SYNOPSES OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

**SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER
2024**

Chapter 1 **SCHOOL INTERNET FUNDING**

Increases the maximum internet speed for a school district to be eligible for subsidized internet funding from the state from 25 megabits to 100 megabits of download per second. **(HB 193)**

Effective Date: March 28, 2024

Chapter 2 **BRAIN INJURY AWARENESS MONTH**

Establishes March as Brain Injury Awareness Month in the state. **(HCS SB 46(STA))**

Effective Date: April 24, 2024

Chapter 3 **FISHERMEN'S FUND**

Changes the amount of benefits that may be paid from the fishermen's fund to a fisherman for a qualifying injury or heart attack, depending on the balance of the fishermen's fund. Changes the amount of benefits that may be paid to a vessel owner. Changes the definition of "occupational disease" that applies to the fishermen's fund statutes to include viral infections. **(CSSB 93(L&C) am)**

Effective Date: April 24, 2024

Chapter 4 **HEAD START PROGRAM; ALASKA PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; EDUCATION TAX CREDITS; THE ALASKA WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD; GRANTS FOR TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION**

Requires the Department of Education and Early Development to make a grant to each head start agency operating a head start program equal to the amount of the head start program's nonfederal contributions required under 42 U.S.C. 9835. Expands and increases the Alaska Performance Scholarship Program. Expands the insurance tax education credit, the income tax education credit, the oil or gas producer education credit, the property tax education credit, the mining business education credit, the fisheries business education credit, and the fisheries resource landing tax education credit and extends the sunset of those tax credits until January 1, 2029. Expands the institutions eligible for money appropriated for the

Alaska Workforce Investment Board and increases mandatory employee contributions to the board under AS 23.15.835(a). **(SCS CSHB 148(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect July 1, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect June 27, 2024

Chapter 5 SALARY INCREASES FOR CERTAIN STATE EMPLOYEES

Increases salaries on the salary schedule for certain state employees in 2024, 2025, and 2026. Provides for further increases to the salary schedule in conjunction with increases received by the Supervisory Union after 2026. Extends the salary schedule increases to additional employees in the executive and judicial branches. Removes a limitation on step increases for the chief administrative law judge.
(HCS CSSB 259(FIN))

Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Chapter 6 MATT GLOVER BIKE PATH

Names a bike path in Fairbanks the Matt Glover Bike Path and requires the Department of Transportation to create and erect signage dedicating the bike path.
(SB 129)

Effective Date: September 24, 2024

Chapter 7 APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, amends appropriations, and makes supplemental appropriations and reappropriations.
(CCS HB 268(Corrected))

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 37, 40(e), and 50(d) are conditional; section 59 takes effect June 28, 2024; sections 11 - 13, 14(a), 15, 17(b) - (r), 20, 21(b), 22, 24 - 27, 48(d), 50(e) and (f), and 57 take effect June 30, 2024; sections 5 - 7 and 43(b) take effect January 1, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2024; sections 8 - 10, 14(b), 16, 17(a), 18, 19, 21(a), and 23 are retroactive to May 15, 2024; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2024 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2024, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2024, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 8 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations, capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and appropriations to capitalize funds. Amends appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 187(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: The appropriation made in section 13 is conditional; section 24 takes effect June 28, 2024; sections 14, 15, 16(a), and 17 - 22 take effect June 30, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2024; sections 4 - 9 are retroactive to May 15, 2024

Chapter 9 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for fiscal year 2025. **(CCS HB 270)**

Effective date: The appropriations made in section 1 are conditional; Act takes effect July 1, 2024

Chapter 10 **JUNETEENTH DAY**

Establishes June 19 of each year as the legal holiday of Juneteenth Day. **(SB 22)**

Effective Date: September 25, 2024

Chapter 11 **CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE; INVOLUNTARY CIVIL COMMITMENT; RULES 4 AND 5, ALASKA RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE; RULE 6(s), ALASKA RULES OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE**

Amends the statute defining murder in the second degree to criminalize the knowing manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance when another person dies as a direct result of ingestion of the substance. Establishes the crime of assault in the presence of a child. Amends the statute on human trafficking in the second degree to criminalize certain ways a defendant may induce or cause another person to engage in adult entertainment or labor. Changes the term "child pornography" to "child sexual abuse material" throughout the statutes. Amends the statute on sex trafficking in the second degree to include ways a defendant could induce or cause another person to engage in a commercial sexual act. Establishes the crime of patron of a victim of sex trafficking. Amends the statute on misconduct involving a controlled substance in the first degree to include delivery to a person who is mentally incapable, incapacitated, or unaware that a controlled substance is being delivered. Amends the statute on misconduct involving a controlled substance in the second degree to include delivery of methamphetamine or its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, or the immediate precursors of those, and increases the sentencing range for a conviction of misconduct involving a controlled substance in the second degree. Increases the applicable amount of listed chemicals in possession under the

