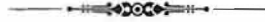

SYNOPSES OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

**SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER
2025**

Chapter 1 **ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION BONDING AUTHORITY**
Amends previous authorization for the Alaska Railroad Corporation to issue revenue bonds to finance the replacement of a dock and terminal facility in Seward, Alaska, by increasing the maximum bond amount and requiring the replacement dock and terminal facility to accommodate Alaska Marine Highway System vessels with side-loading doors. **(HB 65)**

Effective Date: March 7, 2025

Chapter 2 **STATE OFFICERS COMPENSATION COMMISSION RECOMMENDATIONS**
Disapproves the recommendations contained in the 2025 final report of the State Officers Compensation Commission. **(SB 87)**

Effective Date: March 7, 2025

Chapter 3 **WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH**
Establishes the month of March each year as Women's History Month, to honor and recognize the contributions women have made to the history of the state and country. **(SB 43)**

Effective Date: July 2, 2025

Chapter 4 **ALCOHOL AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**
Allows persons 18, 19, or 20 years of age to serve alcoholic beverages. Amends the wording of warning signs that are required to be displayed on licensed premises. Allows licensed patriotic organizations to enter reciprocity agreements to sell alcoholic beverages to members of other licensed patriotic organizations. Changes the hours for serving alcohol under a theater license. **(HCS SB 15(L&C))**

Effective Date: Section 14 takes effect August 1, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect May 1, 2025

Chapter 5 **EDUCATION**

Requires schools to establish a target average class size policy and sets maximum target average class sizes. Broadens district reporting requirements relating to teacher and staff to student classroom ratios. Requires the Department of Education and Early Development and the Department of Labor to collaborate to collect post-graduation employment data for each graduating high school class in a district. Requires a school district to accept a charter school application for the following school year at any time during the current school year. Creates a new process to appeal the termination of a charter school's operating contract by a local school board and allows for a streamlined renewal process for certain charter schools. Increases funding for student transportation. Increases funding for vocational and technical instruction. Increases the base student allocation by \$680. Requires school districts to adopt a policy relating to wireless telecommunications devices and bans wireless telecommunications devices during school hours in districts that do not adopt a policy. Directs the tax amounts collected from a highly digitized business to be separately accounted for and provides that the tax revenue may be appropriated to the Department of Education and Early Development to fund reading proficiency incentive grants. Establishes the Task Force on Education Funding as a temporary joint task force of the legislature. **(SCS CSHB 57(FIN) am S(reengrossed))**

Effective Date: Sections 10, 11, 13, and 15 are conditional; section 1 takes effect July 1, 2026; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2025

Chapter 6 **MANAGEMENT OF CHUGACH STATE PARK**

Authorizes the Department of Natural Resources to grant an easement or right-of-way within the Chugach State Park to a municipality, if certain conditions relating to the easement or right-of-way are met, for the purposes of repairing, maintaining, and constructing roads and related facilities. **(CSSB 47(RES))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2025

Chapter 7 **PERMANENT FUND DIVIDENDS: ELIGIBILITY, CRIMINAL RECORDS CHECKS FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES; NOTICE OF EXECUTION ON PERMANENT FUND DIVIDENDS**

Allows the department of revenue to obtain a criminal history record check to evaluate a current or prospective employee's qualifications to administer the permanent fund dividend program. Allows an individual to maintain eligibility for the permanent fund dividend if the individual is (1) on a break or holiday from secondary or postsecondary education or vocational, professional, or other specific training; or (2) attending a vocational merchant marine program. Replaces the term "armed forces" in the statute defining allowable absences with the term "uniformed services" and defines the term "uniformed services." Permits the department of revenue to notify an individual by electronic mail of the seizure of the individual's dividend under a writ of execution. **(SCS CSHB 75(STA))**

Effective Date: January 1, 2026

Chapter 8 **RENAMING THE RUBY AIRPORT**
Renames the state-owned public use airport at Ruby the Harold Esmailka Airport.
(SB 152)

