating to oversight of insurance holding companies. Requires insurers to maintain a risk management framework. Requires insurers to conduct an own risk and solvency assessment and report. Amends operating requirements for controlling insurance producers and producer-controlled insurers. (SB 107)

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 35 REPEALING FILM PRODUCTION TAX CREDIT

Repeals the film production tax credit and related statutory provisions and citations. Preserves the state's right to review, audit, or bring legal proceedings against a film producer who is liable for damages to the state. Phases out the film production tax credit by providing a deadline of January 1, 2019, for a film producer to submit a

production cost report and by authorizing the Department of Revenue to continue to administer the film production tax credit program during its phase out. (CSSB 39 (L&C) am H)

Effective Date: Sections 1, 3, 5 - 7, and 9 - 11 take effect July 1, 2015; section

2 takes effect on the effective date of section 14, ch. 61, SLA 2014; section 4 takes effect on the effective date of section 17, ch. 61, SLA 2014; remainder of Act takes effect June 16,

2015

#### Chapter 36 OPTIONAL MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS

Amends the deteriorated property municipal tax exemption, which authorizes a municipality to partially or totally exempt deteriorated property from taxation. Amends the definition of deteriorated property to include residential property that is located in a deteriorating or deteriorated area and is owned by an entity that also owns at least one other residential property in the deteriorating or deteriorated area and at least eight residential units among the properties. Also amends the definition of deteriorated property to include a commercial property or multi-unit residential property with at least eight units that has a structure on it that is older than 15 years and has not undergone substantial rehabilitation, renovation, demolition, removal, or replacement. Authorizes a municipality to partially or wholly exempt from taxation an increase in the assessed value of property that results when the owner subdivides a single parcel into three or more parcels, including improvements made to the property because of the subdivision. Allows a municipality to create the subdivided property exemption by ordinance and authorizes a municipality to either terminate or continue the exemption when a lot in the subdivision is sold or a residential or commercial use is established on a lot in the subdivision. (SCS CSHB 146(CRA))

Effective Date: September 25, 2015

#### Chapter 37 <u>REFINED FUEL SURCHARGE</u>

Creates a refined fuel surcharge of \$.0095 per gallon of refined fuel. Applies the tax to each user of fuel refined on which the surcharge has not been paid and each dealer of refined fuel. Directs that proceeds from the refined fuel surcharge may be appropriated to the oil and hazardous substance release prevention account of the oil and hazardous substance release prevention and response fund. Exempts certain types of refined fuel from the surcharge. Amends statutes related to the motor fuel tax (AS 43.40) to clarify which portions of that chapter apply to the motor fuel tax, the refined fuel surcharge, or both. Directs that funds from the aviation fuel account may be appropriated for capital or operating costs of airports. Creates in statute the qualified dealer license for every dealer selling fuel. Makes information contained in a license of a qualified dealer public. (SCS CSHB 158(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 38 CAPITAL BUDGET

Makes appropriations for capital projects. Amends prior appropriations and reappropriates money from prior appropriations for capital projects and other purposes. Makes supplemental appropriations for the operation of the state government for fiscal year 2015. Capitalizes funds. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations. (HCS CSSB 26(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: The appropriation made in section 15 is conditional; sections

4, 7, 10 - 21, 42, 44(c), and 45 take effect June 30, 2015; sections 25, 26, 27(a), 27(b), 27(d), 28 - 39, 41, and 43 take effect June 30, 2015; remainder of Act takes effect July 1,

2015

## Chapter 39 <u>ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY</u> BONDS, PROGRAMS, AND LOANS

Amends limits for bonds issued by the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA). Increases the maximum amount of a loan participation funded by assets of or bonds issued by AIDEA for a qualified energy project. Repeals certain unused bond authorizations. Requires AIDEA to obtain legislative approval before entering into a gas supply contract with a natural gas producer to supply gas to Interior Alaska utilities unless the contract is for a natural gas liquefaction plant or distribution system owned by AIDEA. Prohibits AIDEA from using the sustainable energy transmission and supply development fund to purchase natural gas reserves or become a working interest owner of a natural gas lease. Changes the definition of "qualified energy development" to include a small-diameter pipeline transporting gas to Interior Alaska and propane projects. Changes the 2013 legislative approval for the Interior Energy Project in uncodified law to require that the project provide natural gas to Interior Alaska as a primary market and requires that AIDEA first approve a project plan by resolution. Removes the requirement that the affiliated infrastructure be on the North Slope. Includes propane in the definition of "natural gas" for the Interior Energy Project. Requires AIDEA to submit a report to the legislature each quarter on the status of the Interior Energy Project and to provide the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee with a briefing on the Interior Energy Project on request. (SCS CSHB 105(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 40 NATIVE CORPORATION CHANGE TO ARTICLES