misconduct involving a controlled substance in the second degree statute from six grams to nine grams. Reduces the number of court appointed psychiatrists or psychologists that a court is required to appoint when a defendant has filed a notice of intent to rely on the affirmative defense of insanity from two to one. Allows the court to order a defendant to be examined or receive further evaluation or treatment at an outpatient clinic or other facility as part of a condition of release. Allows consecutive terms of imprisonment during sentencing for two or more violation of conditions of release offenses. Includes the crime of patron of a victim of sex trafficking in the definition of "sexual felony." Amends registration requirements for sex offenders and child kidnappers. Amends the definition of "domestic violence" and "crime involving domestic violence" to include a perpetrator's interference with a report of a crime involving domestic violence and unlawful contact. Expands the purpose of the multidisciplinary child protection team to include assisting in the evaluation and investigation of reports of sexual contact or sexual penetration between children under 13 years of age. Adds new requirements relating to detention for evaluation after a person has been found incompetent. Repeals and reenacts procedures required after an ex parte order authorizing hospitalization for evaluation is issued. Adds victim notification requirements when a respondent is detained for evaluation. Adds requirements relating to the provision of records and notice following a finding of incompetency in a criminal case. Creates a two-year involuntary commitment process. Retroactively enacts sections relating to the duty to register as a sex offender in the state. Directly amends Rule 6(s), Alaska Rules of Criminal Procedure, to allow witnesses to be presented to a grand jury to summarize evidence if the admissible evidence will be available at trial and amends the type of hearsay evidence allowed to be presented to a grand jury. Requires the Department of Corrections to contract with a statewide Alaska native organization to study the reasons Alaska Natives make up 40 percent of the state's prison population. Requires the Department of Corrections to contract with an organization to study the reasons certain racial groups are overrepresented in the state's prison population when compared to the proportion of those populations in the state.
(SCS CSHB 66(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: Section 60 takes effect July 12, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2025

Chapter 12 WORKERS' COMPENSATION; ALASKA SENIOR BENEFITS PAYMENT PROGRAM

Establishes a workers' compensation stay-at-work benefits program. Makes changes to the workers' compensation reemployment benefits process. Changes the date by which the reemployment benefits administrator must submit to the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development a report of reemployment benefits provided under the Alaska Workers' Compensation Act. Increases the maximum allowable amount of workers' compensation reemployment plan costs. Allows payment of costs incurred for specialized job modification devices or services and reasonable travel and relocation expenses associated with searching for new employment, returning to work in a new location, and attendance at an on-the-job

training program. Establishes the workers' compensation benefits guaranty fund as a separate fund in the state treasury. Requires that notice of an employee's injury or death be given to an employer within 15 days after the date of the injury or death. Establishes for certain employees a presumption of compensability for a claim for compensation as a result of post-traumatic stress disorder. Extends the Alaska senior benefits payment program until June 30, 2034. **(HCS CSSB 147(L&C) am H)**

Effective Date: Section 18 takes effect July 12, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2025

Chapter 13 TELEHEALTH, MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAMS, AND THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE

Expands telehealth services to permit an out-of-state member of a physician's multidisciplinary team to provide health care services through telehealth to a patient located in the state, if that service is not reasonably available from an in-state provider. Provides grounds for imposition of disciplinary sanctions on out-of-state multidisciplinary team members and establishes a range of possible sanctions the department may impose. Permits the department to summarily prohibit a multidisciplinary team member from practicing in the state when it determines that continued practice poses a clear and immediate danger to public health, and provides that the member is entitled to a hearing in this circumstance. Permits the department to renew the registration of businesses performing telehealth services in the state every two years if a business meets all renewal requirements and pays a renewal fee; establishes fees for telehealth businesses. **(CSSB 91 (FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: October 16, 2024

Chapter 14 FIREFIGHTING SUBSTANCES

Establishes a firefighting substances disposal reimbursement program in the Department of Environmental Conservation. Prohibits the use of firefighting foams that contain perfluoroalkyl substances or polyfluoroalkyl substances, except when a fire originates in relation to oil or gas production, transmission, transportation, or refining. Directs the state fire marshal to require the use of an alternative firefighting foam, including for fires related to oil and gas, if the fire marshal determines the alternative firefighting foam is safe and effective. **(HCS CSSB 67(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 23, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2025

Chapter 15 **BOARDS AND COMMISSION EXTENSIONS; CHILD CARE TAX CREDITS; CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE ELIGIBILITY; BIG GAME GUIDE CONCESSION AREA AND PERMITTING PROGRAM**

Extends the termination date of the Big Game Commercial Services Board, the Board of Massage Therapists, the Alaska Commission on Aging, and the Marijuana Control Board. Provides authority and direction for the Board of Game to consider proposals to establish a big game guide concession area to be administered by the Department of Natural Resources and establishes a big game guide concession area permit program. Provides tax credits to eligible employers for expenditures or donations of equipment to child care facilities, or for cash payments to employees, to support or offset employee child care expenses. Increases the current education tax credit limit and provides for inflation-based increases beginning January 1, 2030. Increases the income limits for families seeking child care assistance, and requires the Department of Health to establish a program to partner with the private sector to create incentives for employers to develop employee child care. Caps the contribution for families eligible for day care assistance to seven percent of the family monthly income. Changes the grant eligibility criteria for child care facilities, by requiring the facility to prioritize children from low-income families when filling child care openings, and to be designated a " quality child care facility" by the department. **(HCS SB 189(RLS) am H)**

Effective Date: Section 31 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect July 23, 2024