Effective Date: June 12, 2025

Chapter 9 **EXTENDING BOARD AND COMMISSION TERMINATION DATES**
Extends the termination dates of the Big Game Commercial Services Board, the Board of Massage Therapists, the Alaska Commission on Aging, and the Marijuana Control Board. **(CSSB 80(FIN))**

Effective date: July 4, 2025; retroactive to July 1, 2024

Chapter 10 **APPROPRIATIONS**
Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, amends appropriations, and makes supplemental appropriations.
(CCS HB 53(brf sup maj fld H))

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 16(c), and 30(e) and (f) are conditional; sections 8 - 11, 12(c), 13(a), 15, 16, 18 - 20, 51, and 54 take effect June 13, 2025; sections 12(a) and (b), 13(b), 14, 17, 44(d) and (e), 49(b), 52, and 55(e) take effect June 30, 2025; sections 5 - 7 and 38(d) take effect January 1, 2026; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2025; sections 8 - 11, 12(c), 13(a), 15, 16, 18 - 20, and 51 are retroactive to March 31, 2025; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2025 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2025, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2025, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Veto Override: The veto override on August 2, 2025, pertained to line item vetoes contained in section 43(h), page 104, lines 4 – 6 and lines 10 – 11. Other line item vetoes were not affected

Chapter 11 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**
Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program. **(CCS HB 55)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2025

Chapter 12 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and appropriations to capitalize funds, amends appropriations, and repeals appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 57(FIN) am H(efd fld H))**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 11(a), 12(a), and 18 are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect September 10, 2025; sections 4 - 7, 16, and 22 are retroactive to March 31, 2025; sections 13, 15(1), 17, and 19 - 21 are retroactive to June 30, 2025; and sections 1 - 3, 8 - 12, 14, 15(2), and 18 are retroactive to July 1, 2025

Chapter 13 **EXTENDING BOARD TERMINATION DATES**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives, Board of Nursing, Board of Veterinary Examiners, and Board of Parole. **(CSSB 137(FIN))**

Effective Date: July 4, 2025; retroactive to June 30, 2025

Chapter 14 **CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE ELIGIBILITY**

Conditional on federal approval of the state's child care assistance program, increases the income limits for families seeking child care assistance. Requires the Department of Health to establish a program to partner with the private sector to create incentives for employers to develop employee child care. Caps the contribution for families eligible for day care assistance to seven percent of the family income. Changes the grant eligibility criteria for child care facilities by requiring the facility to prioritize children from low-income families when filling child care openings and by requiring the facility to be designated as a quality child care facility by the department. **(SB 95)**

Effective Date: Section 6 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect June 25, 2025; retroactive to July 23, 2024

Chapter 15 **CHILD CARE TAX CREDITS**

Provides tax credits for eligible employers for expenditures or donations of equipment to child care facilities, or for cash payments to employees to offset employee child care costs. Requires the Department of Revenue to adjust the combined credit cap for the child care and education tax credit for inflation every five years, beginning January 1, 2030. **(SB 96)**

Effective Date: June 25, 2025; retroactive to July 23, 2024

Chapter 16 **BIG GAME GUIDE CONCESSION AREA AND PERMITTING PROGRAM**
Provides authority and direction for the Board of Game to consider proposals to establish big game guide concession areas to be administered by the Department of Natural Resources. Establishes a big game guide concession area permit program to limit the number of individuals authorized to conduct big game guiding on land in the state where the Board of Game has approved the establishment of a big game guide concession area. Requires the commissioner of natural resources to administer the big game guide concession area permit program. **(SB 97)**

Effective Date: June 25, 2025; retroactive to July 23, 2024

Chapter 17 **OMNIBUS INSURANCE**
Makes numerous changes to statutory provisions relating to insurance, including those relating to reinsurance, licensing requirements, coverage for colorectal cancer screening, motor vehicle service contracts, property insurance, and owner-controlled or contractor-controlled insurance programs. Amends provisions relating to insurance trade practices, including consumer notice provisions. Revises provisions relating to health maintenance organizations. Requires pharmacy benefits managers and third-party administrators to be licensed. Revises multiple insurance tax provisions. **(HCS CSSB 132(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: Sections 69 - 71 take effect June 25, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2026