Allows Native corporations incorporated under former AS 10.05 before July 1, 1989, to amend their articles of incorporation to lower the quorum necessary to hold a meeting of shareholders. Establishes the approval vote needed for the amendment. Prohibits a Native corporation from using the lower quorum to adopt other amendments of its articles. (HB 149 am)

Effective Date: October 14, 2015

#### SECOND SPECIAL SESSION

#### Chapter 1 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, makes appropriations for the operating expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental heath program, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, and makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund. (CCS HB 2001)

Effective Date:

sections 12(a), 13, 17, and 18(a) take effect June 30, 2015; sections 15 and 16 take effect June 30, 2015; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2015; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2015 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2015, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2015, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

### Chapter 2 SCHOOL DISTRICTS: COURSES, QUESTIONNAIRES, EXAMS, DUTIES AND TRAINING

Makes various changes to the requirements of school districts and the state boarding school, including repealing the college and career readiness testing, modifying course mastery opportunities, requiring written permission to administer a questionnaire, repealing physical exam requirements, allowing exchange of criminal history information for a teacher applying to work in a child care facility, and establishing procedures and schedules for providing specified school training, including sexual assault and dating violence training described in the bill to begin in 2017. Also modifies mandatory reporter requirements and training for regular volunteers who have reasonable cause to suspect child abuse or neglect. Establishes an Alaska Safe Children's Act Task Force in the Department of Education and Early Development to provide recommendations to the department for model curricula and teacher training materials for use by school districts related to suicide prevention, sexual assault awareness and prevention, dating violence awareness and prevention, and alcohol and drug disabilities and education. (SCS CSHB 44(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1, 4, 10, 14, and 20 - 24 take effect June 30, 2017;

section 25 takes effect June 30, 2016; section 15 takes effect July 1, 2016; remainder of Act takes effect October 7, 2015

Makes supplemental appropriations for the operation of the state government for fiscal year 2015. Capitalizes funds. Makes other fund transfers and appropriations. (HCS CSSB 26(FIN) am H)

Effective Date:

The appropriation made in section 15 is conditional; sections 4, 7, 10 - 21, 42, 44(c), and 45 take effect June 30, 2015; sections 25, 26, 27(a), 27(b), 27(d), 28 - 39, 41, and 43 take effect June 30, 2015; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2015

#### Chapter 1 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, makes appropriations for the operating expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental heath program, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, and makes appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund. (CCS HB 2001)

Effective Date:

Sections 12(a), 13, 17, and 18(a) take effect June 30, 2015; sections 15 and 16 take effect June 30, 2015; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2015; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2015 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2015, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2015, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance


# BILLS VETOED BY GOVERNOR WALKER 2015

## THE ALASKA GASLINE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, THE ALASKA LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS PROJECT, AND THE IN-STATE NATURAL GAS PIPELINE

Prohibits the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation (AGDC) from marketing the gas of an entity other than itself without express written consent from that entity. Prohibits AGDC from expending money from the in-state natural gas pipeline fund to develop a pipeline carrying gas primarily for export before the date the state or another party withdraws from an Alaska liquefied natural gas project, the date the state or other parties enter into certain contractual agreements for an Alaska liquefied natural gas project, or July 1, 2017, whichever comes first. (CSHB 132 (L&C))

#### **GUARDIAN AND CONSERVATOR APPOINTMENTS**

Allows a court to appoint a person as a guardian of an incapacitated person or conservator of a protected person even if the person has a conflict of interest. Directs the court to make appropriate written findings about the basis for making the appointment despite the conflict of interest. (SCS HB 5(JUD))