Chapter 16 **AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS AWARENESS MONTH**
Establishes May as Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month. **(SB 256)**

Effective Date: July 25, 2024

Chapter 17 **STATE TIMBER SALES**

Changes the requirements for conducting expedited sales of state timber. Changes the terms and conditions for negotiated sales of state timber resources to local manufacturers of wood products and users of wood fiber. Requires the Department of Natural Resources to provide the 34th Legislature a report concerning certain state timber sales conducted between July 1, 2024, and July 1, 2025, and planned timber sales that did not occur. The report must include related recommendations and information. **(SCS CSHB 104(RES))**

Effective Date: October 27, 2024

Chapter 18 **ALASKA MILITARY AFFAIRS COMMISSION, JOINT ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE, JUDGE ADVOCATES, MILITARY FACILITY ZONES, AND ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL**

Establishes the Alaska Military Affairs Commission. Updates the list of organizations from which recommendations are required to be considered when appointing one of the members of the Joint Armed Services Committee. Amends the requirements to serve as the assistant adjutant general. Adds members of the Space Force to the list of those who may serve as a judge advocate under the code of military justice. Amends the definition of "facility" applicable to the military facility zone statutes to include facilities of a state military or civilian agency serving a subdivision of the United States Space Force. **(SCS CSHB 155(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 2 - 5 take effect July 30, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect October 27, 2024

Chapter 19 **TEMPORARY PERMITS FOR NURSES WITH LAPSED LICENSES**

Authorizes the Board of Nursing to issue a nonrenewable temporary permit, valid for six months, to a person applying for the reinstatement of a lapsed license to practice registered, advanced practice registered, or practical nursing. **(HB 237)**

Effective Date: October 27, 2024

Chapter 20 **MOTOR VEHICLE WARRANTY WORK**

Requires a manufacturer to provide each of its new motor vehicle dealers with a schedule of compensation that includes the rates and time allowances for warranty work. Requires the time allowances in a schedule of compensation to be no less than the time allowances in independent labor time guides. Prohibits a manufacturer from recovering the manufacturer's costs for compensating a new motor vehicle dealer for warranty work by reducing the amount due to the dealer or imposing a separate charge upon the dealer. **(CSHB 233(TRA) am)**

Effective Date: October 27, 2024

Chapter 21 **CERTIFICATES OF FITNESS FOR PLUMBERS AND ELECTRICIANS**

Extends the duration that trainee level certificates of fitness for plumbers and electricians are valid. Authorizes the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to adopt regulations providing for issuance of a provisional certificate of fitness to an applicant who has applied for a certificate of fitness in the state and has a comparable certificate in another jurisdiction. Authorizes the department to reissue trainee level certificates of fitness issued within two years before the effective date of the Act without requiring the certificate holder to reapply or pay a fee. **(HCS SB 204(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: July 31, 2024

Chapter 22 **DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING BY EMPLOYERS**

Adds "oral fluid" to the types of samples an employer may collect from an employee or prospective employee, consistent with the employer's drug and alcohol testing policy. **(SB 196)**

Effective Date: October 28, 2024

Chapter 23 **CARBON CAPTURE AND NATURAL RESOURCES**

Enacts a comprehensive system for storing carbon on state land. Requires that certain royalties relating to carbon storage be deposited in the Alaska permanent fund, amends the licensing process for geothermal resources, amends the calculation of a just and reasonable rate under the Alaska Public Utilities Regulatory Act, disallows the use of federal carbon oxide sequestration credits when calculating tax due under the Alaska Net Income Tax Act, excludes certain costs related to carbon capture and carbon storage from lease expenditures allowed under the Oil and Gas Production Tax, and directs the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority to grant reserve-based loans for oil and gas development projects in the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin. **(SCS CSHB 50(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date: Section 61 takes effect August 1, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect October 29, 2024

Chapter 24 **RAILBELT TRANSMISSION ORGANIZATION; UTILITY REGULATION**

Establishes the Railbelt Transmission Organization to administer a nondiscriminatory open access transmission tariff for the electric transmission system in the Railbelt that eliminates per-unit wholesale charges and equitably allocates costs to operate the transmission system. Raises qualifications and salaries for commissioners of the Regulatory Commission of Alaska. Permits the commission to consider whether the purpose of an electric utility's rate is to increase diversity of supply, promote load growth, or enhance energy reliability or energy security. Requires advance approval by the commission for wholesale power agreements between public utilities and independent power producers. Exempts low-megawatt-hour electric transmission systems from participation in electric reliability organizations. Clarifies that the commission may exercise its general powers and adopt regulations necessary to implement statutes granting partial exemptions from commission regulation. Modifies required terms for renewable energy project loans. Prevents state and local taxation of new electricity generation and storage facilities that are operated by public utilities or that provide power only to public utilities. Increases the maximum amount of the regulatory cost charge paid by utilities and pipeline carriers. Provides energy-related qualifications for Alaska Energy Authority board members and updated board procedures. Authorizes the authority to employ individuals in the exempt service and acquire battery and other energy storage systems. **(SCS CSHB 307(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 1, 2024

Chapter 25 **STATE FINANCING AND LOAN PROGRAMS: COMMERCIAL FISHING LOANS; ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION MORTGAGE LOANS; AND FINANCING OF SUSTAINABLE ENERGY DEVELOPMENT**