Chapter 18 **VEHICLE RENTAL TAXES; TAX SUBPOENAS**
Removes the authority of the Department of Revenue to report neglect or refusal to obey a tax-related subpoena to certain courts; removes the authority of those courts to compel obedience of the subpoena. Amends the existing tax rate for the rental of passenger vehicles from ten percent to nine percent of the costs charged for the lease or rental of a passenger vehicle. Sets a temporary tax rate of seven percent for the lease or rental of a passenger vehicle through a vehicle rental platform. The rate is increased to nine percent in 2028. Requires a vehicle rental platform to collect the vehicle rental tax for vehicle rentals made using the vehicle rental platform. Limits liability for the tax for vehicle rental platforms in certain instances of insufficient or incorrect information. Limits the assessment and collection of vehicle rental tax for certain transactions occurring before the effective date of the Act. **(SCS CSHB 123(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 3 takes effect July 1, 2028; remainder of Act takes effect July 11, 2025

Chapter 19 **COMPREHENSIVE PLANS OF FIRST AND SECOND CLASS BOROUGH**
Adds "a housing development plan" to the list of items that a first or second class borough may include in its comprehensive plan. (CSSB 50(L&C))

Effective Date: October 14, 2025

Chapter 20 **MYALGIC ENCEPHALOMYELITIS/CHRONIC FATIGUE SYNDROME DAY**
Establishes May 12 of each year as Myalgic Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome Day of Recognition. (SB 60)

Effective Date: October 14, 2025

Chapter 21 **INSURANCE PRIOR AUTHORIZATIONS**
Requires health care insurers to establish a prior authorization process that is reasonable, efficient, and minimizes the administrative burdens on health care providers and facilities. Establishes deadlines for health care insurers to make a determination on a prior authorization request and timelines to request additional information. Sets various insurance prior authorization standards and requirements, including compliance, enforcement, and reporting requirements. Requires health care insurers to establish a process for clinical peer review of a prior authorization request and to maintain a prior authorization application programming interface. Prohibits health care insurers from requiring a step therapy protocol for the treatment of Stage 4 advanced metastatic cancer and establishes exceptions for other step therapy protocols. (CSSB 133(L&C))

Effective Date: Section 4 takes effect July 17, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2027

Chapter 22 **ACCOUNTANT LICENSING REQUIREMENTS; ACCOUNTING PRACTICE PRIVILEGE; PRIVATE PROFESSIONAL CONSERVATOR LICENSING REQUIREMENTS**

Lowens the hours of education required for a license to practice accounting. Removes the requirement that a firm without an office in the state that provides or offers to provide attest functions in the state obtain a permit. Allows a qualifying firm without an office in the state to engage in the practice of public accounting in the state under a practice privilege. Allows an individual to qualify for a private professional conservator license by being licensed as an accountant in the state instead of certified as a guardian by a nationally recognized organization in the field of guardianships. Requires a private professional conservator who met the qualifications for the license with an accountant license to obtain mandatory education before or within 30 days after the licensee's first appointment as a conservator. (SCS HB 121(STA))

Effective Date: Sections 14 – 21 take effect July 24, 2025; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2026

Chapter 23 **STATE VESSEL NUMBERING AND REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS
EXCEPTION AND DERELICT VESSEL PREVENTION PROGRAM**
Exempts certain commercial vessels licensed by the Alaska Commercial Fisheries
Entry Commission from state numbering and registration requirements under
AS 05.25.055. Repeals the state derelict vessel prevention program and fund.
(HB 31)

commercial fishing business that is owned or leased by a member of the pool.