Temporarily decreases minimum interest rate for commercial fishing loans and increases maximum loan amount. Removes loan-to-value ratio limitation on first mortgage loans and simplifies loan-to-value calculations for second mortgage loans issued by the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation. Allows Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to create a subsidiary corporation to finance sustainable energy development projects. Permits Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to provide technical assistance to public, quasi-public, and nonprofit entities that finance sustainable energy development projects. **(CSHB 273(L&C) am S)**

Effective Date: Sections 2, 4, and 6 take effect July 1, 2027; remainder of Act takes effect August 1, 2024

Chapter 26 **MILITARY AND VETERANS BIDDER PREFERENCE AND HELP DESK**

Establishes a bidder preference in the State Procurement Code for bidders that employ a person enrolled in a United States Department of Defense SkillBridge or United States Army career skills program. Establishes the military and veteran family help desk in the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs. **(SB 154 am H)**

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect August 2, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect October 30, 2024

Chapter 27 **HONOR AND REMEMBER FLAG AND HONOR AND SACRIFICE FLAG**

Designates the Honor and Remember Flag as the official symbol of the state for recognizing and honoring fallen members of the armed forces of the United States and their families. Designates the Honor and Sacrifice Flag as the official symbol of the state for recognizing and honoring fallen firefighters and law enforcement officers and their families. Establishes the locations and days these official symbols may be displayed. **(CSSB 174(CRA))**

Effective Date: AS 44.09.097(c)(3), enacted by section 1, is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect November 11, 2024

Chapter 28 **PROPERTY TAXES AND PROPERTY ASSESSMENT**

Removes a restriction on exempting economic development property from taxation that applied to municipalities that are school districts. Changes the requirements for an optional municipal tax exemption that applies to farm land and farm structures. Requires the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to develop standards for property assessment, requires municipal property assessors to have a certain certification, and requires municipal property assessors to meet with property owners to answer questions about an assessment. Changes how the

governing body of a municipality may appoint a board of equalization, prohibits a board of equalization from raising a property assessment during an appeal, and prohibits municipalities or the state from levying a tax on the transfer of real property. **(HCS CSSB 179(RLS))**

Effective Date: Sections 12, 13, and 15 - 17 take effect January 1, 2025; section 14 takes effect January 1, 2026; sections 3 - 11 and 25 take effect August 14, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect November 11, 2024

Chapter 29 COMMUNITY ENERGY FACILITIES

Requires electric utilities to provide community energy programs that allow utility customers to purchase renewable energy from centralized community energy facilities. Directs the Regulatory Commission of Alaska to adopt rates and requirements related to community energy programs and community energy facilities. **(HCS CSSB 152(ENE))**

Effective Date: November 11, 2024

Chapter 30 ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION BUILDING

Authorizes the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to acquire or purchase a building it occupies in Anchorage, Alaska, for no more than \$8,000,000. **(SB 205 am)**

Effective Date: August 17, 2024

Chapter 31 MARICULTURE AND STATE TIDELINE AND MARICULTURAL RELATED LEASES

Authorizes geoduck seed transfer between a certified hatchery and an aquatic farm located in a fisheries management area that is contiguous to an island in the Aleutian Chain. Provides that state tidelands may be excluded from consideration for carbon management purposes if another person has applied to lease the land for an aquatic farm or related hatchery. Requires notice of a potential lease for carbon management purposes to certain persons involved with aquatic farming and related hatcheries. Changes lease terms, the existing lessee preference, and the criteria for approval of a lease of state land for an aquatic farm or related hatchery site. **(CSHB 329(FSH) am)**

Effective Date: November 20, 2024

Chapter 32 **SALE OF HATCHERY-PRODUCED SALMONIDS**

Authorizes a hatchery operator to sell hatchery-produced salmonids to a person authorized to transport fish under regulations adopted under AS 16.05.251, for the purpose of stocking a lake in the state. (SCS CSHB 295(RES))

Effective Date: November 20, 2024

Chapter 33 **FIREWORKS**

Directs the Department of Public Safety to adopt regulations for fireworks, changes the process for obtaining a permit to sell consumer fireworks or a license to sell wholesale fireworks, establishes pyrotechnic licenses for the purpose of possessing display fireworks, amends the definition of "explosive" in the criminal code, and repeals a statute section relating to dangerous fireworks. (SCS CSHB 146(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 11 takes effect August 25, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect November 22, 2024

Chapter 34 **BOARD OF AGRICULTURE; LOANS MADE BY BOARD OF AGRICULTURE; PREPARATION AND SALE OF HOMEMADE FOOD; ACQUISITION OF UNINSPECTED MEAT THROUGH AN OWNERSHIP INTEREST**

Relates to the membership of the Board of Agriculture and Conservation. Expands the purposes for which the board may make a loan and increases the amounts that the board may loan. Exempts certain homemade foods from state labeling, licensing, packing, permitting, and inspection requirements and provides how the foods may be used and sold. Provides that a person may acquire meat from a producer by way of an ownership interest in the animal. (SCS CSHB 251(L&C) am S)

Effective Date: Sections 1, 3, 5, 7, and 8 take effect August 25, 2024; sections 2, 4, and 6 take effect July 1, 2025

Chapter 35 **4-H DAY**

Establishes the first Wednesday of October each year as 4-H Day. Provides that 4-H Day may be observed by suitable observances and exercises by civic groups and the public. (HB 337)

Effective Date: November 22, 2024

Chapter 36 **TEACHER CERTIFICATES FOR RETIRED TEACHERS, TEACHER SALARIES AND BONUSES**

Allows a teacher certificated as retired to teach as a long-term substitute teacher for up to 165 consecutive days each school term. Allows a school district to pay an incentive bonus to a teacher who holds a current and valid national board

certification and requires a school district or the Department of Education and Early Development to reimburse a teacher for certain costs associated with obtaining national board certification. Repeals the laws limiting the number of years of out-of-state teaching experience that may be substituted for in-state teaching experience in teacher salary scales. **(SCS HB 230(EDC) am S (efd add S))**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect August 27, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect November 24, 2024

Chapter 37 DELEGATION OF ROUTINE SERVICES OF OPTOMETRY

Requires the Board of Examiners in Optometry to adopt regulations authorizing a licensed optometrist to delegate routine services of optometry. **(HB 309)**

Effective Date: November 26, 2024

Chapter 38 MEDICAL REVIEW ORGANIZATIONS

Allows a medical review organization to publish reports containing data or information obtained in the exercise of its duties, including reports identifying trends, patterns, and risk factors, analyzing the rate and cause of death in the state, and relating to methods of intervention or prevention related to causes of death. Amends the definitions of "health care provider" and "review organization" in the chapter relating to medical review organizations. **(HB 371)**

Effective Date: November 26, 2024

Chapter 39 INSURANCE DATA SECURITY; COVERAGE FOR MAMMOGRAMS

Establishes insurance data security requirements. Requires insurance licensees to develop, implement, and maintain a comprehensive written information security program. Sets information security program requirements. Creates investigation and notification requirements following a cybersecurity event. Requires that certain information relating to data security remain confidential but allows the director of insurance access to select information. Provides for enforcement and penalties for failure to comply with certain data security requirements. Requires insurance coverage for mammograms. **(HCS CSSB 134(JUD))**

Effective Date: Section 6 takes effect August 30, 2024; AS 21.23.290(a)(3) and (4) and (c), enacted by section 1, take effect January 1, 2025; AS 21.23.250 and AS 21.23.260(a), (b), (c)(1) – (6) and (9) – (11), and (d) – (g), enacted by section 1, take effect January 1, 2026; AS 21.23.260(c)(7) and (8), enacted by section 1, take effect January 1, 2027; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2025

Chapter 40 **CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMISSION ON FEDERAL MANAGEMENT AREAS IN ALASKA**

Reestablishes the Citizens' Advisory Commission on Federal Management Areas in Alaska. Requires that the non-legislator members of the commission represent each of the judicial districts and limits the number of those members who may be from any one judicial district. Establishes additional qualifications for two members of the commission. Requires the commission to determine which matters the commission reviews and advises upon. Prohibits the commission from reviewing matters related to public use on private land. Establishes a June 30, 2031, sunset date for the commission. **(HCS CSSB 34(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 30, 2024

Chapter 41 **DIRECT HEALTH CARE AGREEMENTS**

Allows health care providers and businesses to enter into direct health care agreements with patients if certain conditions are met. Establishes requirements for direct health care agreements. **(HCS CSSB 45(2d L&C) am H(efd add H))**

Effective Date: January 1, 2025

Chapter 42 **PHYSICAL AND OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY LICENSURE**

Enters the state into the Interstate Physical Therapy Licensure Compact, and enacts the compact into law. Requires the evaluation of criminal justice information and a national criminal history record check to obtain licensure as a physical therapist, physical therapist assistant, occupational therapist, or occupational therapist assistant, but exempts from the requirement a person who held a valid license under AS 08.84 on July 1, 2024. **(CSSB 74(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 31, 2024

Chapter 43 **AUDIOLOGIST AND SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST LICENSURE**

Enacts the audiology and speech-language interstate compact. Requires the evaluation of criminal justice information and a national criminal history record check to obtain licensure as an audiologist or speech-language pathologist, unless the person holds a valid license under AS 08.11 on July 1, 2024. **(CSSB 75(FIN))**

Effective Date: August 31, 2024

Chapter 44 **HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS, HEALTHCARE FACILITIES, AND MEDICAL REVIEW ORGANIZATIONS**

Establishes an associate counselor license. Amends professional counselor licensure requirements. Amends various statutes establishing the scope of professional counselor exemptions, benefits, protections, duties, powers, and services to apply to

associate professional counselors as well. Amends marital and family therapy licensure requirements. Permits the Board of Marital and Family Therapy to extend the duration of a license for supervised practice of marital and family therapy. Repeals the statute allowing for a temporary license to practice marital and family therapy. Extends immunity from civil damages when providing free health care services to include services provided by licensed professional and associate counselors and telehealth services provided by healthcare providers. Expands the scope of medical information review statutes to include qualifying organizations and government agencies that provide emergency medical services and the staff of those organizations and government agencies. Exempts certain hospitals from disclosing and reporting certain service, price, and fee information. **(SCS HB 126(FIN) am S)**