Chapter 25 **PRISONER I.D. CARDS; USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES AND SERVICES
BY PRISONERS**
Prohibits the commissioner of corrections from allowing a prisoner in a state
correctional facility operated by the state to possess a telephone in the prisoner's cell.
Allows prisoners to use and possess computers or electronic tablets as approved by
the commissioner of corrections for purposes including rehabilitation, legal research,
visitation, and health care. Allows a state correctional facility operated by the state
to charge a fee for electronic mail or electronic visitation. Prohibits the
commissioner of corrections from replacing in-person visitation with the use of a
computer or electronic tablet and limits the extent to which an existing rehabilitation
program or service can be replaced with a computer or electronic tablet. Changes the
requirements for prisoner identification cards issued by the department of
corrections, requiring that the cards be substantially similar to drivers' licenses rather
than identical, and allowing them to be a different color rather than requiring them to
be a different color. **(SCS CSHB 35(JUD))**

Chapter 1 **LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND AUDIT COMMITTEE AND LEGISLATIVE
AUDIT DIVISION INFORMATION PRODUCTION REQUIREMENTS**

Requires state officials and agencies to assemble, generate, and furnish information in the form or format requested by the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee or the Division of Legislative Audit. Amends criminal and civil penalty statutes to reflect the new information production requirements. **(SB 183)**

Chapter 10 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of the state government and for certain programs, capitalizes funds, repeals appropriations, amends appropriations, and makes supplemental appropriations. **(CCS HB 53(brf sup maj fld H))**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 16(c), and 30(e) and (f) are conditional; sections 8 - 11, 12(c), 13(a), 15, 16, 18 - 20, 51, and 54 take effect June 13, 2025; sections 12(a) and (b), 13(b), 14, 17, 44(d) and (e), 49(b), 52, and 55(e) take effect June 30, 2025; sections 5 - 7 and 38(d) take effect January 1, 2026; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2025; sections 8 - 11, 12(c), 13(a), 15, 16, 18 - 20, and 51 are retroactive to March 31, 2025; the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2025 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2025, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2025, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Veto Override: The veto override on August 2, 2025, pertained to line item vetoes contained in section 43(h), page 104, lines 4 – 6 and lines 10 – 11. Other line item vetoes were not affected

Chapter 11 **MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program. **(CCS HB 55)**

Effective Date: July 1, 2025

Chapter 12 **APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and appropriations to capitalize funds, amends appropriations, and repeals appropriations. **(HCS CSSB 57(FIN) am H(efd fld H))**

Effective Date: The appropriations made in sections 1, 11(a), 12(a), and 18 are conditional; remainder of Act takes effect September 10, 2025; sections 4 - 7, 16, and 22 are retroactive to March 31, 2025; sections 13, 15(1), 17, and 19 - 21 are retroactive to June 30, 2025; and sections 1 - 3, 8 - 12, 14, 15(2), and 18 are retroactive to July 1, 2025

BASE STUDENT ALLOCATION

Increases the base student allocation set out in AS 14.17.470 from \$5,960 to \$6,960.
(SCS CSHB 69(FIN))

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES FOR OPERATIONAL CANINES; CIVIL LIABILITY OF VETERINARIANS

Establishes an exception to the rule requiring a license to practice veterinary medicine for the performance of emergency medical services on operational canines by certified emergency medical technicians and licensed mobile intensive care paramedics authorized to perform the services. Requires the Department of Health to prescribe by regulation the requirements for authorization of an emergency medical technician or mobile intensive care paramedic to provide emergency medical services to an operational canine. Prevents a veterinarian from being held civilly liable for the acts or omissions of an emergency medical technician or mobile intensive care paramedic who transfers an operational canine to the veterinarian after providing emergency medical services to the operational canine. (SCS CSHB 70(HSS))

REGIONAL EDUCATIONAL ATTENDANCE AREA AND SMALL MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT FUND; MT. EDGE CUMBE HIGH SCHOOL; TEACHER HOUSING

Authorizes the Department of Education and Early Development to use the regional educational attendance area and small municipal school district fund for construction and major maintenance projects at Mt. Edgecumbe High School and for certain major maintenance projects for teacher housing. Removes the statutory cap on the cash balance that may be retained in the fund. (HB 174)