Effective Date: Sections 16 – 19 take effect August 31, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2025

Chapter 45 CRITICAL MINERALS AND CRITICAL GOODS

Directs the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to provide reports to the legislature in 2026 detailing the production of critical and essential minerals and the state's role in innovation, manufacturing, and transportation of goods critical to the global economy. **(CSSB 118(FIN))**

Effective Date: November 28, 2024

Chapter 46 VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES; COMMERCIAL DRIVERS' LICENSES AND PERMITS

Allows the Department of Administration to adopt regulations for the issuance of specialty organization vehicle registration plates for organizations that are based in the state and are tax exempt. Creates specialty registration plates commemorating peace officers killed in the line of duty, women veterans, and United States Space Force personnel. Allows individuals who are not domiciled in the state to obtain non-domiciled commercial drivers licenses and non-domiciled commercial instruction permits. Amends requirements for transferring registration of a snowmobile. **(HCS CSSB 95(RLS))**

Effective Date: August 31, 2024

Chapter 47 OPIOID OVERDOSE DRUGS AND INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PLANS

Requires school districts to ensure that a person trained to administer an opioid overdose drug is on site when public school buildings are open for school or to the public, and to keep at least two doses of an opioid overdose drug on site at public schools. Requires the Department of Health to supply opioid overdose drugs and administration training materials to each school district. Repeals the requirement for an annual report by the Department of Health to the legislature relating to certain

federal grants and opioid overdose drug distribution effective January 1, 2027. Requires school districts that provide homeschool or correspondence study programs to annually develop individual learning plans for each enrolled student. Requires the State Board of Education to adopt regulations relating to homeschool or correspondence study program allotments and requires the Department of Education and Early Development to monitor the use of those allotments. Requires the Department of Education and Early Development or a district providing a homeschool or correspondence study program to annually report to the Department of Education and Early Development on the program for inclusion in an annual report to the legislature. **(SCS CSHB 202(FIN) am S(efd add S))**

Effective Date: Section 4 takes effect January 1, 2027; remainder of Act takes effect November 28, 2024

Chapter 48 COUNCIL FOR ALASKA NATIVE LANGUAGES

Renames the Alaska Native Language Preservation and Advisory Council the Council for Alaska Native Languages, moves the council from the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to the Department of Education and Early Development, and adds two additional voting members. Adds Cup'ig and Wetal (Ts'etsa'ut) to the list of official state languages, and divides the Tanana language into the Benhti Kokhwt'ana Keaga' (Lower Tanana) and Sahcheeg xut'een xneege' (Middle Tanana) languages. Removes a requirement that English be the language used in all government actions and functions. **(SCS CSHB 26(FIN))**

Effective Date: November 29, 2024

Chapter 49 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS; SCHOOLS AND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE COVERAGE; SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Authorizes the Department of Health to apply for a section 1115 waiver under 42 U.S.C. 1315(a) to establish demonstration projects relating to health and supportive services. Expands the Department of Health's authority to reimburse schools for medical services provided to all children. Requires the Department of Health to implement categorical eligibility for supplemental nutrition assistance program benefits and make eligible for those benefits individuals who have household incomes of not more than 200 percent of federal poverty guidelines regardless of household assets. **(HB 344 am S(efd add S))**

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 1, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect November 29, 2024

Chapter 50 GRANTS TO DISASTER VICTIMS AND MUNICIPAL HARBOR FACILITIES

Permits unit owners in a condominium or other common interest community to use a grant to disaster victims to meet common expense liabilities associated with the disaster. Requires as a condition of eligibility for a harbor facility grant that the harbor facility already have safety ladders installed on the harbor facility's floats or that safety ladders will be installed as part of the proposed project. **(HB 345 am S)**

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect September 1, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect November 29, 2024

Chapter 51 CRIMINAL MISCHIEF IN THE THIRD DEGREE

Amends the crime of criminal mischief in the third degree if the person defaces or damages real property that has a place of religious education or worship located on it or defaces or damages tangible personal property that has religious significance and is used by a religious organization or displayed for educational purposes. Provides for an affirmative defense to an employee, owner, or operator who is engaged in authorized activity on behalf of the religious organization or the owner or operator. **(SCS CSHB 238(JUD))**

Effective Date: September 4, 2024

Chapter 52 ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY LOAN GUARANTEE AND INTEREST SUBSIDY PROGRAM

Repeals the assistive technology loan guarantee and interest subsidy program on the condition that the balance of the assistive technology loan guarantee fund is reappropriated for improving access to assistive technology. Section 40(e), ch. 7, SLA 2024, appropriated the unexpended and unobligated fund balance to the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, vocational rehabilitation, special projects allocation, for improving access to assistive technology for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. **(HB 219)**

Effective Date: September 4, 2024

Chapter 53 MISSING AND MURDERED INDIGENOUS PERSONS REVIEW COMMISSION

Establishes the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons Review Commission. Requires peace officers to complete cultural training that is related to addressing the rates of missing and murdered indigenous persons. Requires the Department of Public Safety to submit a missing person report to the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System database within 60 days after the first report is filed with a local or state law enforcement agency. Requires the Department of Public Safety to employ at least two persons to investigate missing and murdered

indigenous persons cases. Requires the Department of Public Safety to conduct a needs assessment to determine how to increase protective and investigative resources for identifying and reporting cases of missing and murdered indigenous persons within the state criminal justice system and to submit a report to the legislature. **(CSSB 151(FIN))**

Effective Date: January 1, 2025

Chapter 54 PEER SUPPORT COUNSELING

Authorizes law enforcement agencies, emergency service providers, and the Department of Corrections to establish peer support counseling programs to provide emotional and moral support and peer support counseling to peace officers and emergency service personnel who have experienced emotionally traumatic incidents in the course of employment. Establishes when a written or oral communication made by a participant or counselor during a peer support counseling session or made between peer support counselors, supervisors, or staff members in relation to a peer support counseling session is considered confidential. **(HCS SB 103(STA))**

Effective Date: December 4, 2024

Chapter 55 STATE AND MUNICIPAL LAND USE AND REGULATION

Authorizes facilities, access roads, and easements on certain state land beside the James Dalton Highway necessary for motorized access to adjacent federal land, Native allotments, and land held by Alaska Native corporations under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act. Allows a municipal assembly, by ordinance, to approve a division of a tract or parcel of land that did not have previously platting approval and permits the division of that tract or parcel to be recorded. Excepts decisions for the location of certain fiber optic cable and other comparable easements from having to be integrated with state land use planning and classification. Establishes the applicable fees for state trapping cabin permits. Changes and clarifies law governing use and construction of trapping cabins on state land and issuance of the associated state permits. **(SCS CSHB 125(RES) am S)**

Effective Date: Sections 1, 2, 4 - 11, and 13 take effect September 6, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect December 5, 2024

Chapter 56 HUNTS FOR PERSONS WITH PHYSICAL DISABILITIES

Authorizes the Board of Game to establish big game hunting seasons for persons with physical disabilities. Requires a participant in a hunt established under the Act to be accompanied by another licensed hunter capable of retrieving game. **(SCS HB 272(RES))**

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect September 6, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2025

Chapter 57 **TRANSFER OF ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION LAND**
Authorizes the Alaska Railroad Corporation to convey approximately 188 acres of real property to the City of Nenana. **(HB 395 am S)**

Effective Date: September 6, 2024

Chapter 58 **UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA TEXTBOOK COST TRANSPARENCY**
Requires the University of Alaska for each course in its online course schedule to describe required course materials, identifying which materials are zero-cost, and, to the extent practicable, which materials are low-cost, as well as the amount of each automatic fee charged for required course materials for a course. Requires the University to provide a search function in the online course schedule that will identify courses in which all required materials are zero- or low-cost. **(SB 13)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2026

Chapter 59 **ALASKA VETERANS' POPPY DAY**
Establishes Alaska Veterans' Poppy Day on the Friday immediately preceding Memorial Day each year. **(SB 159)**

Effective Date: September 12, 2024

Chapter 60 **ALASKA TASK FORCE FOR THE REGULATION OF PSYCHEDELIC MEDICINES APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION**

Establishes within the legislature a task force to prepare for the potential medicalization of psychedelic medicines approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration, and to make policy recommendations to the legislature concerning insurance and licensure given the unique nature of the administration of psychedelic medicines. The task force will terminate on the last day of the first regular session of the Thirty-Fourth Alaska State Legislature.

(CSHB 228(STA) am)

Effective Date: September 20, 2024

Chapter 61 **PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGERS**
Amends registration requirements for pharmacy benefits managers. Establishes a duty of care for pharmacy benefits managers. Amends the requirements relating to maintenance of a pharmacy benefits manager's list of drugs. Ensures patient access to clinician-administered drugs in certain circumstances. Allows the director of insurance to impose a penalty where a person violates certain statutory provisions relating to pharmacy benefits managers. Establishes a grievance and appeal process.

Amends definitions in the pharmacy benefits manager chapter. Enacts new unfair trade practice restrictions against insurers and pharmacy benefits managers relating to pharmacies, drugs, and pharmacy services. **(SCS CSHB 226(L&C))**

Effective Date: Section 15 takes effect September 24, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2025

Chapter 7 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, amends appropriations, and makes supplemental appropriations and reappropriations. **(CCS HB 268(Corrected))**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 37, 40(e), and 50(d) are conditional; section 59 takes effect June 28, 2024; sections 11 - 13, 14(a), 15, 17(b) - (r), 20, 21(b), 22, 24 - 27, 48(d), 50(e) and (f), and 57 take effect June 30, 2024; sections 5 - 7 and 43(b) take effect January 1, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2024; sections 8 - 10, 14(b), 16, 17(a), 18, 19, 21(a), and 23 are retroactive to May 15, 2024; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2024 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2024, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2024, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 8 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations, capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and appropriations to capitalize funds. Amends appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 187(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: The appropriation made in section 13 is conditional; section 24 takes effect June 28, 2024; sections 14, 15, 16(a), and 17 - 22 take effect June 30, 2024; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2024; sections 4 - 9 are retroactive to May 15, 2024

Chapter 9 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for fiscal year 2025. **(CCS HB 270)**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in section 1 are conditional; Act takes effect July 1, 2024