PAYDAY LOANS; SMALL LOANS; NATIONWIDE MULTISTATE LICENSING SYSTEM AND REGISTRY; PAWNBROKER LICENSES; COMPUTING INTEREST; MUTUAL SAVINGS BANKS

Repeals licensing statutes authorizing a person to engage in the business of making deferred deposit advances. Modifies who is required to obtain a license to engage in the business of making loans. Modifies the annual fee and application requirements for the license. Expands the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development's authority to examine licensees. Limits a licensee to making small loans at an interest rate of three percent a month. Modifies the scope of the prohibition against enforcing loans with an illegal interest rate. Prohibits a licensee from threatening a borrower with criminal prosecution as a result of the borrower's default on a loan. Authorizes the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to participate in the Nationwide Multistate Licensing System and Registry for non-depository financial services. Modifies how interest rates are computed for small loans, and how interest is computed generally. Clarifies that financial institutions include mutual savings banks. Clarifies that mutual savings banks are exempt from pawnbroker licensing requirements. (CSSB 39(FIN))

INTERIOR DESIGN; STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, AND LAND SURVEYORS

Expands the meaning of terms relating to construction and project costs in the municipal community facilities grant program, the Alaska Aeronautics Act, and the Village Safe Water Act to include land surveying, landscape architectural, or registered interior design services. Extends the termination date of the State Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers, and Land Surveyors. Expands the membership of the board. Specifies a salary range for the executive administrator of the board. Establishes an optional registration process to practice registered interior design, allowing a registrant to use the title "registered interior designer." Exempts a person who is authorized to construct, install, or modify certain conventional onsite wastewater systems from occupational licensing requirements under AS 08.48 when performing that work. Removes officers and employees of certain utilities from an exemption to the occupational licensing requirements under AS 08.48, and establishes an exemption from those occupational licensing requirements for those officers and employees in an emergency. Extends the civil immunity provided to third-party design professionals to landscape architects and registered interior designers. Allows a person to obtain a lien on property to secure payment for landscape architectural or registered interior design plans or drawings for the construction, alteration, or repair of a building or improvement. Establishes State Procurement Code procedures and requirements for the procurement of landscape architectural and registered interior design services. (CSSSB 54(FIN))

MULTISTATE TAX COMPACT UPDATES; APPORTIONMENT OF INCOME TO THE STATE; HIGHLY DIGITIZED BUSINESS INCOME APPORTIONMENT

Consistent with updates made by the Multistate Tax Commission, makes the following updates to the Multistate Tax Compact: (1) replaces the terms "business income" and "non-business income" with "apportionable income" and "non-apportionable income"; (2) broadens the definition of "business income" to include all income subject to apportionment under the United States Constitution; (3) amends the definition of "sales" to specify that gross receipts included must be received from transactions and activity in the regular course of the taxpayer's trade or business, and to exclude hedging transactions and sales from the maturity, redemption, exchange, loan, or other disposition of cash or securities; and (4) adds the specification that receipts from sales of services are to be sourced to the location where the service was delivered, receipts from sale or lease of intangibles are generally to be sourced to where the intangible is used, and receipts from lease of tangible personal property and the sale or lease of real property are to be sourced to where the property is located. Specifies that the income of a taxpayer engaged in a highly digitized business shall be solely apportioned by the sales factor. (SB 113)

ALASKA COMMERCIAL FISHING AND AGRICULTURE BANK; LOW INTEREST LOANS FROM THE BANK TO PERSONS ENGAGED IN COMMERCIAL FISHING

Directs the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to purchase shares of the Alaska Commercial Fishing and Agriculture Bank. Requires the Alaska Commercial Fishing and Agriculture Bank to use funds from the sale to originate or refinance loans to persons engaged in commercial fishing. The loans must be secured with limited entry commercial fishing permits as collateral. Specifies that the loans must be provided at a comparably low fixed interest rate and fixed fifteen-year term. Requires the Alaska Commercial Fishing and Agriculture Bank to repurchase the shares from the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development. Terminates on January 1, 2027. (HCS CSSB 156(FSH))