2024**

INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR CONTRACEPTIVES

Requires health care insurance plans in the state to provide coverage for prescription contraceptives, including the medical services necessary to prescribe prescription contraceptives, and to reimburse for prescription contraceptives intended to last 12 months. Establishes cost sharing and other coverage requirements for prescription contraceptives. Requires the state and municipalities that offer health care insurance plans to meet the same coverage requirements for prescription contraceptive coverage that apply to private health care insurance plans. Requires the state to pay for prescription contraceptives intended to last 12 months, including the medical services necessary to prescribe prescription contraceptives, for those who are eligible for medical care at public expense. (SCS CSHB 17(L&C))

STATE VESSEL NUMBERING AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS EXCEPTION AND DERELICT VESSEL PREVENTION PROGRAM

Exempts certain commercial fishing vessels licensed by the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission from state vessel numbering and registration requirements under AS 05.25.055. Repeals the state derelict vessel prevention program and program fund. (SCS CSHB 19(FIN))

INSURANCE DISCRIMINATION AGAINST ELECTED OFFICIALS

Prohibits insurers from making certain insurance decisions based solely on a person's status as an elected official. (SCS CSHB 29(L&C))

WORK QUOTAS AT WAREHOUSE DISTRIBUTION CENTERS

Requires certain warehouse distribution center employers to provide a quota description to an employee subject to quotas upon hiring that employee. The quota description must include the period to fulfill the quota, the number of tasks the employee must perform or the number of materials the employee must produce or handle during the period, and any adverse employment actions that may result from failure to meet the quota. Prohibits an employer from establishing a quota that does not allow reasonable time for bathroom breaks or does not comply with federal or state occupational safety and health laws. Provides current and former employees a right to request a quota description and work speed data from the employee's most recent 90 days. Requires the employer to furnish this information within 21 calendar days of the request. (SCS CSHB 88(L&C))

ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION BONDING AUTHORITY

Amends previous authorization for the Alaska Railroad Corporation to issue revenue bonds to finance the replacement of a dock and terminal facility in Seward, Alaska, by increasing the maximum bond amount and requiring the replacement dock and terminal facility to accommodate Alaska marine highway system vessels with side-loading doors. (SCS CSHB 122(FIN))

SALE OF ALCOHOL; PRESENCE AND EMPLOYMENT OF PERSONS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE; THEATER LICENSE HOURS; WARNING SIGNS FOR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Allows the holder of a restaurant or eating place license or seasonal restaurant or eating place tourism license, and the holder of a license with a restaurant endorsement to employ a person 16 - 20 years of age, provided a person who is 16 or 17 years of age does not obtain alcoholic beverages. Allows a person 18, 19, or 20 years of age employed within the licensed premises of a brewery manufacturer, winery manufacturer, distillery manufacturer, hotel or motel, large resort, golf course, general wholesaler, limited brewed beverage and wine wholesaler, common carrier dispensary, outdoor recreation lodge, brewery retailer, winery retailer, distillery retailer, or restaurant to sell, serve, deliver, or dispense alcoholic beverages. Allows a person under 21 years of age to be present in a theater or in the areas of a licensed premises covered by a large resort endorsement. Expands the period during which the holder of a theater license may sell or serve alcoholic beverages to two hours before an event until one hour after an event. Amends alcohol warning sign requirements to include a new statement warning customers that alcohol use can cause cancer. (SCS CSHB 189(L&C))

WAGE PAYMENT BY PAYROLL CARD

Allows an employer to credit employee wages to a payroll card account if the employee voluntarily authorizes the credit or the employee has not authorized direct deposit of the employee's wages. Requires the employer paying an employee by wage card to provide certain notifications to the employee, including: wage payment options, the terms and conditions of the payroll card; fees assessed by the payroll card issuer; and cost free methods to access wages and check the account balance. Provides that a payroll card account must provide at least one cost-free withdrawal per pay period and an unlimited cost-free mechanism to check the account balance. Bars employers from offering a payroll card account that charges fees for initiation or participation; for the initial payroll card and one replacement; and for point of sale transactions. Payroll card accounts must be insured. (SCS HB 203(L&C))

VEHICLE RENTAL TAXES; TAX SUBPOENAS

Removes the authority of the Department of Revenue to report neglect or refusal to obey a tax-related subpoena to certain courts; removes the authority of those courts to compel obedience of the subpoena. Sets a new rate, eight percent of the cost of the rental of a passenger vehicle, for vehicles rented through a vehicle rental platform. Requires the vehicle rental platform to collect the vehicle rental tax, if a vehicle is rented through a vehicle rental platform. Limits liability for the tax for vehicle rental platforms in certain instances of insufficient or incorrect information. Limits the assessment and collection of the vehicle rental tax for certain transactions occurring before the effective date of the Act. (CSSB 127(FIN))

EDUCATION

Asserts the legislature's intent that, to the greatest extent possible, school districts should direct state funding increases towards educator salary and retention bonuses. Increases the maximum internet speed for a school district to be eligible for subsidized internet funding from the state to 100 megabits of download per second. Creates a new process to appeal the termination of a charter school's operating contract by a local school board. Creates the position of a charter school coordinator within the Department of Education and Early Development. Increases transportation funding for public school students. Increases funding for correspondence school students attending public correspondence schools in the state. Increases the base student allocation by \$680.
